

Revenue Sources

Pesticide Mill

▶ The mill assessment on pesticide products is 21 mills (0.021) per dollar sales for all sales of registered pesticides for use in CA. Funds allocated to each county is based on set criteria in regulation and each county's pest control activities, costs and workload.

Unclaimed Gas Tax Fund

▶ A number of years ago Cal Trans, with the Air Resources Board, developed a formula to estimate the amount of taxed gasoline used by Agriculture and Landscapers. Taxes that are not claimed for refunds are distributed to the CA Department of Food and Agriculture to be used by the department and Counties for the administration of Agricultural programs

Device Registrations Fees

Annual fee to recover the costs of inspecting or testing weighing and measuring devices, not to exceed the county's total cost of actual inspection. Fee amounts are set in state code.

- Pest Detection 1641 insect traps placed and checked every two weeks over 11,159 servicing's
- Vegetation Pest Management Noxious Weeds over 500 sites visited and treated utilizing IPM, multiple times a season
- Farmers Market Inspections Inspect all markets 13
- Certified Producer Certificate 70 Registrations
- Inspected 602 weighing devices, 2270 measuring devices
- ▶ 332 Pesticide Permits Issued, 33 Notice of Intents, 54 Inspections

 - Pesticides/Weights and Measures/Apiary/Farmers Markets: 39 complaints
