Hello Julie, my name is Jake. I am reaching out today on behalf of many medical cannabis growers in El Dorado County. I am aware that the current medical ordinance based upon square footage is under review for change. I understand how this change would benefit from keeping big cannabis growers from doing their deeds, however, this also puts many families and individual users at risk for not being able to have the medicine they need throughout the year. I currently live on a property with four people, an elderly gentleman, a active mid fifties madam, and a married couple in their thirties. We all medicate daily. I am not sure if you partake yourself, but if you are aware cannabis is not cheap. So we have been medically cultivating our crop since the ordinance 5000 came into effect. To take the square footage away and go to six plants would not allow us to sustain ourselves through the year, let alone six months! Most farm years are not perfect either, for any vegetables or fruits. Mother Nature always has her way. Square footage allows you to take in consideration the variables that you will have, plants die from over watering, over nutrient, cold shocks, bugs on the plants, bugs in the soil, gophers in the ground, rats, squirrels, deer, literally EVERYTHING is out to get your plants.

2020 has not been an easy year so far. We have had sub par rain fall and a world wide pandemic and we are just a quarter through the year. This is not the time to implement such change. Many of us will be hanging on by a thread in two months, please don't cut the thread entirely.
