



RESOLUTION NO. 051-2020

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO

WHEREAS, Health and Safety Code section 101080 authorizes a local health officer to declare a local health emergency in the health officer's jurisdiction, or any part thereof, whenever the health officer reasonably determines that there is an imminent and proximate threat of the introduction of any contagious, infectious, or communicable disease, chemical agent, con-communicable biologic agent, toxin, or radioactive agent; and

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, the County's Health Officer declared a local health emergency based on an imminent and proximate threat to public health from the introduction of a novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in the County of El Dorado; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors hereby finds that there continues to exist an imminent and proximate threat to public health from the introduction of COVID-19 in the County of El Dorado for reasons set forth in the declaration of local health emergency by the County's Health Officer, dated March 12, 2020, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors for the County of El Dorado does hereby ratify the local health emergency declared by the County's Health Officer on March 12, 2020, which shall continue in effect until terminated by the Board of Supervisors.


