2015-2016 Area of Focus

We studied the Senior Survey that was taken by 561 high school seniors last year.

The goal of the survey was to find the areas of the most interest and/or concerns of our youth. The survey results emphasized many positives for the youth of El Dorado County. We are very proud of all that is offered, and that thousands of children are benefiting from the many, and varied, programs each year.

What we decided to focus on was Youth Services. Our county has many services directly related to youth. However, the results of the survey show that many of our youth are struggling with how, and where, to find assistance. Given that these services are part of our county, we thought that we could develop another link for our youth to find the help that they need.

We started researching the organizations in the county that specifically assisted youth. Our goal is to develop a website through the El Dorado County Office of Education that contains these services, and links them directly to that organization. Since this is still in the development stage, next year's Youth Commission will be looking to work closely with the youth services in our county and El Dorado County Office of Education to make this website known, and user friendly.

Pasta Dinner

We hosted the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors, and the El Dorado County Office of Education, to a dinner of tasty pasta dishes while we got to know each other and share ideas.

Youth PhotoVoice Workshop

We were priveledged to take part in a "Health Through My Eyes" (HTME) PhotoVoice Project developed by the El Dorado County Health & Human Services Agency. The trainers were Kristine Oase Guth and Lesley Coovelis from the El Dorado County Health & Human Services Public Health Division.

PhotoVoice is the process by which youth capture and record their life experiences, and community, through photography and stories. The "HTME" PhotoVoice Interactive Workshop is specifically related to what contributes to good or poor health in El Dorado County. PhotoVoice also includes group discussions about the photographs and what they mean. The photographs and stories are presented to the community in order to spark interest and raise awareness from the youth perspective.

The Youth Commissioners took pictures around their communities that contribute to good or poor health. These pictures and stories became the focus of discussion, and will be included in El Dorado County Health's Community Health Assessment and Community Showcase.
