


Good morning Mr. Hintz,

My name is Karen Lienert and I am representing T-Mobile for the five year use permit review at Skyline Drive. I wanted to reach out to you and thank you for the recent site photo you provided. I was quite surprised to see the difference from the 2014 photo. I have been working on this project for some time and until I saw your photo I was unaware the tower had been repainted. The control of the tower was turned over to Crown Castle by T-Mobile. This is done fairly routinely in the wireless industry to allow wireless carriers to focus on their primary business of providing service to our customers while allowing the tower companies to focus on their business of leasing and maintaining towers. Crown Castle made a determination that the site was not in compliance with FAA regulations and repainted the tower, however they did not discuss this with T-Mobile.

What I will be proposing to the Planning Commission tomorrow is that T-Mobile will make an application for deviation to the FAA to at a minimum return the site to the original paint with the bottom portion of the pole being painted a dark or earth tone color and only the top portion being painted red and white. We will apply for a deviation from the red and white all together however it will be at the discretion of the FAA whether or not to approve the deviation. As you know this site is in the direct line with the South Lake Tahoe Airport and flight safety is a number one priority, however due to the height of the trees we should have a good argument to eliminate the painting if we maintain the lights. T-Mobile is prepared to repaint the pole to the least obtrusive color scheme that the FAA will approve.
