## A. The good/service requested is restricted to one supplier for the reason stated below:

1. Why is the acquisition restricted to this goods/services supplier? (Explain why the acquisition cannot be competitively sourced. Explain how the supplier is the only source for the acquisition.)

HHSA BHD contracts with as many qualified vendors as possible to provide the highest level of residential psychiatric care to Medi-Cal beneficiaries residing in El Dorado County (County). This includes licensed Adult Residential Facilities (ARF) for adults with SMI. Because the need for these services far outweighs the availability of beds, qualified vendors are not anticipated to respond to any competitive solicitation released by BHD.

2. Provide the background of events leading to this acquisition.

On behalf of the County, BHD contracts with the State as the Medi-Cal Mental Health Plan (MHP). As the MHP, per Welfare and Institutions Code (WIC) Section 5600 et seq., 14000 et seq., and 17000 et seq, BHD has an obligation to provide eligible County residents with mental health services, including long-term, adult residential facility placements when clinically appropriate. BHD has been contracting with Compassion Pathway for the provision of residential mental health services since April 2022 because specialty skills are not expressly identified in County classifications are required for the performance of this work, and the County does not have the staff or facilities to provide residential mental health services.

3. Describe the uniqueness of the acquisition. (Why was the goods/services supplier chosen?)

The fiscal year (FY) 2024-2025 MHSA Annual Update includes a provision for the operation of an ARF within El Dorado County (Legistar file 24-0832). The intention of this provision is to close a significant gap in the County's adult mental health system of care. The Carlson Springs ARF, licensed by the state of California to provide long-term, residential services to adults with SMI, will be the only contracted ARF located within the County.

4. What are the consequences of not purchasing the goods/services or contracting with the proposed supplier?

If the County chooses not to contract with Compassion Pathway for this facility, BHD will not have access to an ARF located within county lines. As a result, up to ten (10) BHD clients currently placed in an out-of-county residential facility will be unable to return home, and future clients in need of ARF services will continue to be placed out-of-county. Importantly, without this contract, the County will continue to have diminished capacity to step eligible clients down from higher, more expensive levels of care. Frequently, BHD clients who are ready to transition to a lower level of care often find themselves either unable to transition from higher levels of care due to the absence of an appropriate facility, or return to the community before they are ready for independent living.

Importantly, because the Carlson is ARF is located so close to the BHD clinic, contracting with this facility will allow County staff to cantly increase the number of Medi-Cal billable services provided to clients placed at this facility, in increased revenue.

2. Describe any cost savings or avoidance realized (one-time or ongoing) by acquiring the goods/services from this supplier.

Contracting with the Carlson Springs ARF will save costs by allowing BHD clients that have been unable to be discharged from higher, more expensive levels of care due to the lack of an appropriate facility, to step down. Additionally, each time a beneficiary with SMI returns to acute inpatient care, incarceration or homelessness, County costs rise. The Carlson Springs ARF will close a critical gap in County's adult mental health system of care and save costs by providing the supportive living environment BHD clients coming out of acute, inpatient settings require in order to successfully move towards community living.
