ASSISTANT & DEPUTY DIRECTOR UPDATES

(Katy Eckert & Jamie Samboceti)

- We are in a hiring atmosphere!! It is very exciting to see qualified folks on the list. These individuals are eager and excited about their positions and the experience they will gain working for Behavioral Health. We are excited to have them.
- **New HHSA Director starts on February 2, 2019**
We are excited to announce that Don Semon, will be the new leader of HHSA. He has spent the month of January cross-training with Patricia and getting briefed on the many issues facing our Agency. Welcome Don! And, best wishes to Patricia as she starts a new journey!
- **Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System updates.** Over the past few weeks, we have had active progress working together with the state. Highlights are as follows:
 - **Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA).** The state has clarified that we do not need to do a provisional contract as we will have the full array of services necessary and that our time/distance concerns can be addressed under Network Adequacy. DHCS just sent us the first draft so that we can start our review process with County Counsel. Once we get to a second draft, we will be able to make this available to the BH Commission for review (let me know if you have interest).
 - **Network Adequacy.** We need to complete the Network Adequacy Tool including the alternative access standards that we will be requesting for time/distance concerns. Once submitted, federal Center for Medicaid Services (CMS) needs 90 days for their review/approval before we would be allowed to contract.
 - **MOUs.** We need the Executed MOUs with all of our Managed Care Plans - Need to have by February to keep timelines on track. We are making forward progress on these.
 - **Single Case Agreement.** We need the Single Case Agreement sample contract - Need to have by February to keep timelines on track.
 - **Readiness Review.** Several items still in draft form but getting close to completion. These must be approved by February to keep timelines on track.
 - **Rough Timelines:**
 - **Jan 2019** DHCS to provide draft IGA to EDC by mid-January to start local review process. Done.
 - **February 2019** Readiness Review items, MOUs & Single Case Agreement to be completed and approved by DHCS.
 - **February 2019** Network Adequacy Tool and relevant alternative access requests submitted to state, who reviews then submits to Center for Medicaid Services (CMS). Network Adequacy can run concurrently with other timelines, however CMS approval must be given 90 days in advance of any go live date. (if everything is perfect, then June 2019 go live)

- **Feb/March 2019** CMS review implementation plan (15 business days) & draft IGA (20 business days)
 - **March/April 2019** EDC take IGA & DMC-ODS provider contracts to Board of Supervisors and get approval, return to DHCS to complete.
 - **May/June 2019** DHCS needs 10 business days to complete execution of the IGA.
 - **June 2019** EDC goes live with DMC-ODS
- **New Psychiatrist to start at the EDC-PHF:** Telecare has hired a new Psychiatrist who is set to start work on February 1, 2019. John M. Motl, M.D., will be the attending full-time Psychiatrist at Telecare El Dorado Psychiatric Health Facility. Dr. Motl graduated from Creighton University School of Medicine in 1973 and has been in practice for over 45 years. Dr. Motl is a veteran, he completed a residency at Letterman Army Medical Center. He later became the chief of mental health at Cheyenne, Wyoming United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) medical center, in addition he worked as staff psychiatrist at Sacramento VA Medical Center. His specialties include Psychiatry and Neurology, in addition he has specialized training in biofeedback and holds a Suboxone certification. He has worked as medical director for Fort Collins Colorado inpatient, provided teaching for family practice residents and worked in collaboration with a medical center in Flagstaff where he helped adults and adolescents. Dr. Motl is a strong advocate for practicing integrative medicine which encompasses the mind, body and medicine.

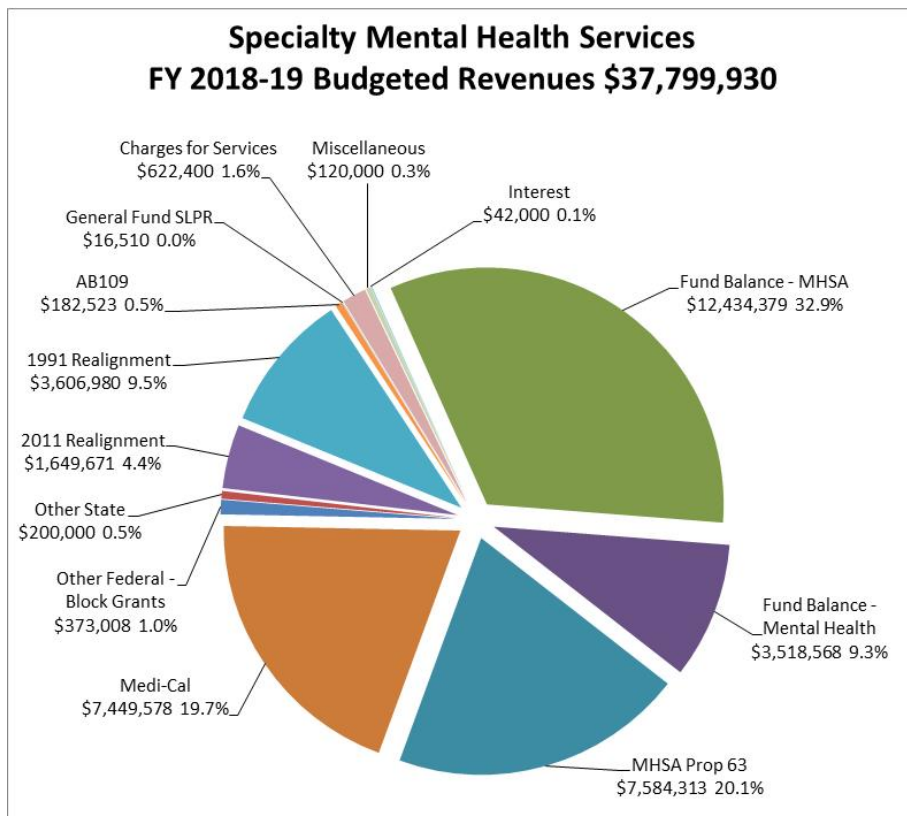

General Information:

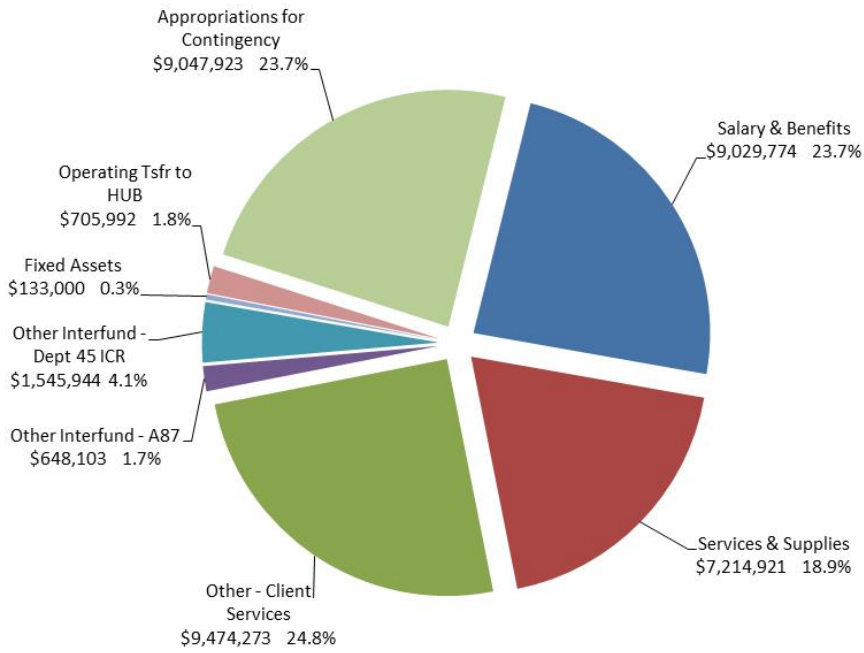
- Most funding coming into Behavioral Health is tied to delivery of services for specified programs.
- Base funding levels for individual counties are now set for 2011 Realignment.
- The County budgets full use of fund balance on the revenue side and an appropriation for contingencies on the expense side to allow flexibility throughout the year.
- When the economy slows down and sales tax receipts drop statewide, we will experience a reduction in 1991 & 2011 Realignment.

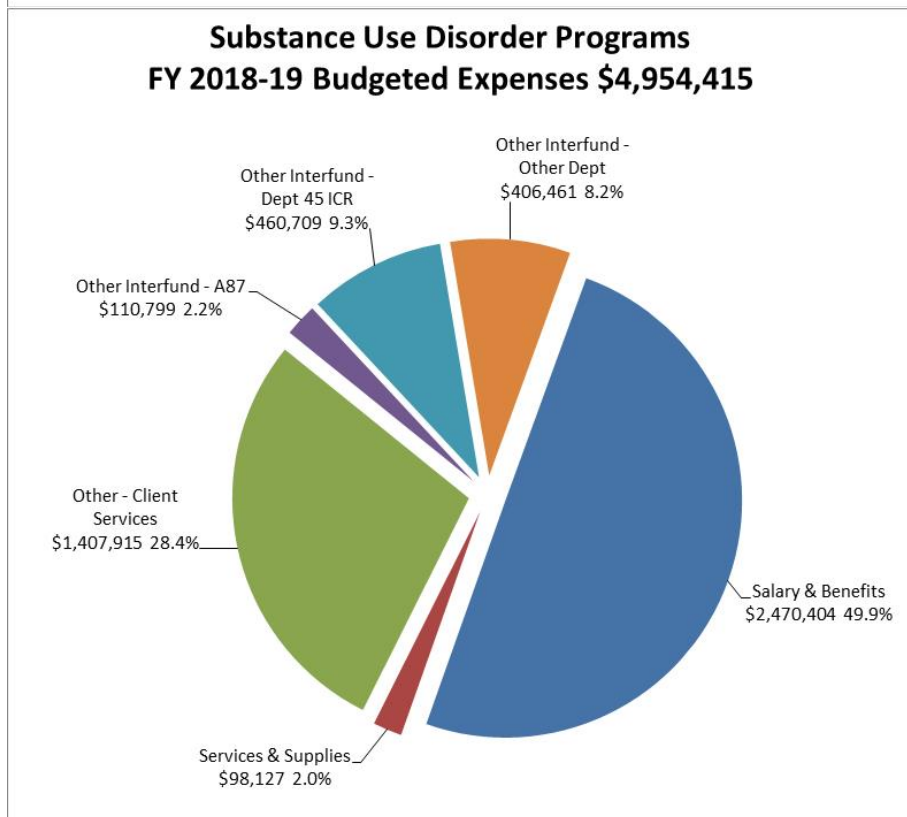
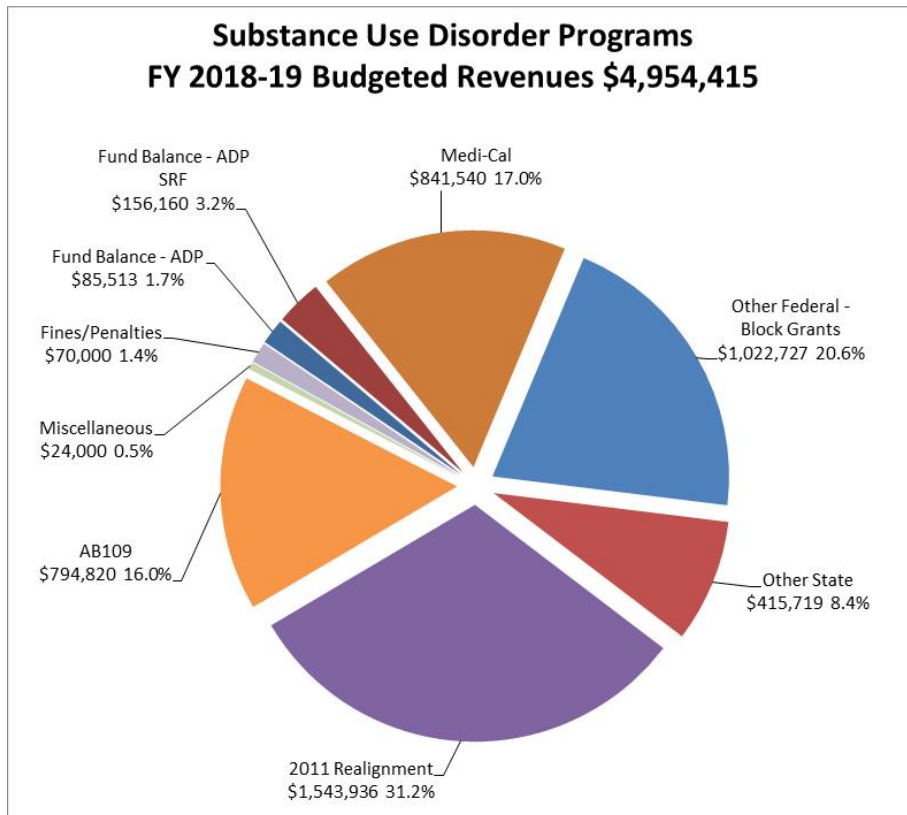

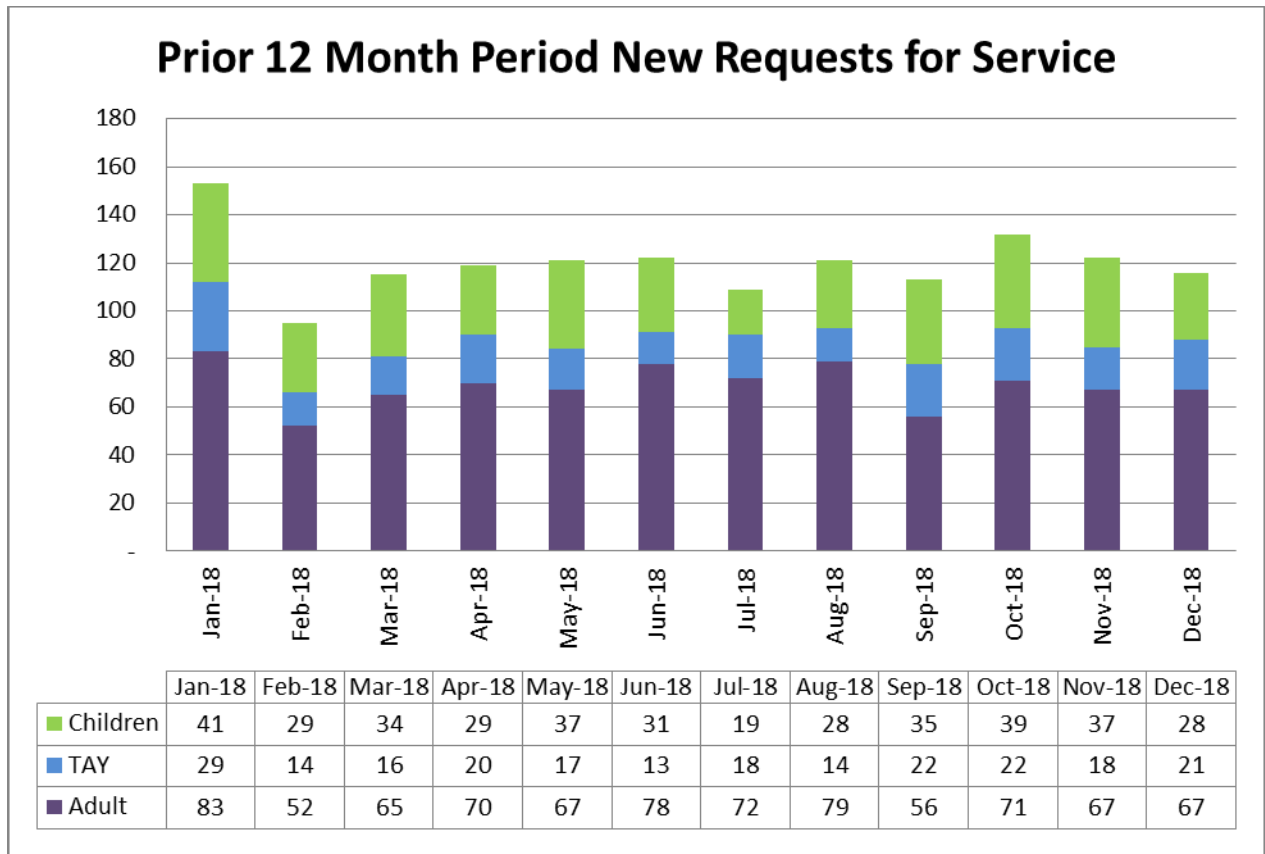

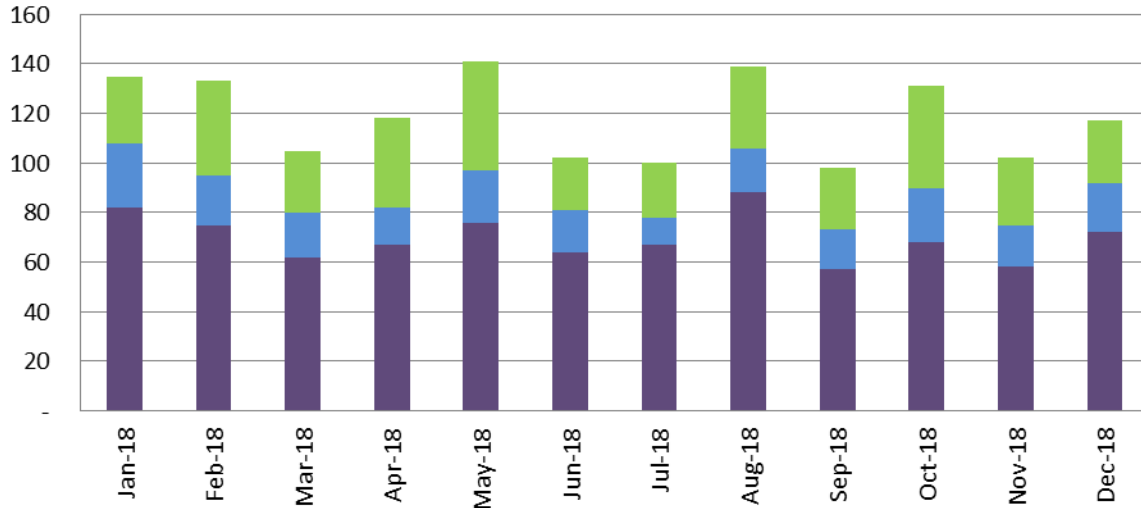

New Service Request Trends



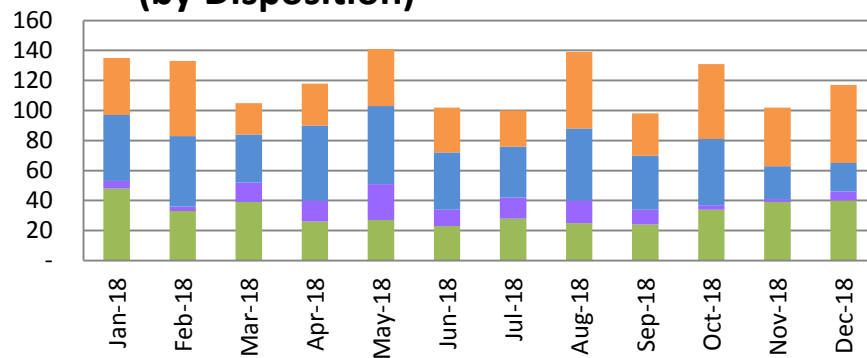
Discharged Service Request Trends

Prior 12 Month Period Discharged Requests for Service (by Age)



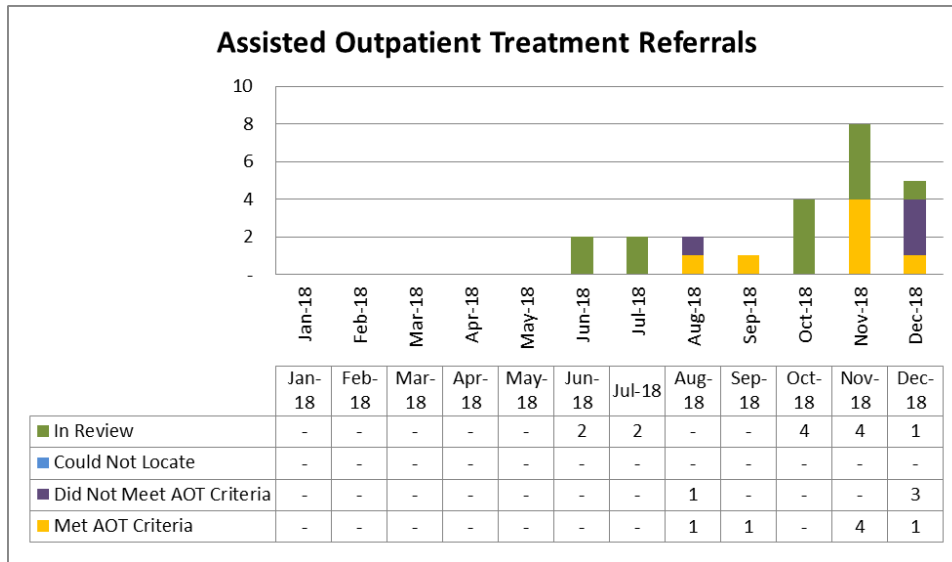

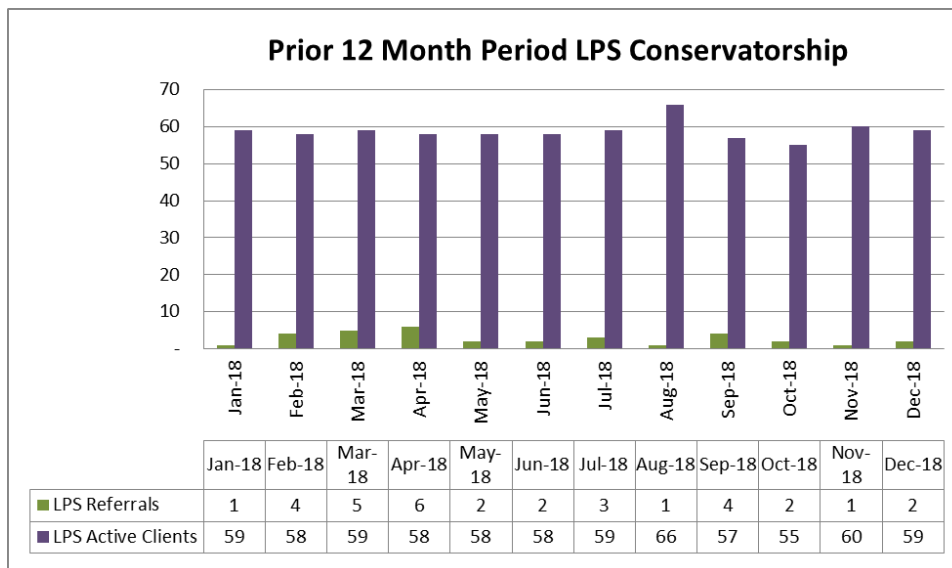

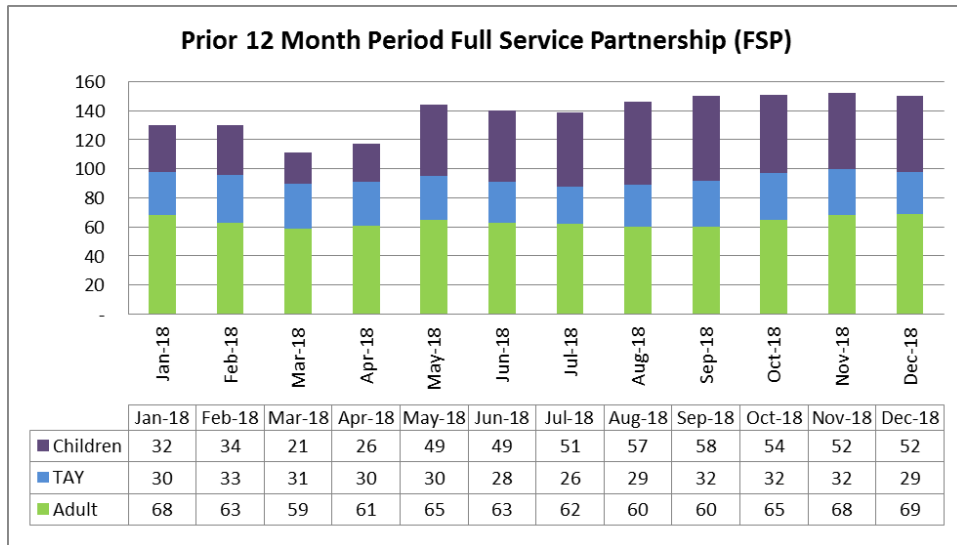

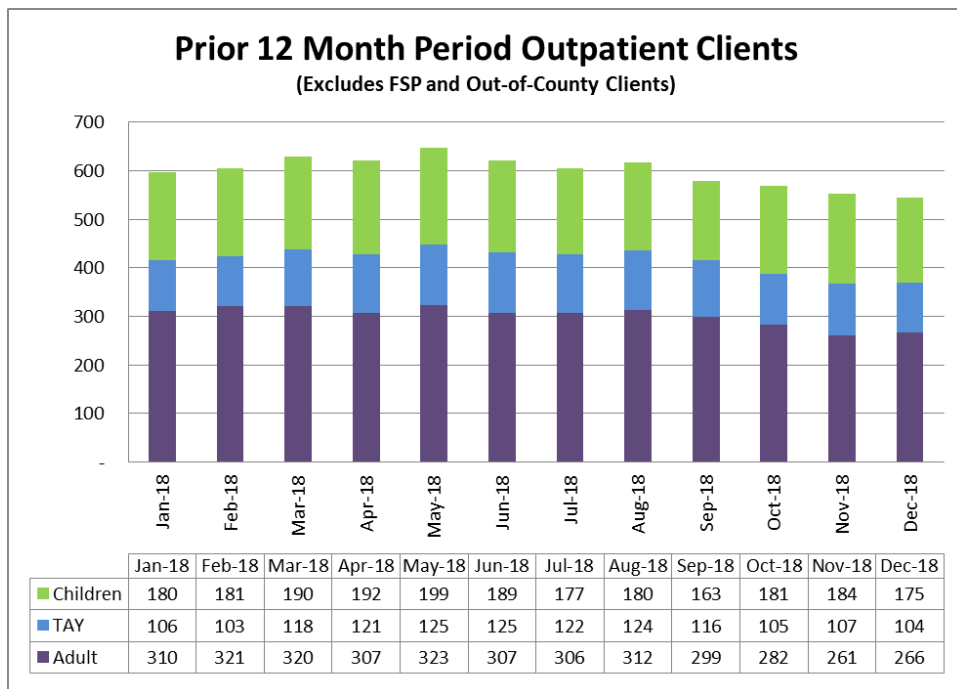

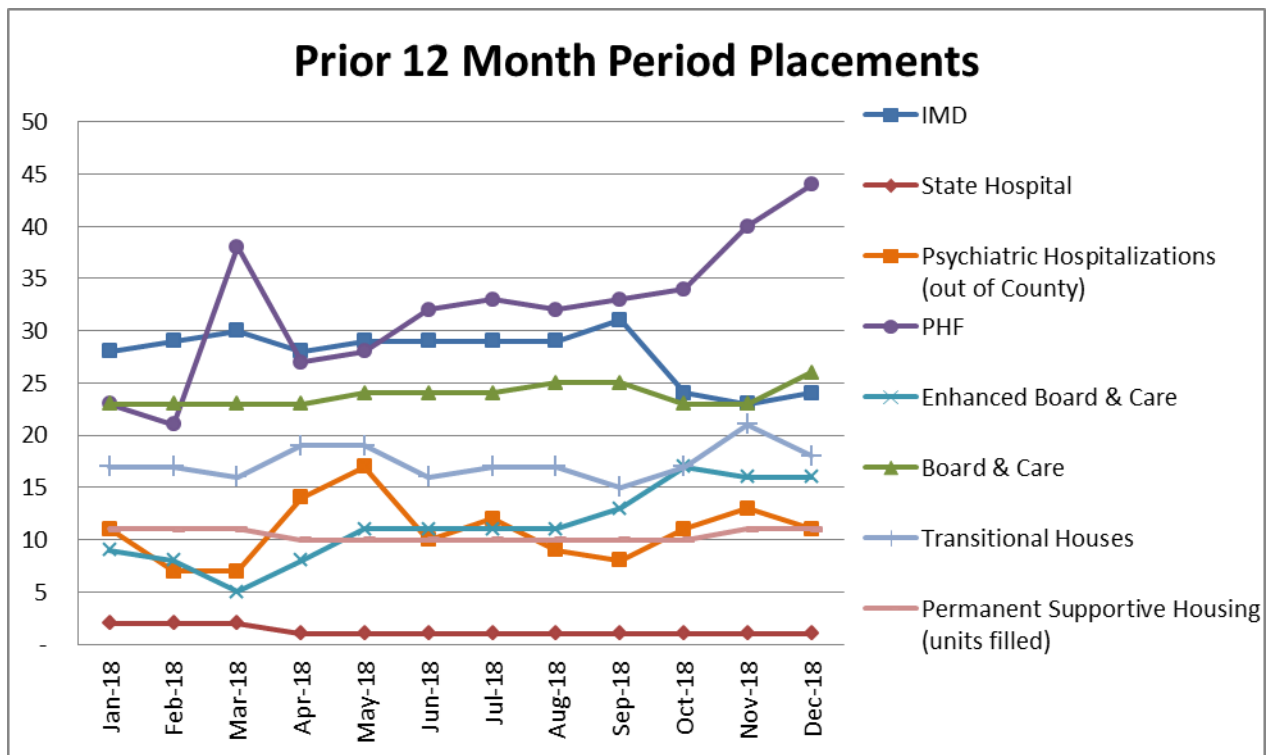

Psychiatric Health Facility (Nicole Cable)

- There were **44** Admissions; **28** Admissions were El Dorado County residents and **16** were Out of County residents.
- There were **25** El Dorado County residents discharged; **16** to Home with Support, **5** to Home without support, **2** MHRC/IMD, **1** Board and Care, **0** to ICM T-House, **0** to Shelter, **1** to Other, and **0** to Emergency Department.
- Upon discharge, **20** El Dorado County residents were insured and **5** El Dorado County residents were pending insurance.
- There were **2** Seclusion Episodes, **1** Physical Restraint Episodes (**5** minutes), **0** Assaults (**0** clients), **0** Elopements, **2** Medication Errors (**0** medication errors with no patient involvement), Client Surveys **34**
- There were **1** denials of El Dorado County referrals: **Documented dementia.**
- Average daily census was **10.39** (range 7 - 13), with **6** average length of stay of days.

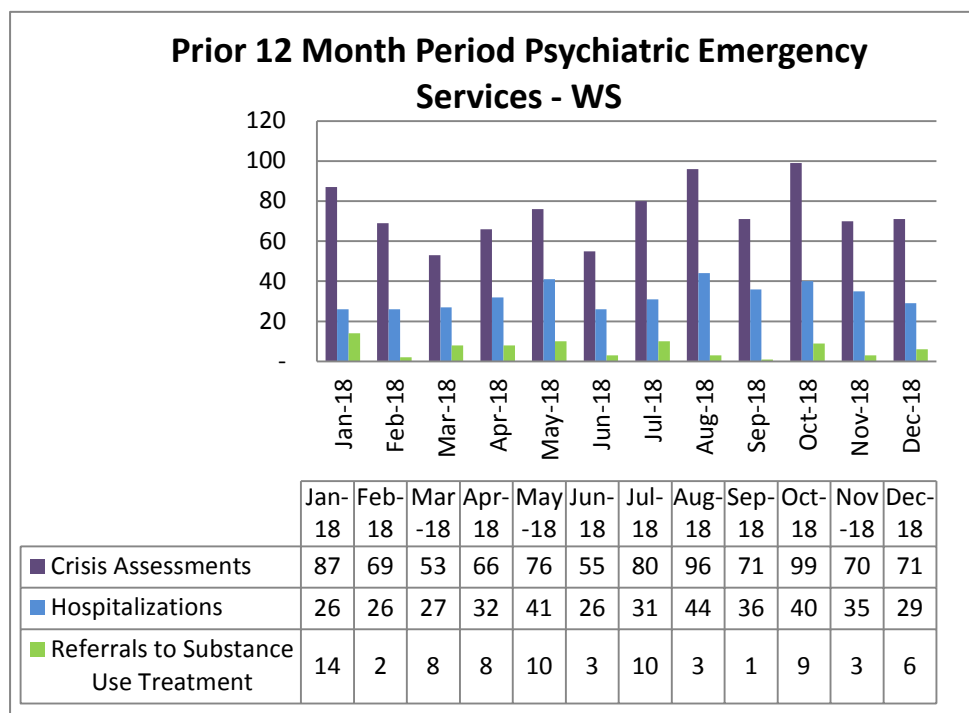

- WS PES is preparing to expand support in late January with the implementation of providing an on-call PES Clinician to cover as a backup during non-business hours. This position will be covered by existing MH Clinicians. Each MH Clinician

will provide approximately nine days of on-call coverage per 6 months. This expansion will ensure crisis services are provided adequately and allow MH Clinicians to anticipate and plan for providing crisis services on their assigned nine days.

- **SLT:** MDT meeting for December was cancelled. PES was very busy during the holidays.
- **WS:** The MDT meeting continues to be well attended by representatives from El Dorado County Jail, Sheriff’s Office (EDSO), Placerville Police Department, Adult Protective Services, Code Enforcement, Public Guardian, Public Defender’s office, District Attorney’s Office, CDCR (Parole), and El Dorado County Behavioral Health. Each stakeholder in attendance presented motivated to strategize and problem solve community concerns to support positive change in our community.

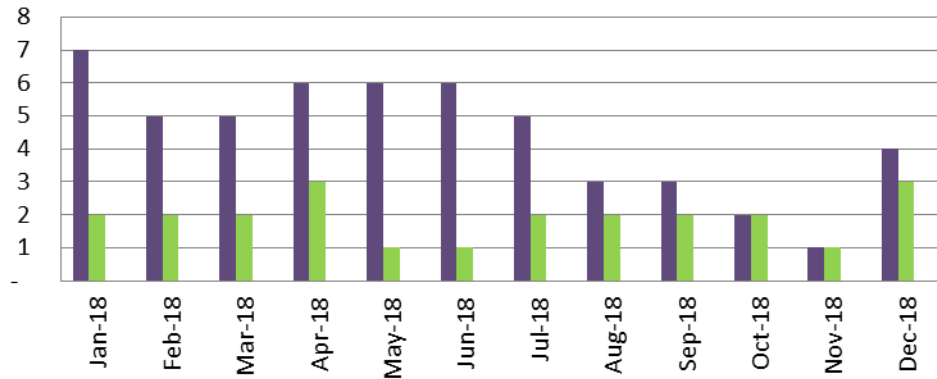

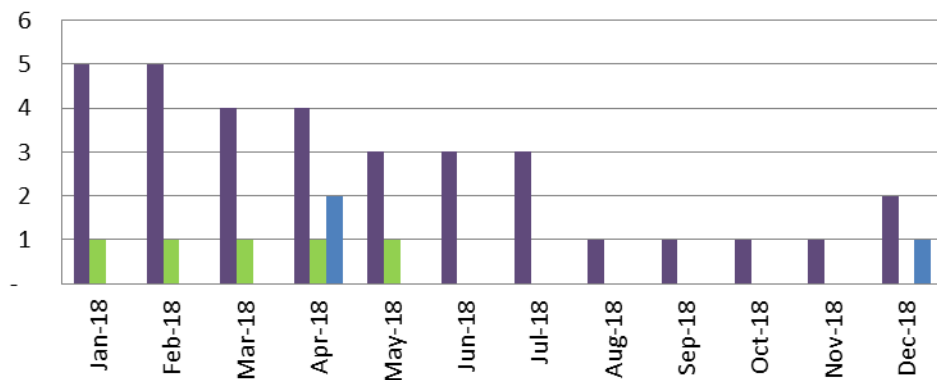

Prior 12 Month Period Behavioral Health Court - SLT



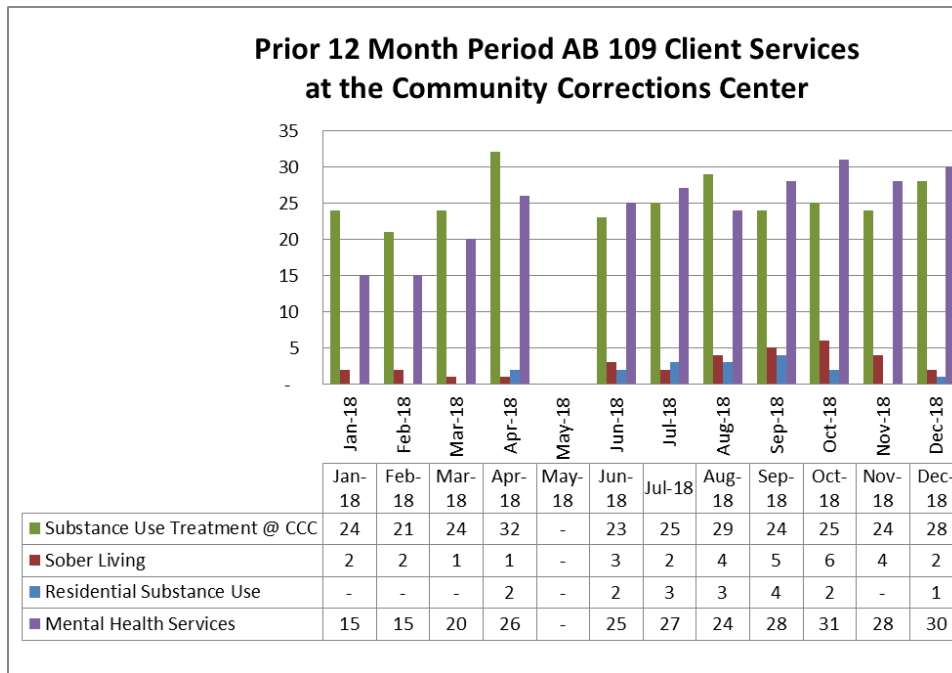

Prior 12 Month Period Behavioral Health Court - WS



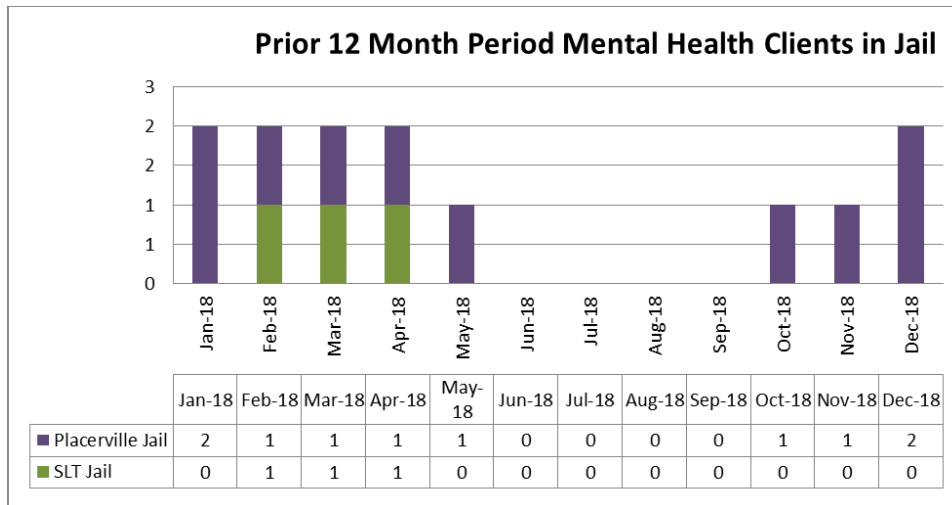

Mental Health Clients in Jail (Moriah Weldy)



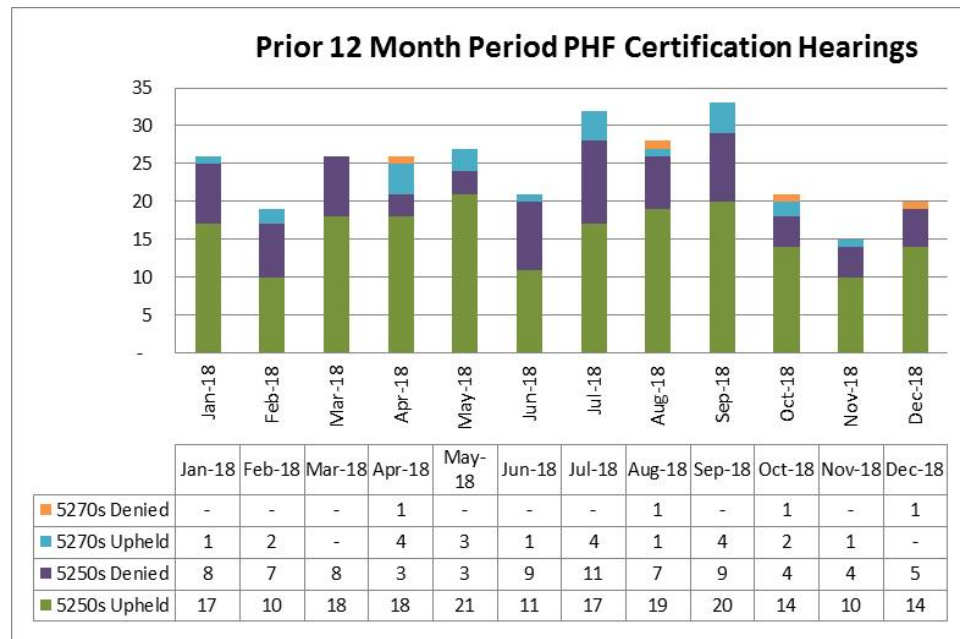

- The QI/UR Team worked on the Network Adequacy Certification Tool (NACT) submittal, including compiling information submitted by Contract Providers and developing the new Provider Directory. The new Provider Directory is available online at <https://www.edcgov.us/MentalHealth> under "Additional Resources". The directory is currently being translated into Spanish.
- The QI/UR Team refined the Request for Services process to help ensure timely access to services and compliance with federal and State issuance of Notices of Adverse Benefit Determination for Medi-Cal beneficiaries who do not meet medical necessity or who cannot be contacted by the Access Team.

ALCOHOL AND DRUG SERVICES / SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS (Salina Drennan)

Tahoe:

- The State DHCS conducted a site visit in relation to SUDS Drug Medi-Cal application at all four County SUDS sites in SLT and WS. Additional documents requested are due to DHCS by 1/11/19.

Children's Services (Angie Larrigan)

- New Children's Contracted Network Providers contracts have been executed and are effective January 1, 2019.
- The addition of UR/Access Program Coordinator, Justine Collinsworth, has enabled enhanced oversight (QA/UR) of Children's SMHS. This oversight has led to improved efficiency in service delivery, improved communication between service providers and community partners, and allowed for training surrounding the Pathways to Wellbeing subclass.
- Behavioral Health and Child Welfare Services continue to work together to develop the Children's System of Care. The Children's System of Care embraces the "no wrong door" approach to serve Children and Youth experiencing complex and interrelated needs that require services spanning multiple disciplines and agencies. We are currently working with a consultant to help effectively bridge El Dorado County Child Welfare Services and Behavioral Health Services.
- Monthly meetings have been taking place between the Central Region Children's System of Care coordinators to discuss strengths and barriers identified with the implementation of the various CCR expectations.
