Litter Abatement	\$6.00/EDU <i>unincorporated improved parcels</i>	<b>Clean Tahoe Program and AB939</b> – Under an agreement with the City of South Lake Tahoe, unincorporated improved parcels within the Tahoe Basin pay \$3.00/EDU for a litter abatement program under the Clean Tahoe Committee’s guidance. (City of SLT residents receive the benefits of this program from a portion of a garbage bill surcharge). The remaining \$3.00/EDU collected from these unincorporated parcels is designated for the AB939 waste reduction program established in 1990/1991 to plan and implement waste reduction and recycling programs. Revenue generated by these assessments are a direct pass through to the City of South Lake Tahoe.
Solid Waste Reduction	\$3.00/EDU <i>Within the City of South Lake Tahoe</i>	<b>AB939</b> – This fee was established in 1990/1991 as a result of the state mandates to plan and implement waste reduction and recycling programs to reduce the amount of solid waste going into landfills. This charge is applied to parcels within the City of South Lake Tahoe. Revenue generated by these assessments are a direct pass through to the City of South Lake Tahoe.
CSA 10 Household Hazardous Waste	\$3.00/EDU	<b>Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)</b> – This program was established in 1989/1990, to divert HHW from landfills. It is applicable to all East and West Slope parcels. The revenue funds the operation, overhead and disposal costs of the permanent HHW collection facility at the fire station on Bass Lake Road and several annual one-day HHW collection events held in outlying communities. The revenue also helps support 29 used oil collection centers located throughout the County and permanent HHW facilities located at the South Lake Tahoe and Diamond Springs Material Recovery Facilities (MRFs).
