- The EDC Board of Supervisors approved the contract with Compassion Pathways for a Crisis Residential Treatment (CRT) facility on February 25, 2025. A CRT is an intensive short-term and structured residential program and an alternative to hospitalization for clients experiencing an acute psychiatric crisis or episode who do not have medical complications requiring nursing care. This facility will have 10 beds for EDC adult Medi-Cal members.

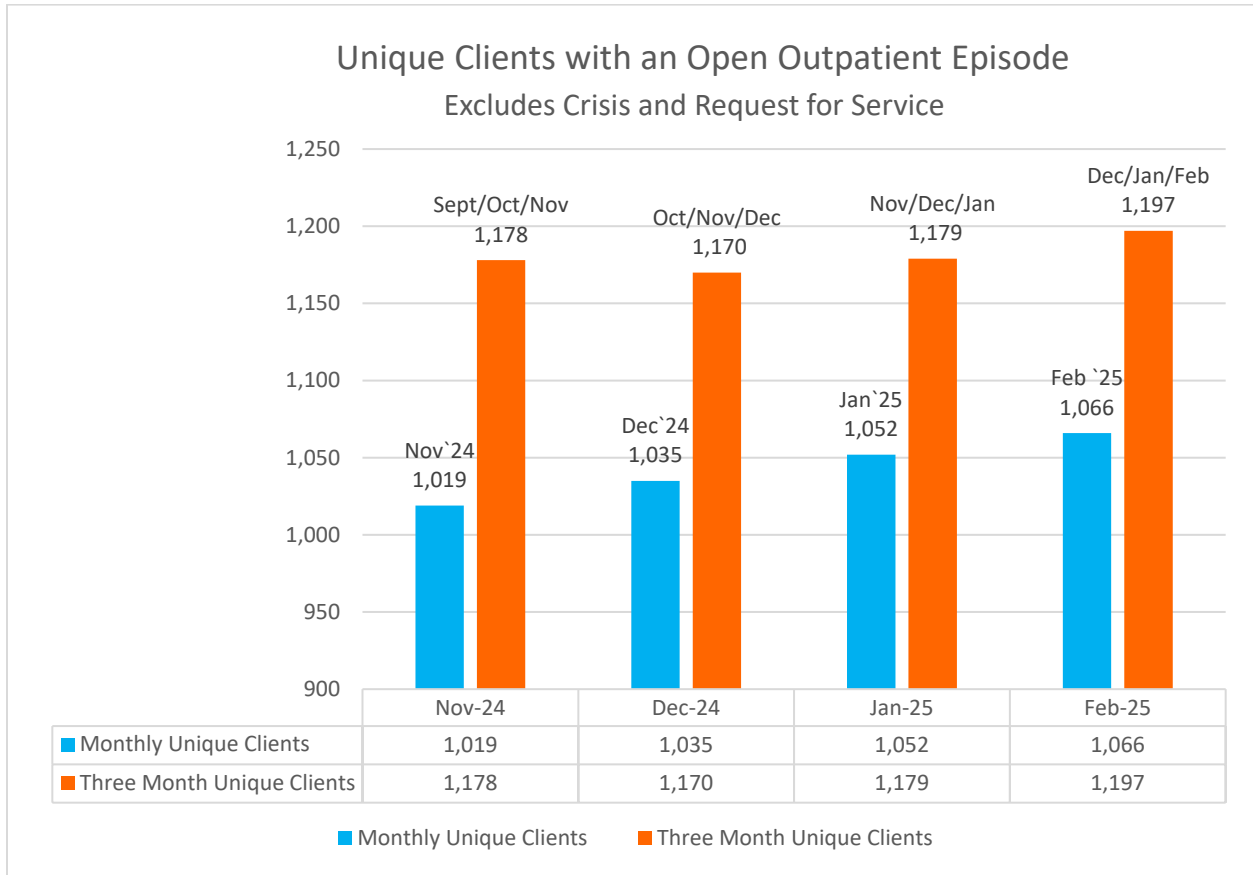

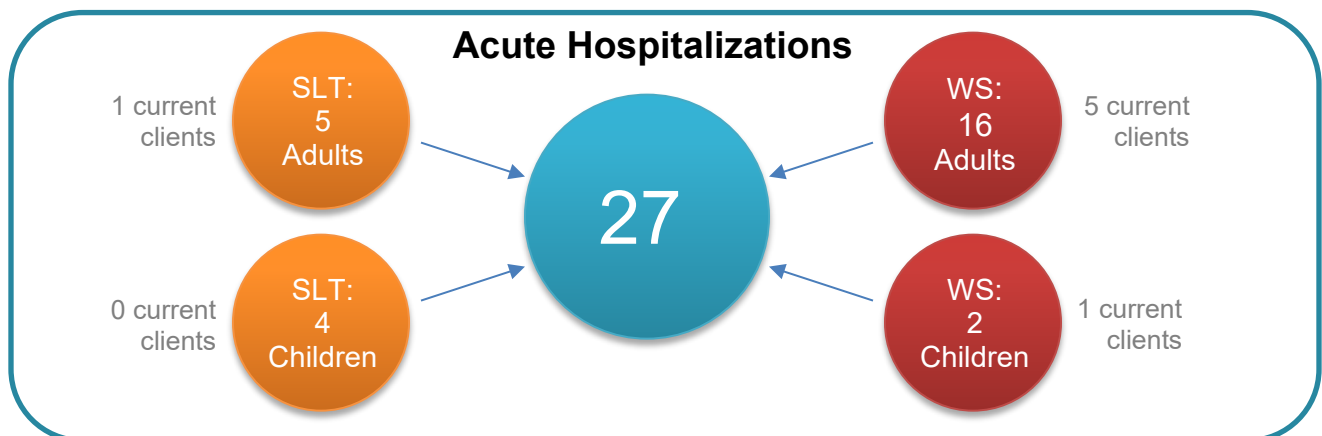

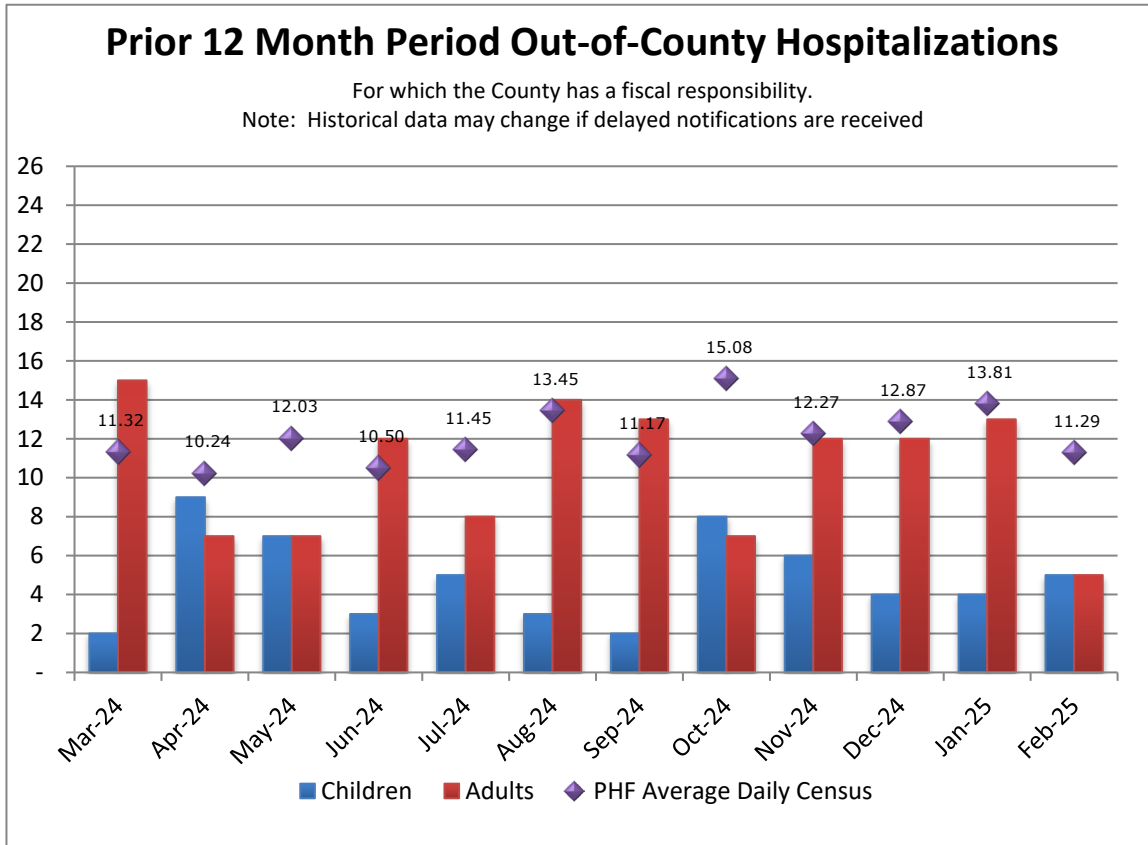

The MHP is contracted with the State to provide Psychiatric Emergency Services to any individual within the boundaries of the County, regardless of insurance or residency status.

Psychiatric Health Facility (Chris Kernes/Moriah Weldy)

- There were **22** Admissions; **13** Admissions were El Dorado County residents and **9** were Out of County residents.
- There were **11** El Dorado County residents discharged; **7** to Home with Support, **0** to Home without support, **1** MHRC/IMD, **1** Board and Care, **1** to ICM T-House, **0** to Shelter, **1** to Other, and **0** to Emergency Department.
- Upon discharge, **9** El Dorado County residents were insured and **2** El Dorado County residents were pending insurance.
- There were **0** Seclusion Episodes, **0** Physical Restraint Episodes (13 minutes), **0** Assaults, **0** Elopements, **0** Medication Errors (**0** medication errors with no patient involvement), Client Surveys **19**
- There were **2** denials of El Dorado County referrals: 1 - Minor, 2 - Minor
- Average daily census was **11.29** (range 9 - 15) with **15.37** average length of stay of days.
- Concurrent Reviews resulting in no medical necessity found. **3**

Out-of-County Acute Psychiatric Hospitalizations (Medi-Cal Beneficiaries Only) (Moriah Weldy)

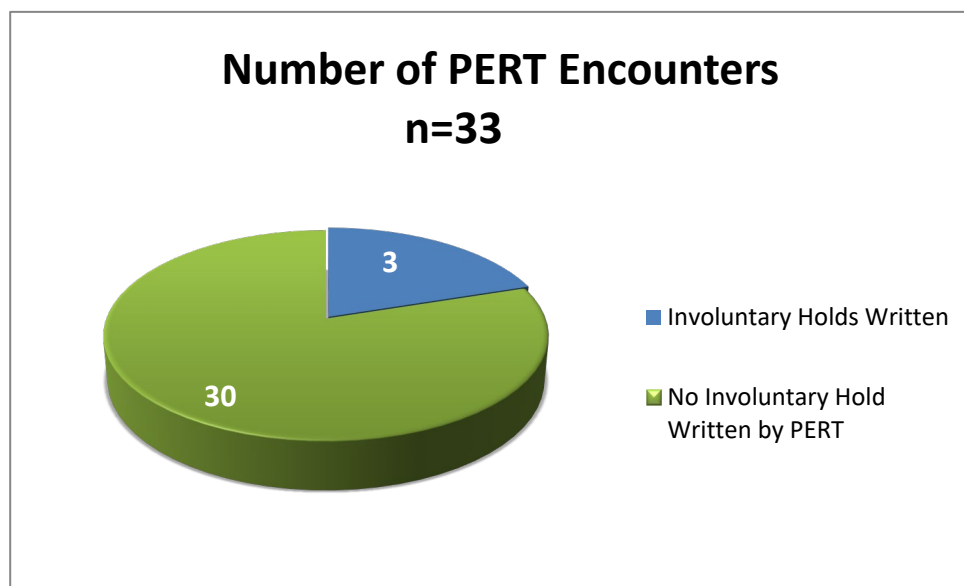
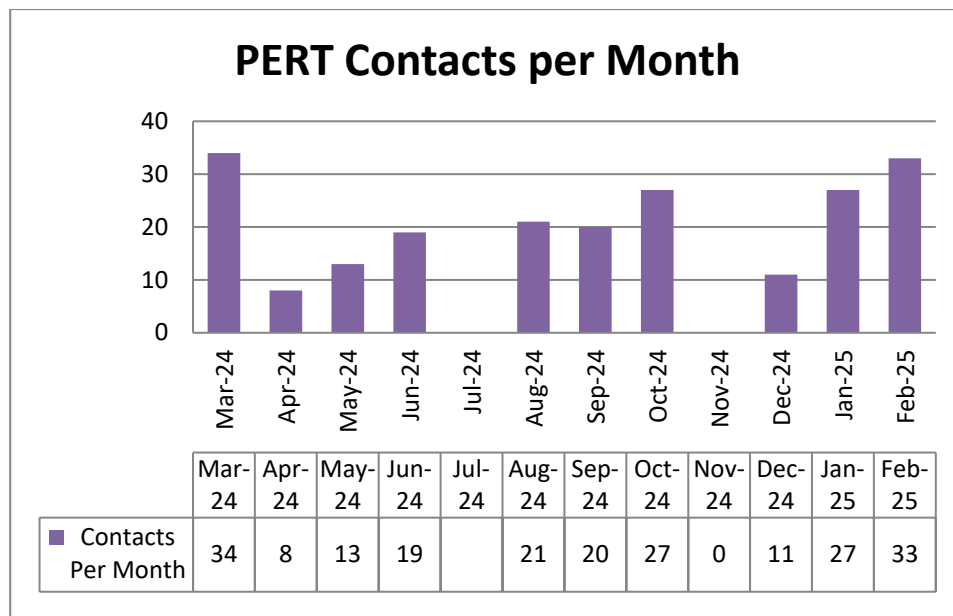


CRISIS SERVICES

Psychiatric Emergency Services (PES) (Scott Fisher and Karen Torry Green)

- **SLT:** the need for SLT Clinicians to provide coverage on WS has been greatly reduced.
- **WS:** Clinician pool is fully staffed with regular and contracted clinicians.

South Lake Tahoe Alternative Collaboration Services (STACS) (Aria Benham)

- South Lake Tahoe clinicians continue to work alongside law enforcement to support them in the field with mental health calls. Aria Benham, Matt Hazelet and Jacob Marquette presented as a panel discussion for Barton Memorial's Community Advisory Committee Meeting. This meeting invites various organizations and key players from the community to have discussions regarding current services and collaborations. The panel discussion was engaging for community members who offered valuable questions for STACS, STACS was able to share statistics on calls for service as well as mental health calls. Jacob Marquette from Barton community clinic shared how he is focusing on substance use disorders, Officer Hazelet and Dr. Marquette work closely together to reduce help reduce barriers for community members to present for substance use services. Dr. Marquette shared the importance of services that address co-occurring disorders and commended EDC BH for supporting LE in the field and connecting community to vital services.

PROGRAM ACTIVITY UPDATES

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER SERVICES (SUDS) (Shaun O'Malley)

Access Services and Treatment Services

- Outpatient Substance Use Disorder Services in South Lake Tahoe is currently serving 35 clients using both Seeking Safety and Living in Balance.

Quality Assurance

- The QA team submitted all documentation for our DHCS Network Adequacy Certification CAP to ensure compliance. The QA team had its annual compliance monitoring review with DHCS in February. It went well. We are expecting the final report in 60 days. The team is also preparing to conduct its annual monitoring of SUDS contracted providers.

Prevention

- The SUDS prevention team has been working hard with the Youth Action Council to facilitate the screening of the documentary Fentanyl High at Placerville Cinema West. The event is on March 12th and is sold out, and in addition to the documentary we are looking forward to the speakers panel and the community resource fair. SUDS Prevention has also been working on reaching out to schools and other community and non-profit organizations to address how SUDS prevention can serve those organizations and collaborate on future ideas. Our new Prevention Health Education Coordinator CJ Runyon is outreaching various community partners and learning about prevention as it applies to El Dorado County youth.

ADULT OUTPATIENT SERVICES

(Jody Kwachak-Hall (SLT); Jessica Sinnetos/Christianne Kernes (WS))

Tahoe:

- Adult Outpatient Clinicians and Mental Health Workers actively work with clients to provide MH services in the office, in clients' homes, by telephone, and by telehealth. The Clinicians and Mental Health Workers provide services in community settings.
- The Tahoe Team has developed a comprehensive Group Schedule that incorporates a broader range of interventions that are suited to the populations with whom we work.

West Slope:

- Individualized services are provided to adults, age 18 years and older, who meet criteria for Specialty Mental Health Services by a multidisciplinary team of Psychiatrists, Nurses, Psychiatric Technicians, Mental Health Clinicians, and Mental Health Workers/Aides. Services include assessments, medication evaluations and support, clinical psycho-social and co-occurring assessments, individual therapy, group therapy, and rehabilitative and case management services and supports. Services are delivered in the Clinic, in clients' place of residency, in the community or via telehealth. The West Slope has now added a few clinicians to the team and a coordinator to help streamline the outpatient services.
