


Promoting the preservation of the county's small farms and ranches and showcasing their activities and products.

- Promote public awareness of the county's fruits, vegetables, and other agricultural products and promote appropriate marketing activities for members, such as Farmers' Markets.




- Farm Trails is a county wide organization not bound to a specific geographic area.

The Farm Trail










Provide marked "trails" covering the county that people can follow to experience all our county has to offer.

Potential Problems, Obstacles, and Opportunities



- By letting non-residents have access to the same privileges and ease of access that the Board offers El Dorado County residents revenue that should be realized here is transferred elsewhere and opens the door on retail leakage.
- Entrepreneurs and non-profits that are based in other counties are taking advantage of this welcoming economic environment and taking money that would normally be made by residents in our jurisdiction and then returning to their counties.
- Having too many farmers' markets in one area can damage the farming community.



Potential Problems, Obstacles, and Opportunities cont...

- With no fees imposed on the market sponsors they are free to start markets wherever they can find a spot and they don't have to risk their money.
- A non-profit does charity work for the county in which they reside. If they raise money for a non-profit in another county they take that money back to their county and spend it there, which provides no benefit to El Dorado County.
- We're not suggesting that El Dorado County ban non-residents from doing business here; we just want our Supervisors to be aware of the money our county, our businesses, and our farmers are losing by giving non-residents the same privileges as residents.
