

SILVA VALLEY PARKWAY INTERCHANGE PROJECT completed in 2015

- ✓ Strategic Interregional Investment In Transportation Mobility
- ✓ Connects four key highways: Interstate 5, Hwy 99, Hwy 16 (Jackson Hwy), and US Hwy 50
- ✓ Major benefits include congestion reduction on 50, safety upgrades, and improved emergency evacuation route
- ✓ A direct mandate from Sacramento County voters in 2004



CORRIDOR

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KAMMERER ROAD 6-mile segment

One of the most critical portions of the Capital SouthEast Connector is the Kammerer Road corridor, a 6-mile stretch between Interstate 5 and Hwy 99. This segment, implemented in collaboration with the City of Elk Grove, is a vital connection between I-5 and Hwy 99, easing congestion on local roads and providing direct access to growing residential and commercial areas and tribal lands.

GRANT LINE ROAD 19-mile segment

The longest section of the project, the Grant Line Road corridor, stretches 19 miles between Hwy 99 and White Rock Road. This segment, implemented in collaboration with the City of Elk Grove, the County of Sacramento, and the City of Rancho Cordova, is crucial for improving access to key employment centers, residential communities, and industrial areas.

WHITE ROCK ROAD 9-mile segment

The 9-mile section of the Capital SouthEast Connector runs along White Rock Road, connecting Grant Line Road to U.S. Highway 50. This portion is being developed in partnership with Sacramento and El Dorado Counties and the city of Folsom. The White Rock Road segment provides parallel capacity to Hwy 50, one of Northern California's most heavily used east-west highways.

Hwy 50/White Rock Road/Silva Valley Parkway Interchange – Completed in 2015

White Rock Road

From White Rock Rd/Prairie City Rd Intersection (in Folsom) to White Rock Rd/Latrobe Road Intersection (in EDC)

- 5.3 Miles +/-
- NEPA & CEQA Approved
- Expressway in Sacramento County
- Thoroughfare in El Dorado County

White Rock Road

From the County Line to White Rock Rd/Latrobe Road Intersection (in EDC)

- 4-lanes, consistent with current general plan
- Buffered bike lane and hardscape median
- "Shovel Ready" today with 100% designed plans



Alignment in El Dorado

- Widening on the north side of the road only to General Plan designation
- Right of Way is already setback and additional property is only required on one or two parcels
- Physical improvements will end at Manchester Dr; only minor restriping to Latrobe Rd
- New Traffic Signal at Carson Crossing Drive
- Currently in TIM Fee Zone 8




Benefits to El Dorado County

- Closes the "gap" and provides a continuous 4-lane road into Sacramento County
- Improves safety by reconstructing "hairpin" curves and improving vertical sight distance
- Provides a continuous and safe bicycle and pedestrian facility along White Rock Road
- Sets up connection for the future El Dorado Hills Business Park "Connector"

White Rock Road

- Acquisition of Right-of-Way
 - Fee acquisition at Carson Crossing Dr
 - Temporary Construction Easements to Stone Briar Dr
- Final engineering design of bike trail connection to
 Folsom
- Construction scheduled for 2026

Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro:

I am requesting funding for the White Rock Road Improvement Project in Fiscal Year 2026. The entity to receive funding for this project is the Capital Southeast Connector Joint Powers Authority, located at 10640 Mather Blvd, Suite 120, Mather CA, 95655. The purpose of this project is to reconstruct 3-miles of existing roadway into a four-lane divided expressway with a separated Class I bike path, Class II buffered bike lanes, and sidewalks in the City of Folsom and El Dorado County. The project will function as a gap closure connecting existing bike and pedestrian facilities at each end of the project. It's a valuable source of taxpayer funds because it will provide easy access to a 3,500 acre mixed use development that will provide 11,000 quality homes and 8,000 local jobs. The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized by 23 USC 133.

BIG PICTURE FUNDING STRATEGY

Challenges

- California has moved away from building new capacity on roadways, shifting the burden to local counties and cities to ease congestion with local funds
- The project is competing with other major infrastructure projects across California and the U.S. for limited grant funding, making it difficult to secure the necessary funds
- Federal vs State funding priorities constantly seesaw

Upcoming Funding Strategy

- The JPA Board of Directors approved a multi-year funding strategy contract with Drago Vantage to create a comprehensive financial plan
- White Rock Road in El Dorado is prioritized for federal funding
 - Project is "Shovel Ready" with CEQA and NEPA approval
 - Congressman Kevin Kiley secured funding for White Rock Rd in Appropriations Act (\$2M)
 - JPA will apply for construction funds when small-project rural grants become available 25-1104 B 16 of 17
