AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 5211, INCLUDING REPEAL OF CHAPTER 8.68 OF TITLE 8 OF THE EL DORADO COUNTY ORDINANCE CODE, RELATED TO THE REGULATION OF TOBACCO RETAILERS

AND ESTABLISHMENT OF A TOBACCO RETAIL LICENSE

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Repeal of Ordinance No. 5211 and Chapter 8.68 of the Ordinance Code.

Ordinance No. 5211, entitled "An Ordinance Adopting a New Chapter 8.68 to Title 8 to Regulate Tobacco Retailers For All Purposes Within the Unincorporated Areas of the County of El Dorado and Establish a Tobacco Retail License and Repeal Urgency Ordinances 5192 and 5197," is hereby repealed in its entirety, including repeal of Chapter 8.68 of Title 8 of the El Dorado County Ordinance Code entitled "Tobacco Retailers."

Section 2. Adoption of this Ordinance is Not a Project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

This Ordinance is not a "project" within the meaning of Public Resources Code Section 21065 and CEQA Guidelines Sections 15060(c)(2) and 15378 because the repeal of regulations of tobacco retailers do not have the potential of resulting in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment.

Section 3: Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 4. Effective Date.

Pursuant to California Government Code Section 25123, this ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the date of final passage.
