

El Dorado County Oak Resources Conservation Ordinance Update (Title 130, Chapter 130.39)

Objectives

- Clarify applicability for public lands
- Update "Heritage Tree" definition for multi-trunk trees
- Clarify in-lieu fees for oak woodlands vs. individual trees
- Clarify mitigation security deposit process
- Review personal use and single-family parcel exemptions
- Consider standalone oak removal permit for all oak-related impacts
- Include impacts from septic and similar permits

Background

January 2025 - Board Workshop

- Supported amendments
- Directed staff to explore new exemptions

June 2025 - Board Informational Update

 Directed staff to not pursue additional exemptions now and to expedite amendments as is

July 2025 - Planning Commission Hearing

 Recommended Board approve the amendments, EIR Addendum, and ORMP updates as presented

Proposed Exemptions for Oak Tree Removal

Permit exemptions

- · Less than 6" DBH in size
- Damaged by natural disasters
- Defensible space activities
- County road projects
- Public utility construction/maintenance
- Mitigation exemptions
 - · Insurance-required tree removal
 - · Personal use
 - · Dead, dying, or diseased trees

Summary of Proposed Oak Amendments

- Ordinance exemption for County projects
- Updates for consistency with State/County laws
- Clarify mitigation fee calculation/methodology
- Remove exemption for existing parcels that cannot be subdivided
- Update definition of "Heritage Tree" to resolve measurement challenges with multi-trunked trees
- Administrative permits for all development activities impacting oaks
- Clarifications for ease of use

Summary of Proposed Urgency Amendments

- Adopt exemption language for fire safe activities
- Add exemption for removal of hazardous vegetation
- Add exemption for insurance-required oak removal
- Effective Date: immediately upon Board adoption
