Matters not on the agenda may be addressed by the general public during the Open Forum. Public comments during Open Forum are limited to three minutes per person. The Board reserves the right to waive said rules by a majority vote.

 12-0002 Clerk of the Board of Supervisors recommending the Board approve the meeting minutes from the Special Meeting of Monday, March 26, 2012 and the Regular Meeting of Tuesday, March 27, 2012. 2. <u>11-0417</u> Acting as the Board of Directors for the Air Quality Management District:

Air Quality Management District recommending the Board authorize the Chair to sign Amendment II to Agreement for Services 483-M1111 with the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District extending the term of the Agreement to a total of three years and changing the name of the Agreement Administrator upon adoption of the Boards of Directors for both air districts.

**FUNDING:** No additional funding required due to amendment. Funding for original agreement remains available in Air Quality Management District operations budget.

3. <u>12-0401</u> Chief Administrative Officer recommending the Board authorize the appointment of Bobbi Bennett to the position of Human Resources Manager at Step 5 of the salary schedule.

**FUNDING:** General Fund.
