2011 Public Safety Realignment

- Established a Community Corrections Partnership (CCP)
 - ✓ CCP was required to form an Executive Committee (Penal Code 1230.1) which, is responsible for developing and recommending a local plan to the county Board of Supervisors (BOS)
- Changes:
 - ✓ Local custody for non-violent, non-serious, non-sex offenders
 - ✓ Changes to State Parole
 - ✓ Local Postrelease Supervision
 - ✓ Local Planning (CCP Executive Committee)
- Two funding streams established
 - ✓ Community Correction Allocation Program Funds
 - ✓ Local Planning & Implementation Allocation

El Dorado County – CCP Local Definition of Recidivism

<u>Recidivism (generally)</u> is defined as the tendency for a convicted offender to reoffend.

The generally accepted timeline for measurement is within three (3) year of release from custody to community supervision or from the point supervision is imposed out of court.

• All persons under the supervision of the El Dorado County Probation Department for Formal Probation, Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS), and Mandatory Supervision (MS).

El Dorado County – CCP Local Definition of Recidivism

Measure 1: NEW Conviction for a Misdemeanor or Felony.

Measure 2: Return to Custody for the following:

- Non-Technical (New Offense) Revocation of Supervision
- Arrest with sustained Probable Cause Declaration

<u>Measure 3:</u> Sustained Revocation of Supervision for what would otherwise be a criminal offense that did not result in a custodial sanction.

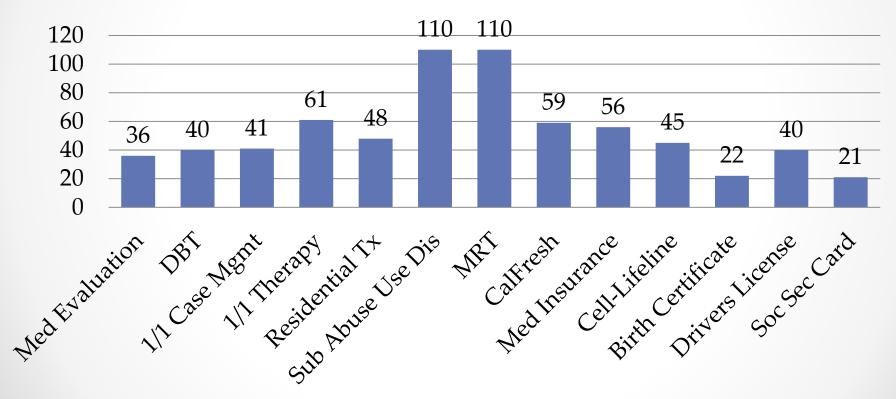

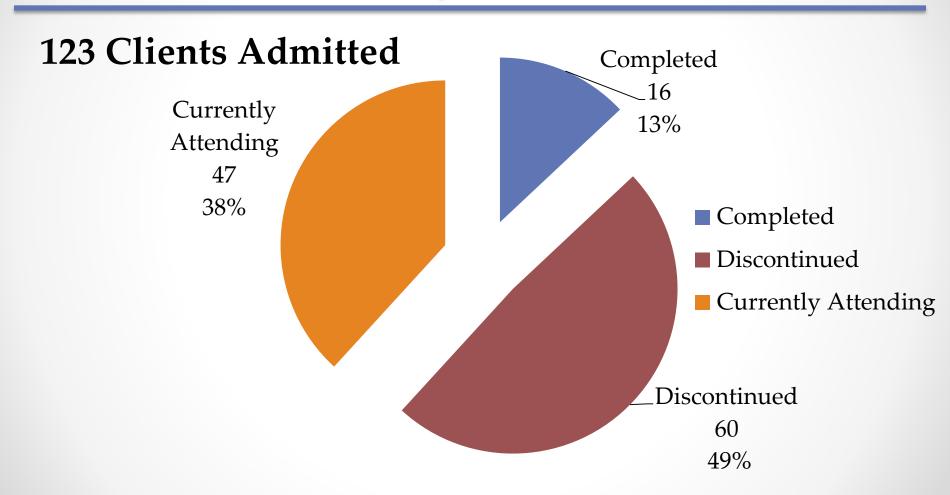


Service Referrals

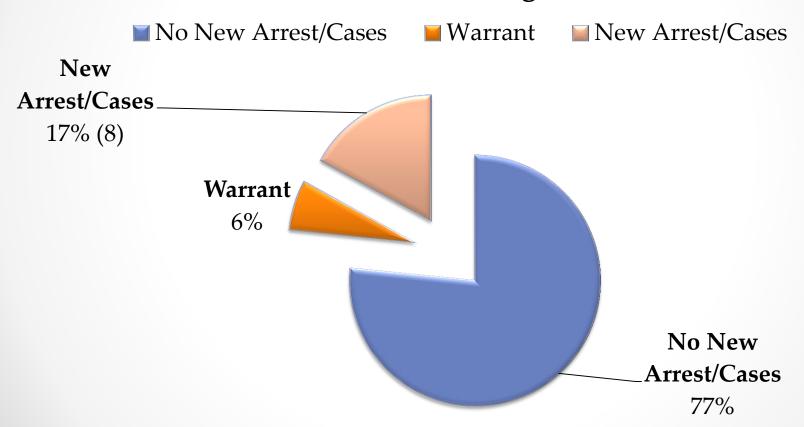


Program Referrals (Not Full Listing)

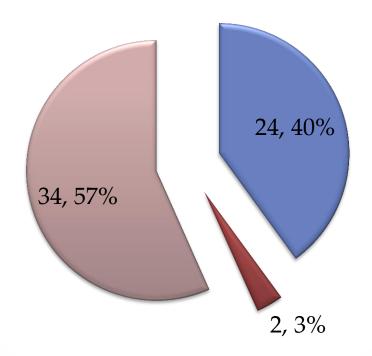

- Transferred Out of State or Out of County

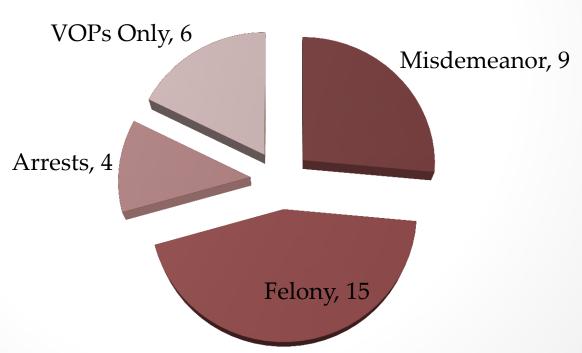

During and/or After Leaving the CCC



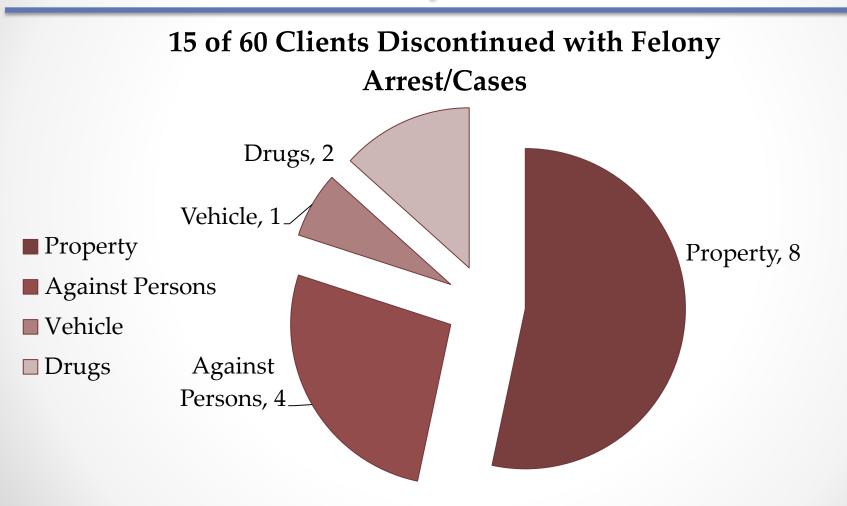

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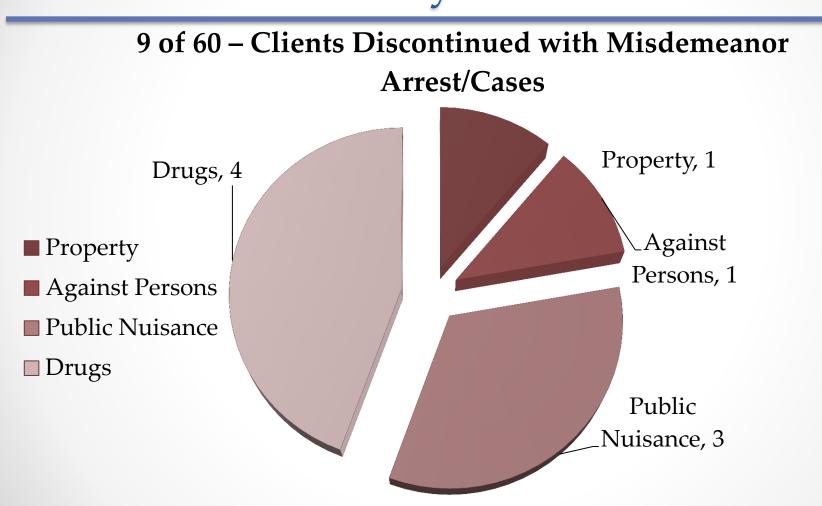

SUCCESS SUMMARY

- ✓ Of the 76 clients no longer at the CCC 40 or 53% remain out of the justice system.
- ✓ Of the 47 clients still attending the CCC 35 or 75% have remained out of the justice system while participating in the CCC Program.

- Started the CCC Program December 2014

- Release from PRCS November 2015
