VERIFICATION OF FINAL MAP CONFORMANCE WITH CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Final Subdivision Map TM-F24-0003/Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Unit No. 2 Board of Supervisors/October 22, 2024

The following are the Conditions of Approval for the Malcom Dixon Tentative Subdivision Map, TM05-1401, as approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 15, 2010, and as amended by the Planning Commission per approval of TM05-1401-R on January 10, 2013

<u>TM05-1401-R/Malcolm Dixon Road Estates</u> – As approved by the Planning Commission on January 10, 2013.

Conditions of Approval

1. This Tentative Map and Zone Change approval is based upon and limited to compliance with the project description, hearing Exhibits E-I, and Conditions of Approval set forth below. Any deviations from the project description, exhibits or conditions must be reviewed and approved by the County for conformity with this approval. Deviations may require approved changes to the permit and/or further environmental review. Deviations without the above described approval will constitute a violation of permit approval.

The project description is as follows:

The project includes a request for a Zone Change from Exclusive Agriculture (AE) to Estate Residential Five-Acre (RE-5). A Tentative Map to create 8 lots ranging in size from 5.0 acres to 5.6 acres. Access to the proposed subdivision would be from a proposed roadway connection to the south at the existing Malcolm Dixon Road extending further off-site to the south providing an additional connection to Green Valley Road. The project proposes to use public water and individual septic systems. In order for the project to be eligible for public water and fire services the property would be require annexation by LAFCO into the local water and fire districts. No Design Waivers have been requested.

This Tentative Map phasing plan approval is based upon and limited to compliance with the project description, hearing Exhibits E, F, and X, and revised Conditions of Approval set forth below. Any deviations from the project description, exhibits or conditions must be reviewed and approved by the County for conformity with this approval. Deviations may require approved changes to the permit and/or further environmental review. Deviations without the above-described approval will constitute a violation of permit approval.

The project description is as follows:

The project includes a request for a phasing plan for the previously approved Tentative Map creating 8 lots ranging in size from 5.0 acres to 5.6 acres. Phase 1 will consist of Lot

8 and Phase 2 will consist of Lots 1 through 7. Access to the approved subdivision will be from a proposed roadway connection to the south at the existing Malcolm Dixon Road extending further off-site to the south at the existing Malcolm Dixon Road extending further off-site to the south providing an additional connection to Green Valley Road. The approved Tentative Map will use public water and individual septic systems. In order for the project to be eligible for public water and fire services the property would require annexation into the local water and fire districts.

The grading, development, use, and maintenance of the property, the size, shape, arrangement, and location of structures, parking areas and landscape areas, and the protection and preservation of resources shall conform to the project description above and the hearing exhibits and conditions of approval below. The property and any portions thereof shall be sold, leased, or financed in compliance with this project description and the approved hearing exhibits and conditions of approval hereto. All plans (Tentative Subdivision Map, Preliminary Grading and Drainage Plan, Slope Map, and Oak Canopy Map) must be submitted for review and approval and shall be implemented as approved by the County.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The Project and its required improvements have been designed and are being constructed in accordance with the Conditions of Approval and department/agency approved Improvement Plans (IPs), and as documented in correspondence from the Department of Transportation (DOT) dated April 9, 2024. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

2. Prior to issuance of a building permit or commencement of any use authorized by this permit the applicant shall provide a written description, together with appropriate documentation, showing conformance of the project with each condition imposed as part of the project approval. The applicant shall also schedule an inspection by Planning Services prior to issuance of a building permit for verification of compliance with applicable conditions of approval.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The Applicant provided a letter to Planning Division dated June 4, 2024, describing compliance with the conditions of approval, as well as a binder with copies of supporting documentation. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

CONDITIONS FROM THE MITIGATED NEGATIVE DELECRATION

The following mitigation measures are required as a means to reduce potential significant environmental effects to a level of insignificance:

3. To avoid take of active raptor nests, pre-construction surveys shall be conducted by a qualified biologist no more than 30 days prior to initiation of proposed development

activities. Survey results shall then be submitted to CDFG. If active raptor nests are found on or immediately adjacent to the site, consultation shall occur with CDFG to determine appropriate avoidance measures. If no nesting is found to occur, necessary tree removal could then proceed.

Monitoring Responsibility: Planning Services

<u>Monitoring Requirement</u>: Planning Services shall ensure that adequate surveys are prepared prior to issuance of building permit.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. This condition would apply at the time of grading and/or building permit request submittal. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

4. Special status plant surveys to determine presence or absence of these species should take place in May or June. Vegetation surveys will follow protocol guidelines issued by the California Department of Fish and Game. These guidelines state that surveys for special status plants be done at the appropriate times of the year, and that all individuals observed be identified to the extent necessary to determine whether it is a special status species.

Monitoring Responsibility: Planning Services

<u>Monitoring Requirement</u>: Planning Services shall ensure that adequate surveys are prepared prior to issuance of building permit.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. This condition would apply at the time of grading and/or building permit request submittal. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

El Dorado Hills Fire Department

5. The project applicant shall provide potable water for fire protection.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Potable water and fire protection improvements were and are constructed as part of the Vineyards Phase 1 IPs and the Salmon Falls Pump Station Project, reference El Dorado Irrigation District (EID) Project No. 3049DEV. This condition would apply at the time of grading and/or building permit request submittal. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

- 6. The developer shall install Muller Dry Barrel fire hydrants conforming to the El Dorado Irrigation District specifications for the purposes of providing water for fire protection. The spacing between hydrants for this development shall not exceed 500 feet. The exact location of each hydrant shall be determined and approved by the Fire Department.
 - Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Potable water and fire protection improvements were and are constructed as part of the Vineyards Phase 1 IPs and the Salmon Falls Pump Station Project, reference EID Project No. 3049DEV. This condition would apply at the time of grading and/or building permit request submittal. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.
- 7. Each hydrant shall be painted with safety white enamel and marked in the roadway with a blue reflective marker as specified by the Fire Department and the Fire Safe Regulations to enhance nighttime visibility.
 - Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Potable water and fire protection improvements were and are constructed as part of the Vineyards Phase 1 IPs and the Salmon Falls Pump Station Project, reference EID Project No. 3049DEV. This condition would apply at the time of grading and/or building permit request submittal. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.
- 8. All access roadways and fire hydrant systems shall be installed and in service prior to filing the Final Map of any combustible members as specified by the El Dorado Hills Fire Department Standard 103.
 - Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. This is not yet due as no request has been made for issuance of a building permit for Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Phase 2. DOT and the El Dorado Hills Fire Department (EDH Fire) approval of the IPs warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.
- 9. Lots that back up to Wildland Open Space shall construct fences composed of non-combustible material, with a three foot wide gate located in accordance with Fire Department requirements to allow emergency access into the open space areas prior to finaling any building permit.
 - Staff Rationale: Condition Ongoing. This condition would apply at the time of grading and/or building permit request submittal. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

10. Driveways serving the project shall be designed to a maximum of 20% grade. Driveways exceeding the 20% grade shall install fire sprinklers per the NRPA 130 standards within the dwelling unit prior to finaling any building permit.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. This condition would apply at the time of grading and/or building permit request submittal. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

11. Any type of traffic calming device that utilizes a raised bump section of roadway is prohibited.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Traffic calming measures are not proposed. Further, the El Dorado Hills Fire Department approval of the IPs warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

12. Lots shall have a minimum setback of a minimum of 30 feet, as required by the Fire Safe Regulations.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The minimum lot setbacks are 30 feet. This condition would apply at the time of grading and/or building permit request submittal. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

13. Proper roadway access and circulation shall be provided to allow access to the site. Roadways shall be coordinated with other proposed developments in the area and designed in accordance with the Fire Department regulations.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Roadway circulation has been established from Green Valley Road through to Salmon Falls Road by the Malcom Dixon Area developments; 1) The Vineyards, 2) Malcolm Dixon Road Estates, 3) ALTO Unit 1, and 4) La Canada Phases 1, 2, and 3. All improvements have been constructed and/or bonded. The Malcolm Dixon property owners have formed the "Malcolm Dixon/Salmon Falls Road Maintenance Association". Granting Agreement recorded at Official Records 2022-0037341 dated September 16, 2022, providing for a 50-foot reciprocal road and utility easement access and provide two (2) points of access from Malcolm Dixon Road by way of Via Veritas and Rancho Cerros Drive and connecting to Salmon Falls Road. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

14. No access control devices that obstruct traffic circulation shall be installed, per State Fire Regulation Section 1273.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. This Project does not control access. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

15. A Fire Safe Plan, approved by the El Dorado Hills Fire Department, is required to be developed and implemented prior to occupancy prior to filing the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Fire Safe Plan approved by the EDH Fire Department April 4, 2024, warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

LAFCO

16. Prior to Final Map filing, the applicant shall complete the annexation process into El Dorado Irrigation District (EID) through LAFCO and submit evidence of the satisfaction of this condition to Planning Services upon completion.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. The El Dorado Irrigation District Facility Improvement Letter for extension dated March 27, 2018. Annexation into EID and the El Dorado Hills County Water District (EDH Fire), LAFCO Project No. 2013-01 approved by El Dorado LAFCO Resolution #L-2014- 03 on March 26, 2012. Payment of El Dorado Irrigation District Annexation Inclusion Fee paid April 21, 2018. See submitted El Dorado LAFCO Certification of Completion dated March 21, 2018. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

17. Prior to Final Map filing, the applicant shall complete the annexation process into El Dorado Hills Fire Department (El Dorado Hills County Water Agency) through LAFCO and submit evidence of the satisfaction of this condition to Planning Services upon completion.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. The El Dorado Irrigation District Facility Improvement Letter for extension dated March 27, 2018. Annexation into EID and the El Dorado Hills County Water District (EDH Fire); fee paid February 15, 2023, and January 31, 2024. LAFCO Project No. 2013-01 approved by El Dorado LAFCO Resolution #L-2014-03 on March 26, 2012. Payment of El Dorado Irrigation District Annexation Inclusion Fee paid April 21, 2018. See submitted El Dorado LAFCO Certification of Completion dated March 21, 2018. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

Planning Services

18. The applicant shall provide to Planning Services, a Meter Award Letter or similar document from El Dorado Irrigation District, prior to filing the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. An EID Meter Award Letter was issued September 20, 2024, for Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Unit 2 for seven (7) EDUs by EID acknowledged by Owner and provided to the Planning Division.

19. The subdivision is subject to parkland dedication in-lieu fees based on values supplied by the Assessor's Office and calculated in accordance with Section 16.12.090 of the County Code. The applicant shall pay all fees at the time of filing the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. The park in-lieu fees have been paid on May 24, 2024, as shown by receipt #071963 in the amount of \$4,410.00. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

20. The subdivider shall pay a \$150.00 appraisal fee payable to the El Dorado County Assessor for the determination of parkland dedication in-lieu fees.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Diamante Development provided a check in the amount of \$150.00 (check #101) dated February 14, 2023, for the Assessor's appraisal fee for determining the park in-lieu fees. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

21. Prior to issuance of a grading permit the applicant shall provide a written description, together with appropriate documentation, showing conformance of the project with each condition imposed as part of the project approval. The applicant shall also schedule an inspection by Planning Services if deemed necessary prior to issuance of a grading permit for verification of compliance with applicable conditions of approval.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The Applicant provided a letter to Planning Division dated June 4, 2024, describing compliance with the conditions of approval, as well as a binder with copies of supporting documentation. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

22. This Tentative Subdivision Map shall expire in 36 months from date of approval unless a timely extension has been filed.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. As stated in approval letter issued from the Planning Division dated June 20, 2023, in accordance with Subdivision Map Act Section 66452.6, it has been determined that the approved Tentative Map, TM05-1401 as approved by the Board of Supervisors June 15, 2010, qualifies for an automatic 36-month time extension associated with approval of the Large Lot Final Map for the subdivision (LLFM for Malcolm Dixon Road Estates TM) on August 6, 2013. With consideration for recordation of the Large Lot Final Map (TM05-1401-F) on August 8, 2013, the new expiration date is June 15, 2026. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

23. At time of final map filing, CC & R's shall be submitted and reviewed by Planning Services.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. CC&Rs are included with the Project. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

24. Construction activities shall be limited to the hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. during weekdays and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday. Exceptions are allowed if it can be shown that construction beyond these times is necessary to alleviate traffic congestion and safety hazards. Planning Services shall verify this requirement is placed on the Grading Plans prior to issuance of a grading permit.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Limitation of daily and weekend construction hours are shown as Note 12 under the section entitled "Standard General Notes Roadwork, Grading, and Drainage" on Sheet 2 of the DOT and the Planning Division approved IPs for Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Phase 2. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

25. In the event of any legal action instituted by a third party challenging the validity of any provision of this approval, the developer and landowner agree to be responsible for the costs of defending such suit and shall hold County harmless from any legal fees or costs County may incur as a result of such action, as provided in Section 66474.9(b) of the Government Code.

The subdivider shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless El Dorado County and its agents, officers, and employees from any claim, action, or proceeding against El Dorado County or its agents, officers, or employees to attack, set aside, void, or annul an approval of El Dorado County concerning a subdivision, which action is brought within the time period provided for in Section 66499.37.

County shall notify the subdivider of any claim, action, or proceeding and County will cooperate fully in the defense.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Acknowledged by Applicant. No other claims, actions, or proceedings are known to have been filed and the statute of limitations within which to timely file a challenge has expired. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

26. All Development Services fees shall be paid prior to recording the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. All required fees have been paid as described throughout this Verification of Conformance with Conditions of Approval

report. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

Surveyor's Office

27. All survey monuments must be set prior to the presentation of the Final Map to the Board of Supervisors for approval; or the developer shall have the surety of work to be done by bond or cash deposit. The project applicant shall ensure that verification of set survey monuments, or amount of bond or deposit are acceptable to the County Surveyor's Office.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Monument Estimate included. The Client has chosen to provide EDC with a check-in-lieu of a monumentation bond. (Ck. No. 1038 dated April 10, 2024, in the amount of \$5,000.00). Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time.

28. The applicant shall file a completed road name petition for roads serving the development with the County Surveyor's Office prior to filing the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Approved Road Name Petition for Diamante Estates/Malcolm Dixon Road Estates dated March 1, 2016, warrants compliance with this condition. Road name was grandfathered to Vineyards at El Dorado Hills and ALTO. Approved road name is "Via Veritas". Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

El Dorado County Resource Conservation District

29. Prior to grading operations, the developer shall contact the District for review of an erosion control plan. The erosion control plan must be approved by the District prior to issuance of a grading permit.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The El Dorado County Resource Conservation District (EDCRCD) has reviewed and approved the IPs as evidenced by the correspondence provided and dated March 13, 2024. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

30. Revegetation of all disturbed soils will be accomplished with approved amounts and types of vegetative species, mulch, and fertilizer materials per the "El Dorado County Erosion Control Requirements and Specifications – MLRA18." The applicant shall include these specifications as a part of the engineering drawings for the project.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. As shown on Sheet 10 of the Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Phase 2 approved IPs. Therefore, the project is consistent with this

condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

31. The applicant shall analyze the downstream drainage areas for the capacity of existing structures to adequately handle runoff created by the proposed development and problems related to erosion control. The applicant shall complete this as part of the erosion control plan.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. DOT approval of the IPs and its associated Drainage Report warrant compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

32. The applicant shall perform a hydrological analysis to assure the downstream drainage systems are adequate. The applicant shall complete this as part of the erosion control plan.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. DOT approval of the IPs and its associated Drainage Report warrant compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

California Regional Water Quality Control Board

33. The applicant shall obtain a permit for the project under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES). The applicant shall obtain the General Permit to cover this project prior to issuance of a grading permit.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) (WDID No. 5S09C403031) reflects compliance with and satisfaction of this condition. See submitted and approved IPs for Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Phase 2. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

34. The project applicant shall obtain a 401 Water Quality Certification prior to issuance of a grading permit.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. There are no fills into the Waters of the United States (WOUS) in connection with the construction of proposed improvements for this Project. A 50-foot non-building setback has been established over the natural drainages as shown the information sheet of the Final Map (FM). Lot 1 has the potential of filling into the WOUS with the construction of a driveway access that will accompany a building permit. If a fill is to be made in connection with a Lot 1 driveway access, a 404 ACOE, 401 DWR, and 1602 CDFW permit would be required. However, if Lot 1 elects to

install an "open bottom" crossing in connection with a future building permit, the only required permit is a 1602 CDFW Permit. A note consistent with this response has been added to the information sheet on the FM. Moreover, required compliance of Lot 1 with GOA 34 is identified on Sheet 11 of the approved IPs. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

El Dorado County Department of Environmental Health

- 35. Project applicant shall adhere to Rules 223, 223.1, and 223.2 during construction. The applicant shall submit a Fugitive Dust Plan Application with appropriate fees to and receive approval by the District prior to the issuance of a grading permit.
 - Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Project COAs are included on Sheet 3 of the IPs. DOT approval of the IPs warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.
- 36. Project construction shall adhere to District Rule 224 Cutback and Emulsified Asphalt Paving Materials.
 - Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Project COAs are included on Sheet 3 of the IPs. DOT approval of the IPs warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.
- 37. Burning of wastes on-site requires the applicant contact the District prior to the commencement of any burning for necessary burn permit requirements. Only vegetative waste materials are permitted to be disposed of using an open outdoor fire. Project construction shall adhere to District Rule 300 Open Burning.
 - Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Acknowledged by Applicant. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.
- 38. The project construction shall adhere to District Rule 215 Architectural Coatings.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Project COAs are included on Sheet 3 of the IPs. DOT approval of the IPs warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

El Dorado County Department of Transportation

PROJECT-SPECIFIC DOT CONDITIONS:

39. **Road Design Standards:** The applicant shall construct all roads in conformance with the Design and Improvements Standard Manual (DISM), as shown in Table 1. The improvements shall be completed to the satisfaction of the Department of Transportation (DOT) or the applicant shall obtain an approved improvement agreement with security, prior to the filing of the Final Map: (the requirements outlined in Table 1 are minimums)

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. DOT approval of the IPs coupled with the SIA and Bonds warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

40. **Multi-Project Area of Benefit:** Upon the applicant's request, the County will form and implement, at the applicant's expense, a public improvement financing district for funding or reimbursement of the costs of off-site public improvements to be constructed as identified in the Exhibit X entitled Malcolm Dixon Area Traffic Circulation Plan. The applicant shall prepare and submit for County's approval and adoption a proposed Area of Benefit and supporting Engineers Estimate and Report for the purpose of financing and reimbursement of required off-site land acquisitions, widening and (re-) construction of public improvements as may be appropriate. The proposed Area of Benefit shall include but not be limited to parcels APN: 110-020-12, 126-100-18, 19, 23, & 24. The Area of Benefit Engineer's Report shall be prepared and submitted and the proposed public financing district formed prior to the filing of the Final Map. For development projects within the proposed public financing district Area of Benefit, County shall require consent by the land owner to the public financing district and participation in the

funding or reimbursement and/or construction of the off-site public improvements for Malcolm Dixon Area Traffic Circulation Plan on a pro rata share of residential lots or equivalent share basis as a condition of approval. For development projects which may derive benefit from the public improvements to be constructed as part of the Malcolm Dixon Area Traffic Circulation Plan, County shall require participation in the funding and reimbursement and/or construction of the off-site public improvements for Malcolm Dixon Area Traffic Circulation Plan on a pro rata share of residential lots or equivalent share basis as a condition of project approval.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Condition satisfied by construction of the Malcolm Dixon Road - Multi Project Area of Benefit. Construction of this improvement was performed under a Road Improvement Agreement (AGMT#19-54910) and its associated bonds. All work has been completed and accepted by the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors as of May 21, 2024. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

41. **Area of Benefit Improvements:** The following Area of Benefit Improvements are required of all projects party to the Area of Benefit. This project's proportional share and financial responsibility for these improvements shall be determined by the Engineer's Report. These improvements shall be completed to the satisfaction of DOT prior to filing of the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. All work has been completed and accepted by the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors as of May 21, 2024. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

42. **Offer of Dedication, Interior Roads:** Developer shall irrevocably offer to dedicate in fee, a 50-foot-wide road and public utilities easement that extends from the southern boundary line to the northern boundary line (to provide access to development beyond) as determined by EDC DOT, and for all other onsite roadways, prior to the filing of the map. Slope easements shall be included as necessary. This offer will be rejected by the County.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Road is shown and offered on the Final Map. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

43. **Encroachment Permit:** The applicant shall obtain an encroachment permit from DOT and shall construct the roadway encroachment from the access roadway onto Malcolm-Dixon Road to the provisions of County Design Std 103D. The improvements shall be completed to the satisfaction of the Department of Transportation or the applicant shall obtain an approved improvement agreement with security, prior to the filing of the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Previous construction of Vineyards Phase 1 (TM16-1528) obtained an encroachment permit, and the work was completed and accepted by the County. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

44. **Off-site Access Easements:** The applicant shall provide proof of access to the project site from a State or County maintained road. Said proof shall guarantee access for this site to use the proposed offsite roadways to the south and east and shall be provided by and through a "Map Guarantee" which shall be submitted to the County Surveyor's Office with the first map check for the map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. The Malcolm Dixon property owners have formed the "Malcolm Dixon/Salmon Falls Road Maintenance Association". Granting Agreement recorded at Official Records 2022-0037341 dated September 16, 2022, providing for 50-foot reciprocal road and utility easement access and provide two (2) points of access from Malcolm Dixon Road by way of Via Veritas and Rancho Cerros Drive and connecting to Salmon Falls Road. The Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Phase 2 FM has been submitted to the County Surveyor for their review and approval. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

45. **Reciprocal Access Agreement:** The applicant shall provide a reciprocal access agreement, signed by the adjoining property owners, guaranteeing access for this site to use the proposed off-site roadways from this project to Salmon Falls Road, prior to the

filing of the map. This agreement shall also allow the adjoining landowners to use the onsite roads to access Malcolm Dixon Road.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. The Grants of Reciprocal Access Easements document between the four (4) Malcolm Dixon/Salmon Falls Development Area property owners was recorded on September 25, 2019, as DOC-2019-0040285-00 in satisfaction of this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

46. **Turnaround:** The applicant shall provide a turn around at the end of the onsite roadways to the provisions of County Standard Plan 114 or approved equivalent. The improvements shall be completed to the satisfaction of the Department of Transportation or the applicant shall obtain an approved improvement agreement with security, prior to the filing of the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Not applicable. The Malcolm Dixon/Salmon Falls Road Maintenance Association granting Agreement recorded at Official Records 2022-0037341 dated September 16, 2022, providing for 50-foot reciprocal road and utility easement access provides two (2) points of access from Malcolm Dixon Road by way of Via Veritas and Rancho Cerros Drive and connecting to Salmon Falls Road thus eliminating the need for a turn-around. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

47. **Roadway Slopes:** Pursuant to DISM Sec 3.B.9 and Design Std Plan 101B, the gradient of any street shall not exceed 15%. Roadway slopes shall be indicated on the improvement plans to show compliance with this requirement.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The maximum roadway grade is less than 9.5%. DOT approval of the IPs warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

48. **Off-site Easements:** Applicant shall provide all necessary recorded easements for the drainage, slope and road improvements crossing the property line prior to approval of the improvement plans.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The Malcolm Dixon property owners have formed the "Malcolm Dixon/Salmon Falls Road Maintenance Association". Granting Agreement recorded at Official Records 2022-0037341 dated September 16, 2022, providing for 50-foot reciprocal road and utility easement access and provide two (2) points of access from Malcolm Dixon Road by way of Via Veritas and Rancho Cerros Drive and connecting to Salmon Falls Road. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

49. **Maintenance Entity:** The proposed project must form an entity for the maintenance of any shared or common: private roads, parking facilities, landscaping, signs and drainage facilities. If there is an existing entity, the property owner shall modify the document if the current document does not sufficiently address maintenance of the roads, parking facilities, landscaping, signs, and drainage facilities of the current project. DOT shall review the document forming the entity to ensure the provisions are adequate prior to filing of the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The Malcolm Dixon AOB property owners have formed the "Malcolm Dixon/Salmon Falls Road Maintenance Association". Granting Agreement recorded at Official Records 2022-0037341 dated September 16, 2022, providing for 50-foot reciprocal road and utility easement access and provide two (2) points of access from Malcolm Dixon Road by way of Via Veritas and Rancho Cerros Drive and connecting to Salmon Falls Road. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

50. **Driveway Cuts:** Subdivision improvements shall include rough grading of driveways for all lots with street cuts or fills along the frontage of six feet or more difference in elevation, or as found necessary for reasonable access by the County Engineer. Construction of said driveways shall conform to the Design and Improvements Standards Manual and the Encroachment Ordinance. Attention should be given to the minimum required sight distance at all driveway encroachments. As an alternative, a Notice of Restriction shall be filed against all downhill lots with fill in excess of 6 feet which allows structural driveway access only.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. There are no cases where driveway cuts or fills will exceed 6 feet. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

Solution of the final map to the Planning Director before presentation of the final map to the Board of Supervisors for its approval. For improvements not completed, the subdivider shall provide a 100 percent performance surety and a 50 percent labor and materialmen surety by separate bond, cash deposit, assignment, or letter of credit from a financial institution. For improvements which have been completed, the subdivider shall provide a ten percent maintenance surety in any of the above-mentioned forms. Verification of construction, or partial construction, and cost of completion shall be determined by the County Department of Transportation. The developer shall pay the traffic impact fees in effect at the time a building permit is issued for any parcel created by the subdivision.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. An SIA has been signed by the Owner and the Subdivision Bonds have posted. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time.

DOT STANDARD CONDITIONS

52. **Improvement Plans and Cost Estimate:** The developer shall obtain approval of project improvement plans and cost estimates consistent with the Subdivision Design and Improvement Standards Manual from the County Department of Transportation, and pay all applicable fees prior to filing of the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. DOT, the Planning Division, EID, and EDH Fire Department have approved the IPs. An SIA has been signed and bonds have been posted. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

53. **Easements:** All applicable existing and proposed easements shall be shown on the project plans.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. All applicable easements are shown on the IPs that has been approved by the DOT. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

54. **Road & Public Utility Easements:** The applicant shall provide a 50 foot wide non-exclusive road and public utility easement for the on-site access roadway prior to the filing of the map. Slope easements shall be included as necessary.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Said easements are shown and dedicated on the FM thus warranting compliance. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

55. **Signage:** The applicant shall install all necessary signage such as stop signs, street name signs, and/or "not a county maintained road" road sign as required by the Department of Transportation prior to the filing of the map. The signing and striping shall be designed and constructed per the latest version of the Manual Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) and the California Supplement.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. DOT approval of the IPs warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

56. **Common Fence/Wall Maintenance:** The responsibility for, and access rights for, maintenance of any fences and walls constructed on property lines shall be included in the Covenants Codes and Restrictions (CC&Rs).

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Responsibility for, and access rights for, maintenance of any fences and walls constructed on property lines are included in the CC&Rs, specifically Article 7. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

57. **Water Quality Stamp:** All new or reconstructed drainage inlets shall have a storm water quality message stamped into the concrete, conforming to the Storm Water Quality Design Manual for the Sacramento and South Placer Regions, Chapter 4, Fact Sheet SD-1. All stamps shall be approved by the El Dorado County inspector prior to being used.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. There are no drainage inlets proposed. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

58. **Construction Hours:** Construction activities shall be conducted in accordance with the County Health, Safety, and Noise Element and limited to the daylight hours between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on any weekday, and 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on weekends and federal holidays.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Limitation of daily and weekend construction hours are shown as Note 12 under the section entitled "Standard General Notes Roadwork, Grading, and Drainage" on Sheet 2 of the DOT and the Planning Division approved IPs for Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Phase 2. This warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

59. **DISM Consistency:** The developer shall obtain approval (as modified by these conditions herein) of project improvement plans and cost estimates consistent with the Subdivision Design and Improvement Standards Manual (dated May 1986, revised May 1990), from the County Department of Transportation, and pay all applicable fees prior to filing of the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Attention is directed to the DOT approved IPs and the SIA. DOT approval of the IPs coupled with the SIA and its associated bonding warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

60. **Road Improvement Agreement & Security:** The developer shall enter into a Road Improvement Agreement (RIA) with the Department of Transportation for all roadway, frontage, and intersection improvements. The developer shall complete the improvements to the satisfaction of DOT or provide security to guarantee performance of the RIA as set forth within the County of El Dorado Subdivision Division Ordinance, prior to filing of the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Diamante Development, LLC (and the Malcolm Dixon AOB property owners) have entered into and bonded the Malcolm Dixon Area of Benefit AGMT 19-54910 Offsite Road Improvement Agreement Malcolm Dixon TM05-1401-E, TM06-1408, TM06-1421-E, and TM08-1463 (2019) for offsite improvements to the Malcolm Dixon Road public road. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

61. **Import/Export Grading Permit:** Any import, or export to be deposited or borrowed within El Dorado County, shall require an additional grading permit for that offsite grading.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. There is no import or export of material from the project site. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

62. **Grading Permit / Plan:** If more than 50 cubic yards of earth movement are required for improvements, the applicant shall submit a site improvement/grading plan prepared by a professional civil engineer to the Department of Transportation for review and approval. The plan shall be in conformance with the County of El Dorado "Design and Improvement Standards Manual", the "Grading, Erosion and Sediment Control Ordinance", the "Drainage Manual", the "Off-Street Parking and Loading Ordinance", and the State of California Handicapped Accessibility Standards. All applicable plan check and inspection fees shall be paid at the time of submittal of improvement plans. The improvements and grading shall be completed to the satisfaction of DOT prior to occupancy clearance.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Attention is directed to the plans for the Geotechnical Engineering Study for LaBarbera Subdivision; Project No. E21522.000 dated March 2022; Over-excavation and Re-compaction of Fill and Loose Native Soils, and Engineered Fill Criteria. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

63. **Grading Plan Review:** Grading and improvement plans shall be prepared and submitted to the El Dorado County Resource Conservation District (RCD) and the Department of Transportation. The RCD shall review and make appropriate recommendations to the

County. Upon receipt of the review report by the RCD, the Department of Transportation shall consider imposition of appropriate conditions for reducing or mitigating erosion and sedimentation from the project. Grading plans shall incorporate appropriate erosion control measures as provided in the El Dorado County Grading Ordinance and El Dorado County Storm Water Management Plan. Appropriate runoff controls such as berms, storm gates, detention basins, overflow collection areas, filtration systems, and sediment traps shall be implemented to control siltation, and the potential discharge of pollutants into drainages.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. The EDCRCD has reviewed and approved the IPs as evidenced by the correspondence provided and dated March 13, 2024. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

64. **RCD Coordination:** The timing of construction and method of revegetation shall be coordinated with the El Dorado County Resource Conservation District (RCD). If grading activities are not completed by September, the developer shall implement a temporary grading and erosion control plan. Such temporary plans shall be submitted to the RCD for review and recommendation to the Department of Transportation. The Department of Transportation shall approve or conditionally approve such plans and cause the developer to implement said plan on or before October 15.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Temporary Erosion Control Plans are now included with the SWPPP. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

65. **Soils Report:** At the time of the submittal of the grading or improvement plans, the applicant shall submit a soils and geologic hazards report (meeting the requirements for such reports provided in the El Dorado County Grading Ordinance) to, and receive approval from the El Dorado County Department of Transportation. Grading design plans shall incorporate the findings of detailed geologic and geotechnical investigations and address, at a minimum, grading practices, compaction, slope stability of existing and proposed cuts and fills, erosion potential, ground water, pavement section based on TI and R values, and recommended design criteria for any retaining walls.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Attention is directed to the plans for the Geotechnical Engineering Study for LaBarbera Subdivision; Project No. E21522.000 dated March 2022, which warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

66. **Drainage Study / SWMP Compliance:** The applicant shall provide a drainage report at time of improvement plans or grading permit application, consistent with the Drainage

Manual and the Storm Water Management Plan, which addresses storm water runoff increase, impacts to downstream facilities and properties, and identification of appropriate storm water quality management practices to the satisfaction of the Department of Transportation.

The Drainage Study must demonstrate the subject property has adequate existing and proposed storm drainage facilities. At a minimum, the drainage study, plans, and calculations shall include the following:

- a. The site can be adequately drained;
- b. The development of the site will not cause problems to nearby properties, particularly downstream sites;
- c. The on-site drainage will be controlled in such a manner as to not increase the downstream peak flow more than the pre-development 10-year storm event or cause a hazard or public nuisance. Detention shall be required if said condition is not met or demonstrate that there are no downstream impacts.
- d. The ultimate drainage outfall of the project.

Pursuant to Section 1.8.3 of the Drainage Manual, the report shall be prepared by a Civil Engineer who is registered in the State of California. A Scoping Meeting for the required drainage study between County staff and the engineer shall occur prior to the first submittal of improvement plans. The engineer shall bring a watershed map and any other existing drainage system information to the Scoping Meeting. The improvements shall be completed to the approval of the Department of Transportation prior to the filing of the final map or the applicant shall obtain an approved improvement agreement with security.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. DOT approval of the IPs warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

67. **Drainage (Cross-Lot):** Cross lot drainage shall be avoided. When concentrated cross lot drainage does occur or when the natural sheet flow drainage is increased by the project, it shall be contained within dedicated drainage easements, and included in the County Service Area Zone of Benefit (ZOB), Home Owners Association, or other entity acceptable to the County. Any variations shall be approved by the County Engineer. This drainage shall be conveyed via closed conduit or v-ditch, to either a natural drainage course of adequate size or an appropriately sized storm drain system within the public roadway. The site plans shall show drainage easements for all on-site drainage facilities. Drainage easements shall be provided where deemed necessary prior to the filing of the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. All of the lots drain primarily to the natural drainage ways that are protected by a 50-foot setback. Any cross-lot drainage is natural drainage. The Drainage Maintenance Areas drain to individual Bioretention/Hydro-modification basins that are constructed on each proposed lot to mitigate up to 12,500 sf of impervious area per lot. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

68. **Drainage Easements:** Pursuant to Section 4.D of the DISM, the site plans shall show drainage easements for all on-site drainage courses and facilities and shall be included on all improvement plans and/or on the Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. Drainage easements are shown on the Final Map. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

69. **NPDES Permit:** At the time that an application is submitted for improvement plans or a grading permit, and if the proposed project disturbs more than one acre of land area (43,560 square feet), the applicant shall file a "Notice of Intent" (NOI) to comply with the Statewide General NPDES Permit for storm water discharges associated with construction activity with the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB). This condition is mandated by the Federal Clean Water Act and the California Water Code. A filing form, a filing fee, a location map, and a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) are required for this filing. A copy of the Application shall be submitted to the County, prior to building permit issuance, and by state law must be done prior to commencing construction.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. SWPPP (WDID No. 5S09C403031) reflects compliance with and satisfaction of this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

70. **Off-site Improvements (Security):** Prior to the filing of a final map or parcel map, the applicant shall enter into an agreement pursuant to Government Code Section 66462.5 to complete the required offsite improvements, including the full costs of acquiring any real property interests necessary to complete the required improvements. In addition to the agreement, the applicant shall provide a cash deposit, letter of credit, or other acceptable surety in the amount sufficient to pay such costs, including legal costs, subject to the approval of County Counsel.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. This condition is satisfied by the construction of the Malcolm Dixon Road-Multi Project Area of Benefit. Construction of this improvement was performed under a Road Improvement Agreement (AGMT#19-54910) and its associated bonds. All work has been completed and accepted by the El Dorado County

Board of Supervisors on May 21, 2024. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

- 71. Off-site Improvements (Acquisition): As specified in the Conditions of Approval, the applicant is required to perform off-site improvements. If it is determined that the applicant does not have or cannot secure sufficient title or interest of such lands where said off-site improvements are required, the County may, at the applicant's expense and within 120 days of filing the Final Map, acquire by negotiation or commence proceedings to acquire an interest in the land which will permit the improvements to be made, including proceedings for immediate possession of the property. In such cases, prior to filing of any final map, the applicant shall submit the following to the Department of Transportation Right of Way Unit, and enter into an agreement pursuant to Government Code Section 66462.5 and provide acceptable security to complete the offsite improvements, including costs of acquiring real property interest to complete the required improvements, construction surveying, construction management and a 20% contingency:
 - a. A legal description and plat, of the land necessary to be acquired to complete the offsite improvements, prepared by a civil engineer or land surveyor.
 - b. Approved improvement plans and specifications of the required off-site improvements, prepared by a civil engineer.
 - c. An appraisal prepared by a certified appraiser of the cost of land necessary to complete the off-site improvements.

In addition to the agreement the applicant shall provide a cash deposit, letter of credit, or other acceptable surety in an amount sufficient to pay such costs including legal costs subject to the approval of County Counsel.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Not applicable as all Right of Way (ROW) have been obtained. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

72. **Electronic Documentation:** Upon completion of the improvements required, and prior to acceptance of the improvements by the County, the developer will provide a CD to DOT with the drainage report, structural wall calculations, and geotechnical reports in PDF format and the record drawings in TIF format.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Construction and inspection/acceptance of all proposed offsite and onsite improvements and their associated bonds warrants compliance with this condition. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition.

73. **TIM Fees:** The applicant shall pay the traffic impact mitigation fees in effect at the time a building permit is deemed complete.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied and ongoing. This condition would apply at the time

of grading and/or building permit request submittal. Therefore, the project is consistent with this condition at this time. Further confirmation of consistency would occur during grading and/or building permit review.

74. **Gate Locations:** Pursuant to Article 2, Section 1273.11 of the SRA Fire Safe Regulations, all gates providing access from a road to a driveway shall be located at least 30 feet from the roadway and shall open to allow a vehicle to stop without obstructing traffic on that road. Gate entrances shall be at least two feet wider than the width of the traffic lane(s) serving that gate. Additionally, proposed gates shall meet the El Dorado Hills Fire Protection District Gate Standard B-002.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Gates to be constructed under Building Permit #374738 and Administrative Permit, ADM24-0056. The gates serve multiple subdivisions, including Vineyards, Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Unit No.1 and Unit No.2, Alto Unit 1 and Alto Unit 2, and Pinnacle La Canada. The project is consistent with this condition.

75. **Gate Turnarounds:** All gates shall be designed and constructed with turnarounds acceptable to the Department of Transportation and the El Dorado Hills Fire Protection District. The improvements shall be completed to the satisfaction of the Department of Transportation or the applicant shall obtain an approved improvement agreement, with security, prior to the filing of the Phase 2 Final Map.

Staff Rationale: Condition satisfied. Gates to be constructed under Building Permit #374738 and Administrative Permit, ADM24-0056. The gates serve multiple subdivisions, including Vineyards, Malcolm Dixon Road Estates Unit No.1 and Unit No.2, Alto Unit 1 and Alto Unit 2, and Pinnacle La Canada. The project is consistent with this condition.
