This is happening with the Shingle Springs Village project and gun range. As our elected representative officials you need to all agree to extend the comment period to 60 days so that all pertinent facts and concerns can be addressed by the community regarding these Fee to Trust applications.

Apparently this is what Supervisor Ranalli will propose. The controversial nature of these applications affect county taxes, misleading land grab tactics, in addition to a number of other impacts affecting neighbors and the community. County supervisors have more control over fee to trust applications than you are aware. This will be brought to light through ongoing legal representation in the months ahead. Do the right thing and extend the comment period to 60 days on these applications.
