
Key findings

- #2 largest decrease in relative poverty rate (-5%)
- 34.2% growth in Gross Metropolitan Product 2012-2022
- 13.4% increase in productivity
- 2nd-highest job growth among large metros 2023-24



The economic ascent: Sacramento ranked 2nd in national job growth, while California is ranked 36th

- Sacramento MSA is the second fastest in the country for year over year job growth
 - Ranking ahead of competitor markets like Austin (7th), Phoenix (8th), and Seattle (20th).
- Sacramento MSA outpacing legacy California MSA's – higher net employment change than San Jose, San Diego and San Francisco combined





Driving economic excellence: GSEC & El Dorado County partnership

County impacts

- El Dorado County invested \$63,448 in FY 23/24 and has received a \$22:1 fiscal ROI on its investment in GSEC since joining.
- \$47,000 in value from research projects since FY22/23
 - Caldor Fire impact analysis
 - Strategic planning assistance
 - Four additional research cases
- GSEC x El Dorado County engagED forum highlighted economic strategy to key community leaders

Community impacts

- \$9.7 billion total regional economic impact
- Created 12,000 regional jobs
- Growth Factory \$5M invested
 - 52+ companies accelerated
 - 225 local jobs created
- GSEC regional branding campaign



El Dorado County is dramatically improving

Regional growth, creates local impact

- Reducing regional dependence: 33.9% of residents work outside of the county; median income has increased 34.1% since 2015
- Quality of life: Thriving schools and home to top executives.
- Entrepreneurship: Supervisor Hidahl, GSEC & Growth Factory partnered on fund for emerging El Dorado startups, GSEC assisted in Ansync Labs expansion
- 50 Corridor momentum in past two years: Solidigm global semiconductor R&D, Samsung chip R&D and Clutch HQ & VC fund for minority founders, Blaize \$106M VC round





Infinite potential: continuing our regional partnership

El Dorado County leadership on GSEC FY24/25 Board of Directors

- Kyle Zimbelman will be the FY 24/25 Chair of the GSEC Economic Development Director's Taskforce and GSEC Board Member, serving alongside Supervisor Hidahl and 47 CEO's and regional leaders.
- Regina Cuellar, Chairwoman of the Shingle Springs Band of Miwok Indians, has joined GSEC's executive board. The tribe has made a 5-year pledge and \$500,000 commitment. Creating new partnership opportunities to strengthen the relationship between tribe, county and region.


