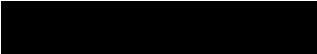

Supporting Local Veterans and their families in times of need.

Grant Request SUMMARY: In 300 words or less please provide a summary that describes the program/project that your organization is requesting funds for.

Our VFW post was first established in 1930 and has been serving the needs of the veterans in El Dorado County since then. There are approximately 12,000 veterans living in El Dorado County and their needs can vary greatly. Many veterans struggle with the return to civilian life, and the transition can be very difficult. Our organization provides not only comradeship and support in good times but also provides access to vital services and funding in times of need. The grant funds would increase our ability to assist veterans and their families with financial stability and give them crucial support to prevent homelessness, hunger, and social isolation.

Our grant funds will be spent on El Dorado County veterans their families.

What is the need that your project/program that you are requesting funds for supports?

Veterans face unique hurdles and needs in coping with life after the military. Approximately 2 million service members have been deployed since 2001, many returning veterans have serious physical and psychological traumas from sustained combat operations around the globe. Many veterans just want to get far away from the military when their enlistments or time is up, and they do not realize they are missing out on the support and help they need to transition back to the civilian world. Unfortunately, many individuals become aware of this issue too late, resulting in them missing out on the necessary support and assistance.

Many veterans are not aware of the resources available to them and a fraternal military organization is often their first point of contact.

We frequently receive requests for financial help while individuals await VA disability payments or other assistance to begin. Veterans are asking for assistance with back rent payments, overdue bills, vehicle registration or repairs, and food assistance.

Please provide information (DATA) demonstrating the need exists for VETERANS in El Dorado County.

There are approximately 12,000 veterans living within El Dorado County, about 7% of the total population, significantly higher than the average within the state of California. This group of veterans is proportionally a large number of Vietnam era veterans, but there is also a significant group of Global War on Terrorism veterans, veterans who have served since September 11th, 2001. Many of these younger veterans are affected by food and housing insecurity, substance abuse, low rates of unemployment, and incarceration for low-level offenses. In addition to the litany of disabilities resulting from injuries sustained during their tenure in the military, including "invisible injuries" such as PTSD and TBI, and the stigmas associated with mental health disorders, some local veterans face an increased risk of disability due to age and lack of access to healthcare in the remote and rural areas in which they live.

Our organization works in conjunction with other county groups; NGOs, churches and support organizations, and we all share information about veterans struggling with a myriad of difficulties. We often receive request for financial assistance to help as well help with day to day issues.

How will this program/project in this grant request address the need described above?

With the funds received from this grant we will be able to assist worthy veterans in gaining access to vital resources. The funds can aid in repairing a vehicle allowing the veteran to attend medical appointments, seek and keep gainful employment or attend college or other higher education goals. We will be able to empower a veteran to get access to needed benefits from the VA, state and county programs. Other funds can assist in meeting urgent needs or unexpected expenses that would be beyond the normal items a veteran and their families may not be able to budget for. For veterans that are incarcerated, the courts can impose fees or program costs that would hinder their success, and we could assist them in paying those fees.

**How is your organization suited to meet this need?
Please describe how organization's mission aligns with the need and the program/project that funding is being requested for.**

One of our core tenets in the VFW organization is assisting veterans in both good times and bad. We have a diverse group of veterans from this community who have "walked a mile" in their shoes and know how difficult the transition can be from military to civilian life. Many of our members have sought out the same resources that new veterans are trying to connect with. Our members have established a robust partnership and the needed rapport with other organizations and people who can easily direct a veteran to the right person. We also work in conjunction with other groups and often combine resources and funds to help another veteran who may not have been on our list. Our ability to forge and maintain strong partnerships with a wide and diverse group of organizations demonstrates our commitment to community collaboration and growth.

What is the grant timeline and major milestones of this project?

Please remember, if your grant is approved, funding must be spent within a year.

Our timeline will be based on the calendar year of January 1, 2027, to December 31st 2027. However; in the Christmas season we often sponsor several veteran families in need by purchasing dinners and gifts for the family, so we would be a bit ahead of the quarterly review process and start the calendar years some funds already spent.

We will have a quarterly review of expenditures to ensure we are track to meet the spending goals of the grant in the time frame allowed.

What are the measurable objectives of the project/program that you are requesting grant funds for?

The measurable objectives of this program are to provide funds to worthy veterans to prevent homelessness, unemployment, substance abuse, and mental health issues. The objective will be to minimize the stressors cause by financial insecurity many veterans experience in their daily lives.

How will the objectives be measured?

The objective will be measured by collecting information about the successes or failures of the veterans we assist. We will keep historical data on these veterans to follow their progress from start to finish. We will also work in conjunction with other organizations to keep data on the veterans we assist.

We will request a DD 214 from the veteran to prove their status as a veteran. We will also use Veteran Service Officer to ensure the individual is a veteran if they are in a homeless or transition type of situation.

What is the anticipated impact of the project?

The impact of this project will be to help veterans who are struggling with everyday life issues; we hope to prevent veterans from losing access to stable housing, or having to choose between paying bills or purchasing groceries, to stop them from losing employment or missing a medical appointment.

How will you measure the impact of this project/program?

We will measure the impact of this program by the success of the veteran we assist. We will follow up with the veteran or the organization that was requesting assistance to see if they attained the goals or issues, they wanted help with. We will go back over the resources and money we spent on a quarterly basis and then again reach out to that person to follow up with them. We can modify our program based on the data we collect, whether it was a success or failure. This will provide us the information we can use to better assist veterans in future requests.

What determines if your program/project continues on in regards to impact?

The Veterans of Foreign Wars has a normal relief fund in their regular budget to aid veterans but those funds are based on donations and fund raising by the post itself. The relief fund is often depleted quickly and we have to wait for another fund raising event to refill the fund. The grant funds will allow us to budget better throughout the year and give us a greater ability to allocate funds easier.

Budget Narrative

Revenue:

"Other Contributions" - \$450, represents cash contributions received during the bi-annual Buddy Poppy drive the VFW post does during Veterans Day and Memorial Day.

"Fundraising" - \$2600, represents the funds the post collects during the monthly Bingo games by selling food, drinks and snacks during the games.

Expenses:

"Staff Salaries, Wages, and Benefits" We are an all-volunteer organization and do not pay staff or benefits.

"Occupancy and Utilities" \$1350: We pay the Veterans Memorial building a "fee" based on monies collected during various events throughout the year.

"Supplies, materials, and printing" \$1950: This represents the costs of printing programs for the bingo games, purchasing food for various fund-raising events, the cost of bingo cards used during the games, banners used for advertising events.

"Marketing and Advertising" \$500: This represents the cost of maintaining our website on-line, it provides a point of information for events and meeting of the post.

"Other" \$15,000 has been budgeted to cover the costs of requests we receive throughout the year for assistance in paying bills, covering costs of lodging and housing, paying for groceries, vehicle repairs, providing transportation costs, and other daily living expenses.
