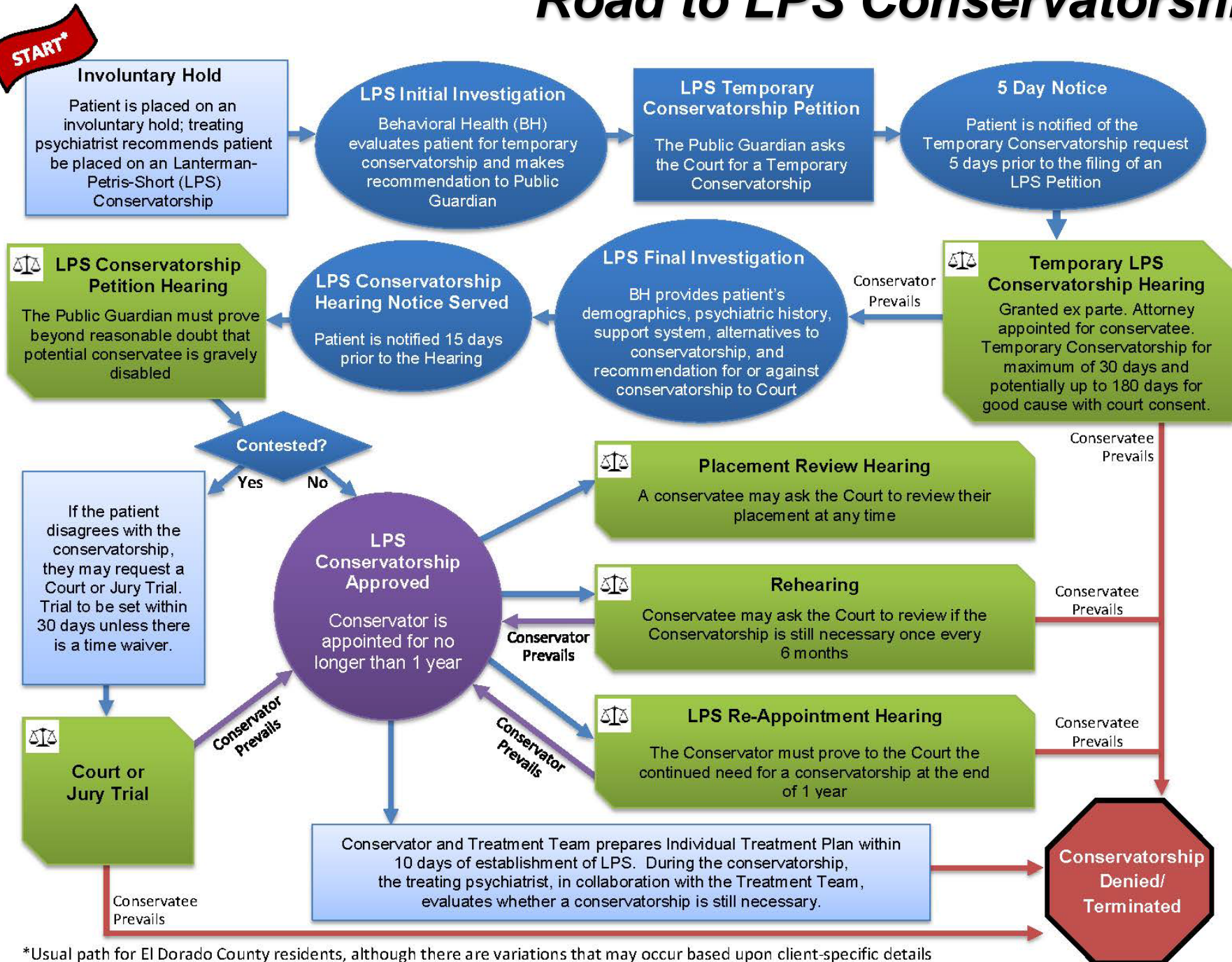

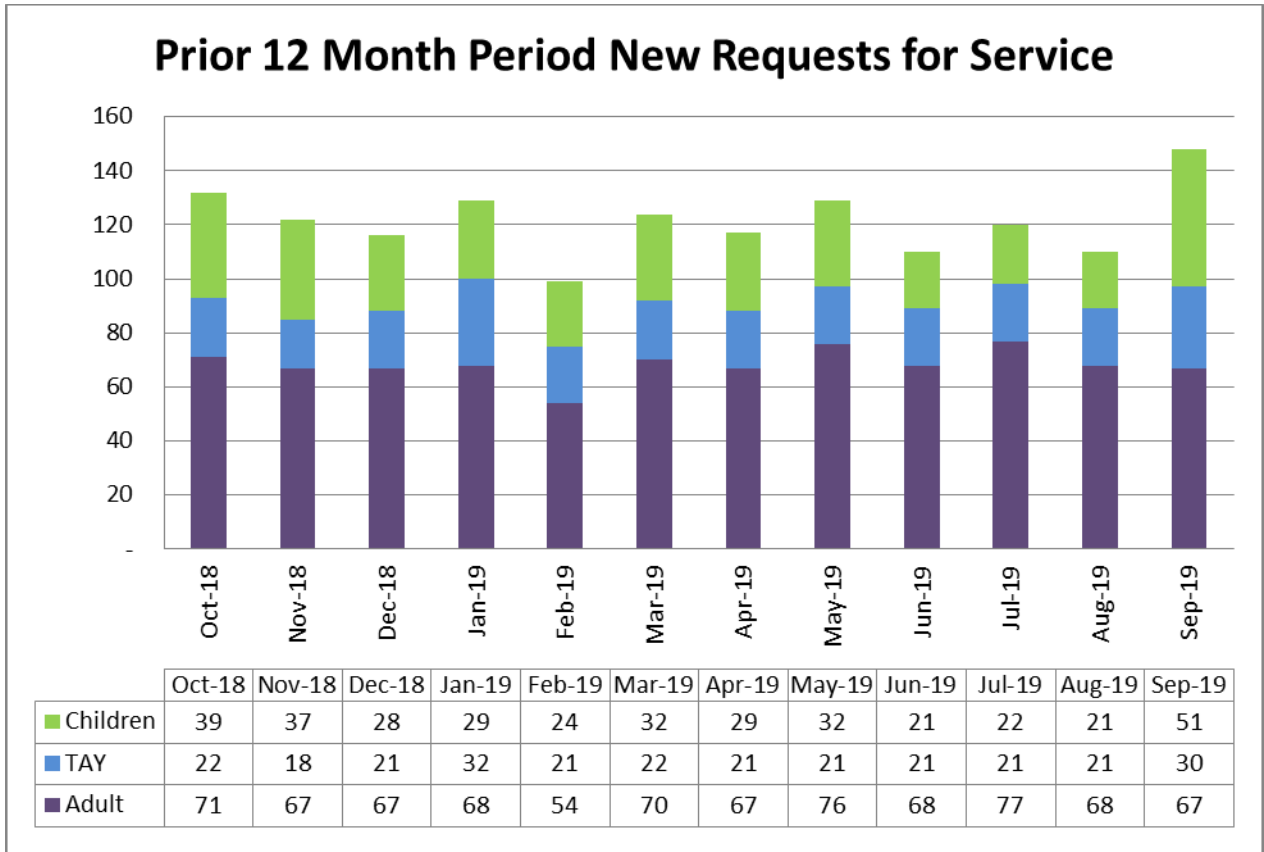

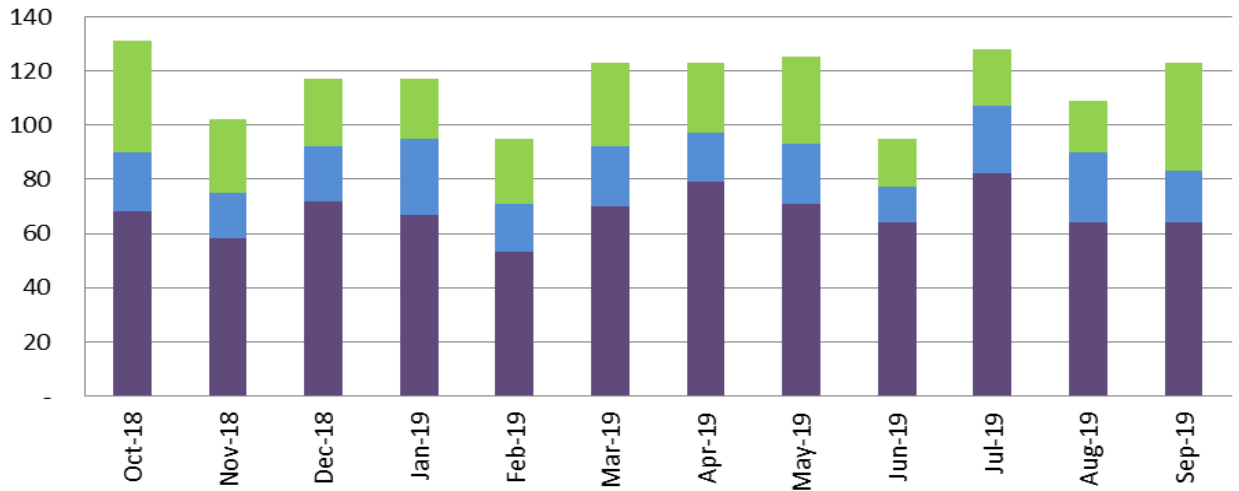

New Service Request Trends



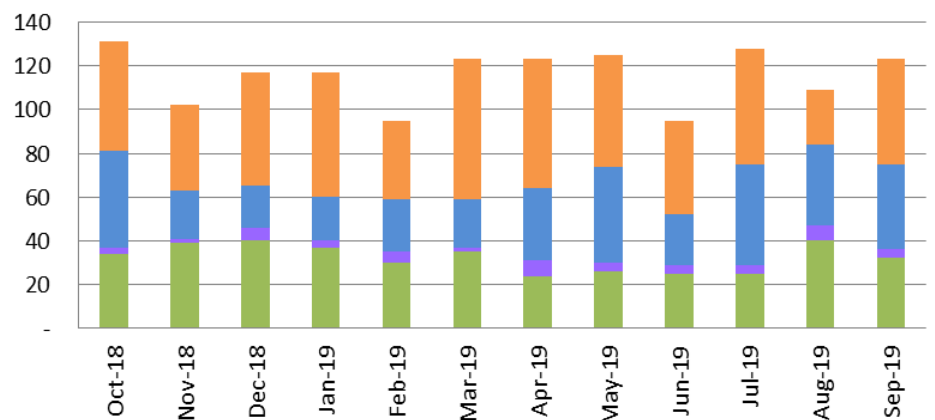
Discharged Service Request Trends

Prior 12 Month Period Discharged Requests for Service (by Age)



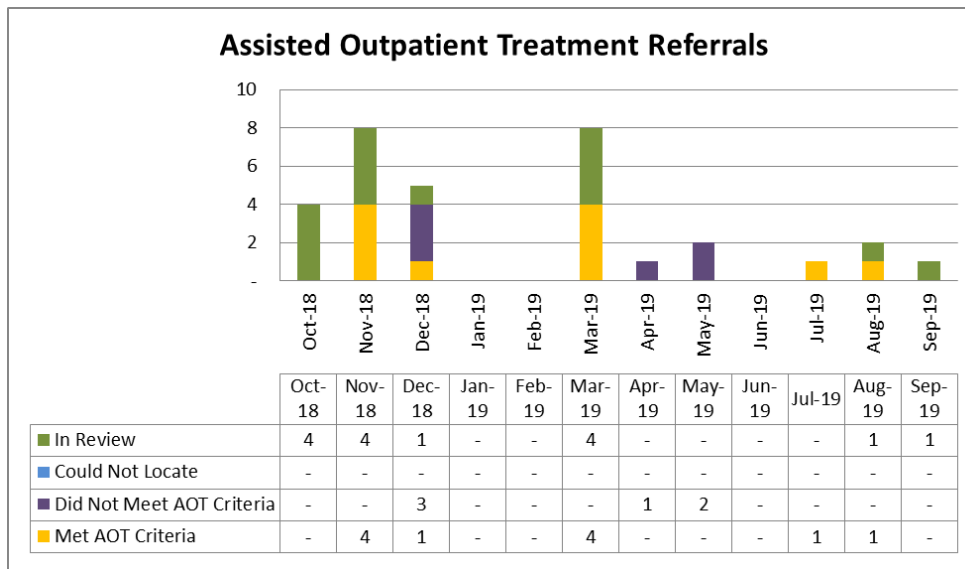

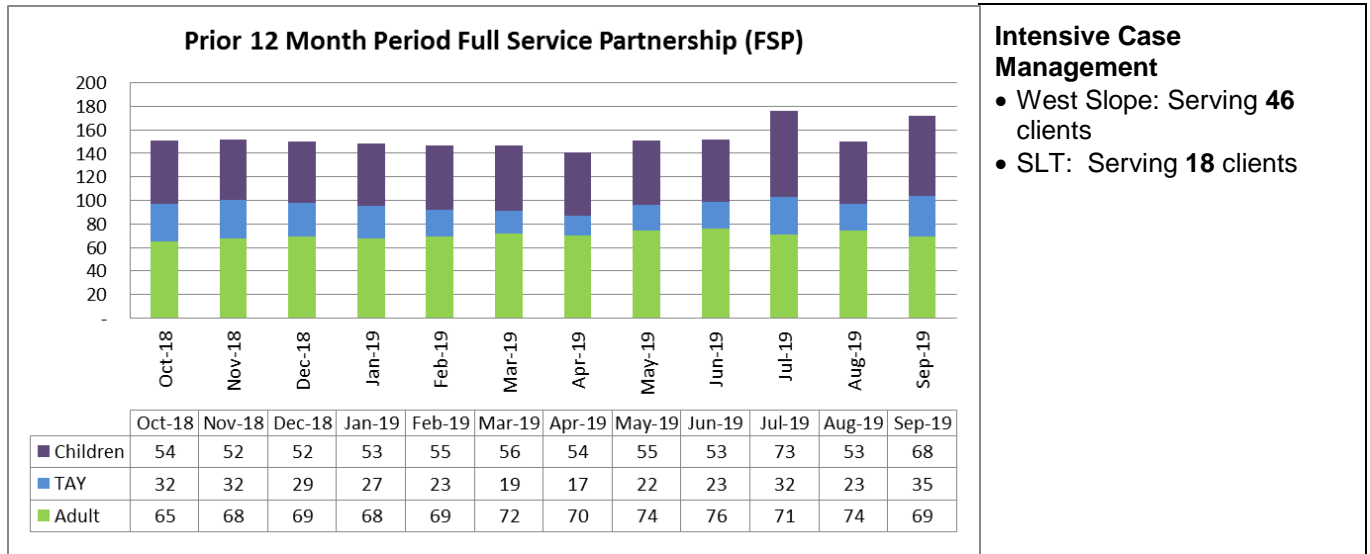

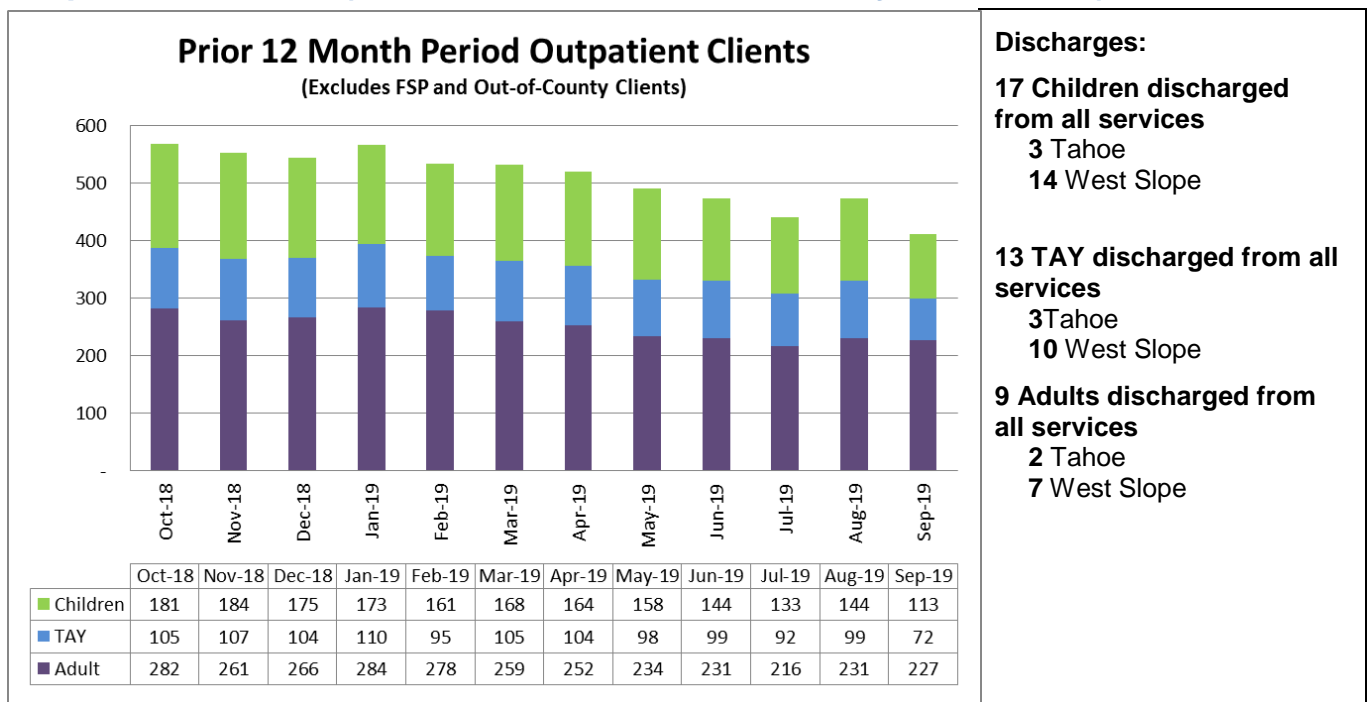

Psychiatric Health Facility (Nicole Cable)

- There were **34** Admissions; **27** Admissions were El Dorado County residents and **7** were Out of County residents.
- There were **29** El Dorado County residents discharged; **19** to Home with Support, **5** to Home without support, **1** MHRC/IMD, **1** Board and Care, **1** to ICM T-House, **1** Shelter, **1** to Other, and **0** to Emergency Department.
- Upon discharge, **18** El Dorado County residents were insured and **11** El Dorado County residents were pending insurance.
- There were **1** Seclusion Episodes, **2** Physical Restraint Episodes (**2** minutes), **1** Assaults (**1** clients), **0** Elopements, **2** Medication Errors (**0** medication errors with no patient involvement), Client Surveys **23**
- There were **0** denials of El Dorado County referrals: N/A
- Average daily census was **13.47** (range 11-16) with **11** average length of stay of days.

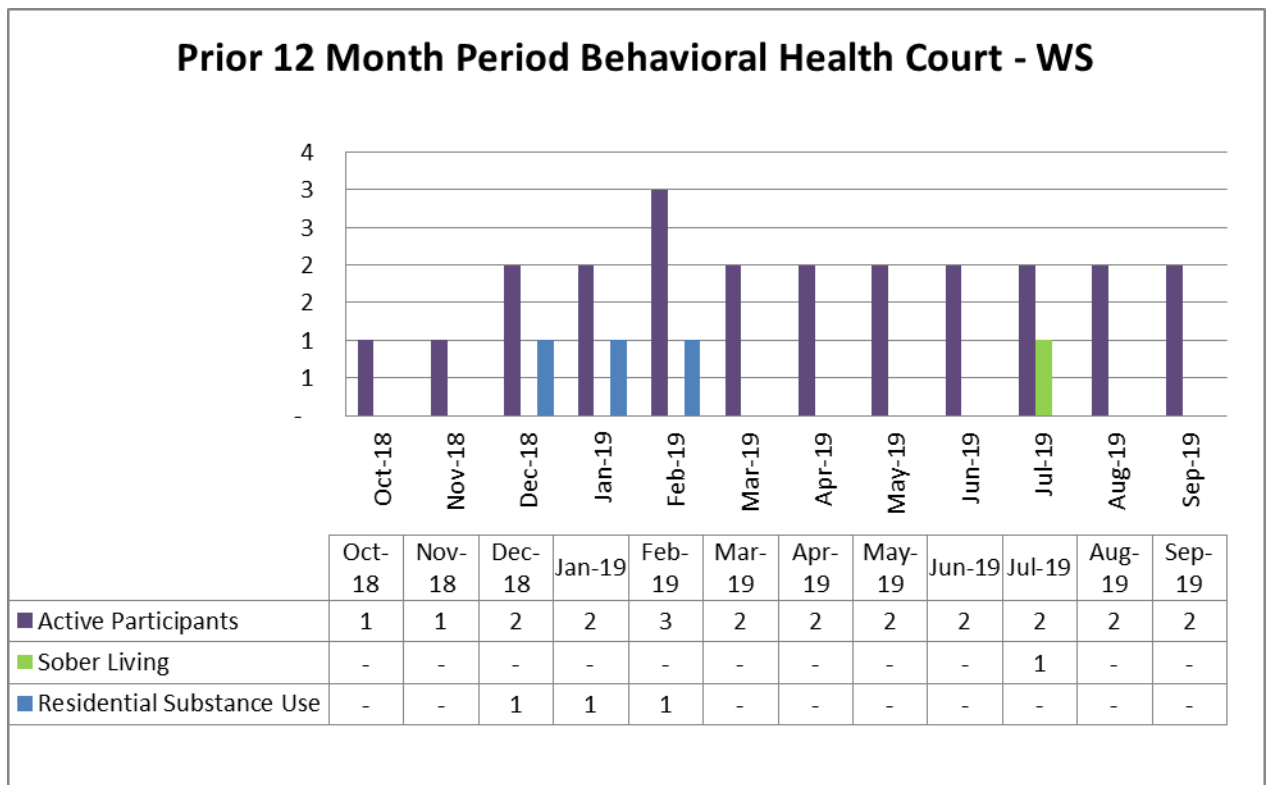
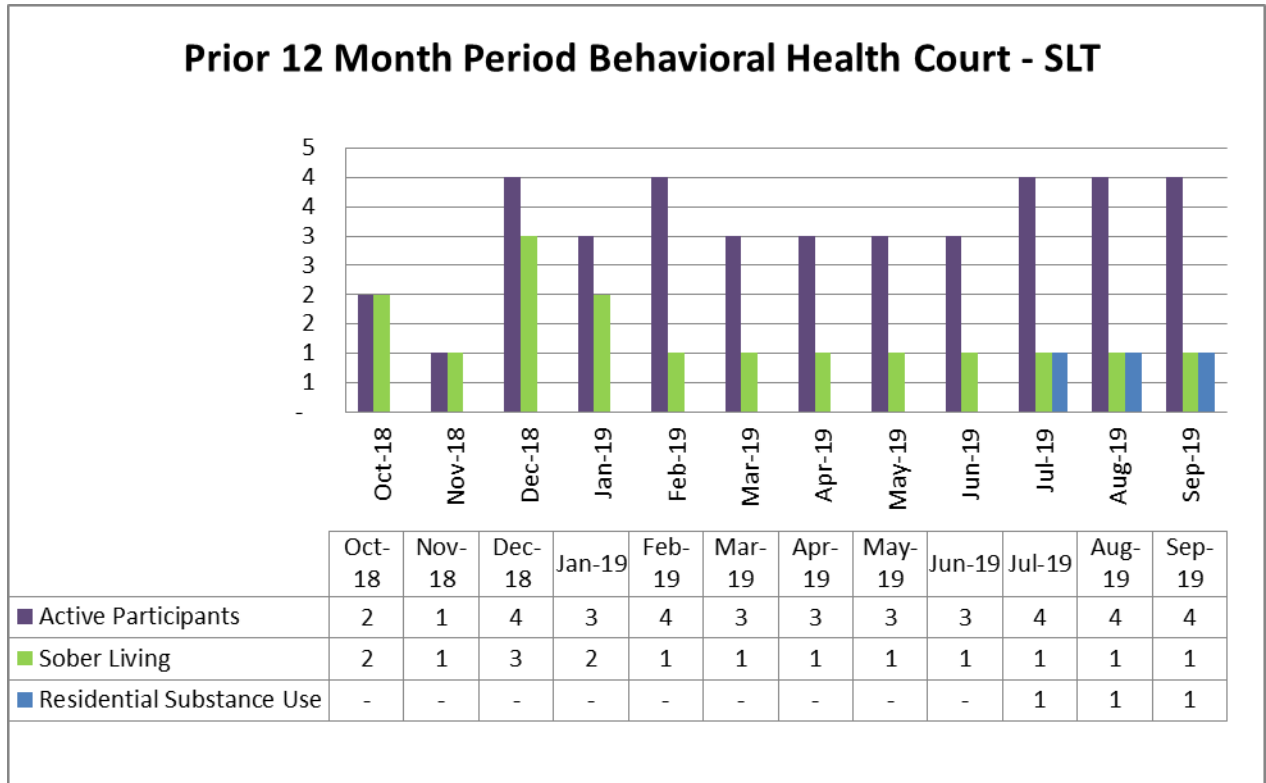
Crisis Intervention Teams (CIT) (Angie Larrigan and Sabrina Owen)

- **SLT:** MDT meeting in September lacked several important community partners, most notably STPD, probation and Wellpath, all of whose attendance is intermittent. Sheriff, Barton and Behavioral Health were present to discuss concerns and management of our at risk populations
- **WS:** Huge community partner attendance at the September meeting, including: EDCSO, PPD, APS, Wellpath, Probation, Parole, NAMI, the DAs office, EDCBH, HOT Team and PERT. Discussed numerous at risk cases, community resources and concerns, and possible referrals and linkages. Frustrations were shared by NAMI representative, Jan Malnicoe regarding co-occurring disorders and patient rights. After the meeting ended, we toured the brand new and beautifully appointed EDC Sheriff's Building.
- **PERT:** No current PERT data because there is not a full-time clinician assigned to this program.

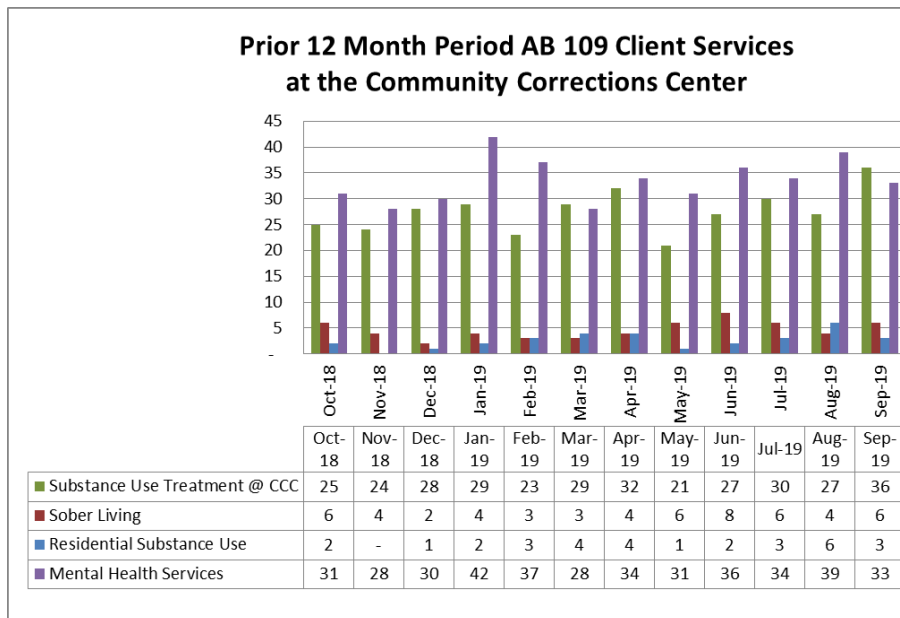

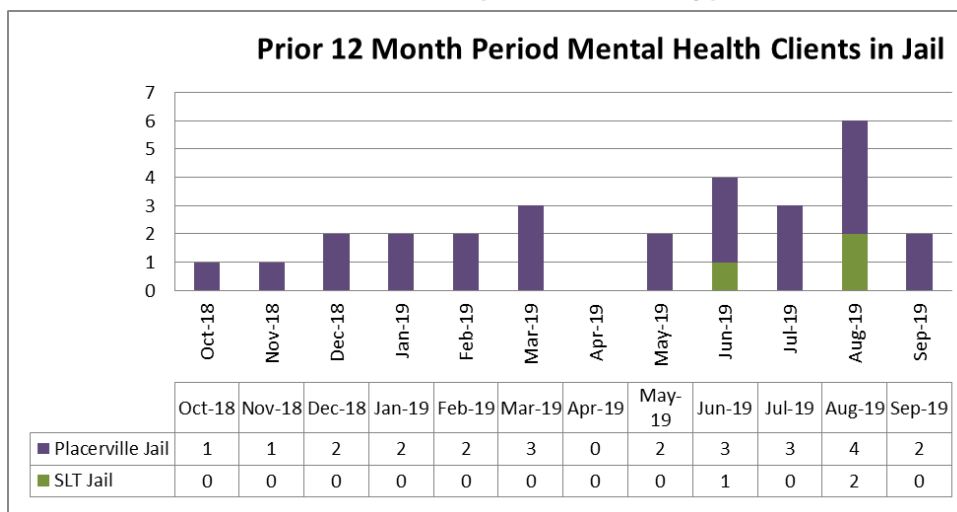


AB 109 (John Schumacher)

QUALITY ASSURANCE & PATIENT RIGHTS

Patients' Rights Advocate (Christina Hammel)

- The new Patients' Rights Advocate for El Dorado County is Christina Hammel. Her hours are Mondays and Thursdays, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm.
- Data related to Patients' Rights will resume regular reporting as soon as possible.

Quality Improvement/Utilization Review (Angelina Larrigan / Ren Strong)

- The Quality Improvement/Utilization Review team has been very busy in recent months, with implementing new State requirements, monitoring contractors, and submitting reports to the State.
- Outpatient documentation training was provided in September to County and contractors' staff.
- The quarterly Network Adequacy Certification for Quarter 3 (June through August 2019) was submitted to the State in October.
- In mid-September, the State issued its findings to all counties based upon the April 2019 (Quarter 1) Network Adequacy submittal (December 2018 through February 2019 data). El Dorado County had three areas of improvement identified, all of which were addressed in the October Network Adequacy submittal.
 - Child Psychiatrist Capacity: One contracted provider did not have its usual capacity for child psychiatry during the Quarter 1 period. The contractor now has a child psychiatrist and maintains contracts with agencies to access psychiatry as may be needed.
 - Timely Access to Initial Requests for Service: The County has focused on this process during the past six months and greatly improved its compliance rate from 64% during Quarter 1, to 94% during the most recent quarter of June through August 2019 (Quarter 3). The State's threshold for compliance is 70%.
 - Language Line Usage: This issue appears to be a report format/content issue, which was addressed in the Quarter 3 submittal. The State has also asked the County to monitor access to services for beneficiaries whose preferred language is Spanish.

Grievances/Appeals/Hearings (Christina Hammel; Ren Strong)

PROGRAM ACTIVITY UPDATES

ALCOHOL AND DRUG SERVICES / SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS (Salina Drennan)

Tahoe:

- Tahoe staff continue to provide outpatient treatment services in SLT.

West Slope:

- West Slope staff continue to partner with the HOT Team to provide assessments, screening and linkages for those with substance use disorder and are homeless

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT (MHSA) (Heather Longo/Tami Smith)

- The MHSA team is awaiting the report from the State with the results of the MHSA review.
- The MHSA team met with various contracted providers regarding their projects.
- Heather participated in various teleconferences, webinars, and meetings regarding items of interest to MHSA.
- The MHSA team participated in a Cultural Competency training: "Mental Illness and Treatment: Client/Family Member Perspective".

OUTPATIENT SERVICES

(Sabrina Owen (SLT); Lesly Van Sloten and Nicole Cable (WS))

Wellness Center Activities:

Tahoe:

- Wellness participants are enjoying the diverse range of groups and activities offered including a new group we call "clinician's hour" where a clinician (on rotation) does an activity or group of their choice, giving the participants an opportunity to get to know them and engage in a fun and/or educational endeavor.

West Slope:

- New group started on West Slope, 6 week "Roommate Etiquette 101" providing clients with workshops on important roommate topics, including Identifying what you are looking for in a roommate, boundary setting, conflict resolution, life skills and an introduction to housing resources and how to fill out applications for housing.
- Wellness Center continues to be a supportive place to gather, socialize and make new friends. Upcoming events in October to celebrate Halloween with food and fun and in November our Annual Thanksgiving Community Celebration at Fireman's Hall.

ICM Activities:

Tahoe:

- Several ICM clients have been enjoying our Saturday Friends 'n Fitness group which promotes exercise, socialization and sunlight (a combination proven to treat depression). Recent activities included a 6 mile walk along the new bike path near Sand Harbor and hikes to enjoy the fall colors.

West Slope:

- ICM clients continue to enjoy outdoor outings, BBQ at the Park, fishing, hiking and softball. With the T-houses being full, clients are learning important skills of cooking, cleaning, meal preparation, grocery shopping and conflict resolution

Children's Services (Angie Larrigan/Justine Collinsworth)

- Behavioral Health and Child Welfare Services (CWS) jointly implemented a new referral process for CWS Social Workers to directly refer children with an open CWS case to Behavioral Health (BH) for a Specialty Mental Health Services (SMHS) medical necessity screening. BH Access Team staff and CSW Social Workers now have a clearly identified pathways for communication in order to follow up on referrals and ensure all children who are in need receive a screening.
- BH staff and Sierra Child and Family Services staff have provided additional outreach at CWS unit meetings on both slopes of the County to collaborate about mandated Child and Family Team (CFT) Meetings, the required Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS) tool, and children's SMHS in general. This provided great opportunities to create shared meaning for State mandates and open clear lines of communication to best serve our most vulnerable minor population.

TAY DBT/FEP Program (Sabrina Owen and Lesly Van Sloten)

Tahoe

- Anna Lee, AMFT, new TAY clinician, has teamed up with Allision Hibbard, AMFT, from our substance use department to offer DBT groups at both Tallac and STHS. The groups, which increase skills for decision making, managing emotions and improving relationships, have proved so popular they are now expanding to offer multiple groups at both sites. Anna is also working on developing new DBT brochures and educating our community providers as to these free, much needed, services for our adolescents..
