I'm happy to hear that the County and EDCOE are being collaborative and innovative in coming up with ideas to help out EDCOE employees with children during this crisis. Are County employees' children a part of this discussion as well?

County employees have been deemed essential since the beginning of the COVID19 crisis. I know a lot of other parents that are County employees in the same boat as myself, but my situation as a single parent with my children nearly 100% of the month and no formal daycare available for the days my two sons are distance learning, is extremely troublesome financially and emotionally. The waitlist for both EDCOE Extended Day and Boys and Girls Club are full. In the mean time, I have to pay a hefty amount for childcare/tutor, or take time off, and as a single parent with no family in the vicinity, this has been extremely difficult with demands to return to work.

I urge the County to work with EDCOE to come up with a similar solution for County employees as they have done for the high school employees. This would result in more employees being able to return to work which benefits the County by reducing backlogs and ensuring services are provided that the taxpayers expect and deserve. Please help out your struggling parents.
