**NEW BUSINESS**

**Recommendation on How to Expand DPC / Role of DPC –**

- **Tiffany discusses the intent of the SCRUM documents and the need to choose a project, choose how to implement it, and decide the Delinquency Prevention Commission's role it.**
- **Tracy Bunch discusses the need to connect with youth on their level. Sports camps would help form relationships with kids and can focus on mentoring about specific topics. Roundtable discussion about the possibility of using the various interests/skill sets of the commission members to do this.**
- **Kelly Bentley suggests we begin by partnering with First 5 to see what they are already doing. She suggests we brain storm agencies that the commission can work with. Agencies suggested: Boys and Girls Club; First 5.**
- **Judge Sullivan discusses the First 5 Hubs that already focus on prevention. She suggests the commission might use a model of the youth advocacy program that has already been proven to work (i.e., Black Oak Mine) and expand it to other school districts so that junior high and high schools have those programs. The commission can assist that district to be the leader and help get other districts on board, in addition to working with Cathy Guerrero to use the Hubs to distribute this resource information to the community.**

- Kelly Bentley suggests that perhaps accessing grant writing for all schools in the community could be a role of the Delinquency Prevention Commission. Judge Sullivan suggests the commission put all the “right” people together to partner with The Foundation to discuss funding and grants for the replication of peer/youth advocacy programs like the Black Oak Mine program. A meeting is suggested with the following list of participants to include Chief Richart (Probation) and Leslie Griffith (CPS) as key participants: First 5; Black Oak Mine Unified Peer/Youth advocacy program (suggested to use as a model for other schools); EDCF (Non –Profit); Green Valley Church/Lighthouse; County Mental Health.
- The significance of the commission’s potential leverage through the Delinquency Prevention Commission’s title and county seal was brought to the Commissioners attention by Judge Sullivan. She suggests that the commission have a plan prior to putting the “right” people in the room so it can stand up to its potential influence.
