PART IV PROGRAM NARRATIVE

1. OBJECTIVES

An Application for Federal Aviation Administration Airport Improvement Program funds has been prepared for the engineering design of Replace Airport Beacon and Beacon Tower project proposed to be included in the 2023 Airport Improvement Program at the Georgetown Airport. The project description is as follows:

The existing beacon is old, difficult to maintain, and replacement parts are often difficult to obtain. The existing tower is old and has significant safety concerns. It is proposed to install a new beacon on a new tip down tower at the existing tower site at the Georgetown Airport.

The proposed project includes the engineering design of the following:

- Disassemble and remove existing beacon tower, includes disconnecting existing electrical power.
- Construct a new tower foundation at the site of the existing tower.
- Erect new 55-foot tip-down beacon tower.
- Replace old beacon system with a LED medium intensity rotating beacon
- Replace electrical service with new cable and required grounding.

2. **RESULTS OR BENEFITS EXPECTED**

The new beacon tower is needed to modernize the existing facilities which may be over 50-years old and which requires extensive maintenance. The condition of the existing tower makes maintaining the beacon difficult. Expensive beacon maintenance provides only temporary solutions and would be eliminated with the new beacon tower. The new beacon and beacon tower will improve safety of operations at the airport.

3. APPROACH

<u>Plan of Action</u> - All airport design will conform to Advisory Circular 150/5300-13B, Airport Design. Specifications will be prepared based on Advisory Circular 150/5370-10H, Standards for Specifying Construction of Airports. All safety requirements as outlined in Advisory Circular 150/5370-2G, Operational Safety on Airports During Construction will be included in the Construction Safety and Phasing Plan prepared for this project.
