Dear Supervisor Sweeney,

The situation at the EDC Animal Shelter is dire. It is unfortunate that decisions were not made on a timely basis to keep this project on track. The county has known for years that the animal shelter would need to be moved by 3/07. Now here we are without a facility to shelter the animals of this county.

During all these delays, construction prices have skyrocketed. Apparently it will now cost almost twice as much to build the new Shelter. The simple solution is to slash the project in half, but please don't make this decision without first making every effort to garner funds to complete the project as designed. The people, staff and the animals of El Dorado County have suffered long enough with a substandard facility. The growth projections for this County make it imperative that the facility be built to the size specified in the design plan.

We live in an agricultural county. Animals, both livestock and companion animals, are an integral part of our communities. The staff at EDCAS have done a great job with a pitiful facility and meager staffing. I am a volunteer at the Shelter and have heard compliments, first hand, on how clean they keep the facility. We are very fortunate to have a shelter staff who really care about the animals and make the effort to keep the animals clean, comfortable and adoptable. But have you seen what they have to work with? I don't think I could work under the conditions that these county employees are subjected to. No wonder they have so much trouble hiring in and retaining staff (not to mention the deficient pay scale). We also have trouble retaining volunteers at the Shelter. If we had a shelter that we could be proud of, with space for volunteers to work with the animals, we could bring in more volunteers. I toured the San Diego City Animal Shelter, which has a wonderful shelter with a large team of volunteers who take on many of the responsibilities that our county currently has to hire staff for. A decent shelter opens up many possibilities for our future.

It's about time that we show the EDC Animal Services staff some real support! Give them a decent facility to work in, a decent wage, and a work place that our entire community can be proud of.

The situation at the EDC Animal Shelter is dire. It is unfortunate that decisions were not made on a timely basis to keep this project on track. The county has known for years that the animal shelter would need to be moved by 3/07. Now here we are without a facility to shelter the animals of this county.

During all these delays, construction prices have skyrocketed. Apparently it will now cost almost twice as much to build the new Shelter. The simple solution is to slash the project in half, but please don't make this decision without first making every effort to garner funds to complete the project as designed. The people, staff and the animals of El Dorado County have suffered long enough with a substandard facility. The growth projections for this County make it imperative that the facility be built to the size specified in the design plan.

We live in an agricultural county. Animals, both livestock and companion animals, are an integral part of our communities. The staff at EDCAS have done a great job with a pitiful facility and meager staffing. I am a volunteer at the Shelter and have heard compliments, first hand, on how clean they keep the facility. We are very fortunate to have a shelter staff who really care about the animals and make the effort to keep the animals clean, comfortable and adoptable. But have you seen what they have to work with? I don't think I could work under the conditions that these county employees are subjected to. No wonder they have so much trouble hiring in and retaining staff (not to mention the deficient pay scale). We also have trouble retaining volunteers at the Shelter. If we had a shelter that we could be proud of, with space for volunteers to work with the animals, we could bring in more volunteers. I toured the San Diego City Animal Shelter, which has a wonderful shelter with a large team of volunteers who take on many of the responsibilities that our county currently has to hire staff for. A decent shelter opens up many possibilities for our future.

It's about time that we show the EDC Animal Services staff some real support! Give them a decent facility to work in, a decent wage, and a work place that our entire community can be proud of.
