



RESOLUTION NO.

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO ESTABLISHING PARKING REGULATIONS IN THE CAMERON PARK LIBRARY PARKING LOT

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Vehicle Code sections 21113 and 22519 local agencies are authorized to prohibit, restrict, or regulate parking of vehicles in any off-street parking facility owned or operated by the local agency; and

WHEREAS, the installation of electric vehicle charging stations, the trend of using the library parking lot to park extra vehicles for extended periods of time and the minimal number of parking stalls of a shared lot with the Cameron Park Community Center has impacted available parking for library patrons; and

WHEREAS, during the school year, the library parking lot is being used as an alternative off-site area for student drop-off and pick-up, resulting in a large volume of vehicles parking and driving through the parking lot creating unsafe conditions and traffic hazards, groups of unsupervised children loitering and congregating outside the library hampering access to the library entrance, and disruption to library services with library staff having to monitor vehicular traffic for parking control and safety; and

WHEREAS, in order to protect the public health, safety and welfare, it is necessary to establish regulations concerning the proper use of the Cameron Park Library parking lot.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of El Dorado as follows:

1. **Overnight Parking.** No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle in the Cameron Park Library parking lot, located at 2500 Country Club Drive, Cameron Park, California between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. of any day, except as otherwise authorized by the Library Director, or designee.
2. **Additional Regulations.** No person shall stop, park, or leave standing any vehicle in the library parking area for loading or unloading of students during drop-off/pick-up times on school days.
3. **Posting of Signs.** The Library Director is authorized to cause appropriate signs to be posted giving notice of the restrictions established herein.
4. **Enforcement.** A violation of these restrictions shall be deemed an infraction under the provisions of California Vehicle Code section 42001. In addition, vehicles improperly parked
