



Public-Private Partnership of Success

- Child Advocates of El Dorado County (CASA)
 - 22 year history of success & measurable results
 - Recruit, screen, train and support 150 Advocates; serve 300+ kids
 - CASA Advocates = Better Outcomes
 - 50% less recidivism
 - 50% less likely to experience long-term foster care
 - Reduced number of foster placements
 - Better in school performance & conduct
 - 98% do NOT re-experience abuse or neglect

Public-Private Partnership Success

- Local recidivism study done in 2014
- CASA rate of 6% mirrors national cited studies
 - Half as many kids reenter foster care
- Program perspective
 - Based on 350 kids served = \$1.3M savings
 - \$700,000 volunteer services value
 - \$2M per year savings on these 2 factors
 - Entire CASA program cost \$550K













2014/15 Contract = 50 Children

Who are they?

- Newborn to 21 years old
- > 75% < **10** years old
- 70% Western Slope
- > 30% Tahoe Basin
- 76% Caucasian
- 14% Hispanic
- > 3% Black
- 2% Native American
- 2% Asian
- > 3% Other



Circumstances

- ➤ 88% Suffered Neglect
- > 7% Physical Abuse
- 1% Sexual Abuse
- > 80% Drugs core family issue
- 20% Second or third time detained by the court
- > 50% Multiple placements
- > 25-30% Placed outside county
- > 70% Mental health issue
- One or both parents incarcerated











Why CASA?



- Mandate: Federal, State W&I Code & Local Rule of Law
- 400+ counties across the US
- Alignment of values: Safe & permanent home for 50 additional kids
 - Goals of County: Improved efficiency through CBO partnership
 - \$210,000 Return on investment though reduced recidivism
- Long term prevention & cost avoidance:
 - Keep kids out of jail & institutions: 70% of CA prison population!
 - 1/3 of these kids will commit abuse and neglect with their own kids
 - 80% meet diagnostic criteria for significant mental health issues











H&HS: Needs Our Partnership Increased!

- El Dorado County
 - Out of synch with positive state Child Welfare trends
 - 10 Year **new entry** trend: California (10%) ED County 0%
 - Once we get them in the system, we are below state averages when it comes to:
 - Keeping them in stable placements
 - Placing them close to their homes
 - Minimizing the number that are placed in Group Homes
 - Maximize the number in Kinship Care
