Mission Statement

Sierra Wildlife Rescue (SWR) strives to preserve El Dorado County's wildlife through rescue, rehabilitation, and release; and to provide wildlife training and conservation programs to the public, schools, and community organizations.



SWR Overview

- Established as a 501 (c) (3) non-profit in 1992 to serve El Dorado County's wildlife.
- Permitted by California Department of Fish & Wildlife, U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and the United States Department of Agriculture.
- 88 annual volunteers, 140+ seasonal volunteers, 2 seasonal full-time paid staff.
- Volunteers average 3,100 hours per month during peak activity (May-September) and 1,600 hours per month throughout the balance of the year. Roughly 26,700 annual volunteer hours.
- We rescue and rehabilitate, on average, more than 1,300 wild birds and mammals every year!
- SWR and El Dorado County Animal Services work together almost daily; the collaboration is exceptional.
- Animal Services calls SWR to handle most wildlife calls that come in from the public.
- The public calls SWR on nights and weekends when Animal Services is unavailable/closed.



Location: 777 Pleasant Valley Road

- Located in El Dorado County to serve the Western Slope of the County
- The SWR Center is located in Diamond Springs
 - Provides space to triage incoming wildlife, space for year-round education and training classes, and is home to the Baby Bird Nursery, where over 750 songbirds are housed and rehabilitated each year during the months of May through August.
- Outside the SWR Center, we rehabilitate raptors and mammals at satellite locations

- Funded by public donations (60%), memberships (10%), fundraising events (16%), and grants (14%)
- Educational outreach events In 2023, over 3,000 people reached at 38 events in El Dorado County

 - 2022 = 1240+
