MISSION STATEMENT

EDSWAC's Origins

- •Established in 1992 by El Dorado County Board of Supervisors resolution
- •Created in response to AB 939 (California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989)
- •Formed to help county meet state-mandated waste diversion targets

AB 939 Framework

- •Required counties to develop Integrated Waste Management Plans
- •Set diversion targets: 25% by 1995, 50% by 2000
- •Did not specifically mandate advisory committees, but many jurisdictions created them

EDSWAC's Continuing Role

- •Monitors implementation of County Solid Waste Management Plan
- •Adapts to evolving waste legislation (AB 341, AB 1826, SB 1383)
- •Reviews waste management proposals and contracts
- •Evaluates program effectiveness and facility needs
- •Supports county in meeting diversion (%) and pounds per person per day (ppd) rates
