WHEREAS, for many years, Davey Wiser, his crew of "Stagecoach Wranglers" and his horses Beetle Bailey and Jet, have been providing stagecoach and carriage rides at no cost to children of all ages throughout El Dorado County; and,

WHEREAS, attired in clothing that captures the historical spirit, with attention to the smallest of details, Davey Wiser and his crew continue to offer this invaluable experience that recreates the Wild West while providing a living history lesson; and,

WHEREAS, Davey Wiser has been a steadfast supporter of the Highway 50 Association through his numerous years of service as a member of the Board of Directors, and for 33 consecutive years has actively participated in the Annual Wagon Train event, where this true gentleman cowboy has become a legendary figure symbolizing the spirit of the Wagon Train; and,

WHEREAS, his passion to preserve and share our county's history through the recreation of activities and events extends to his participation as a rider in the Annual Pony Express re-ride for the last 27 years; and,

WHEREAS, as a participant in the Annual John M. Studebaker Wheelbarrow Race every year since 1991 Davey remains a crowd favorite, placing twice - third place in 2005 and first place in 2010; and,

WHEREAS, following in the footsteps of both his father, David M. Wiser, and his granddad, Harry Robert Wiser, Davey Wiser enjoyed a lifetime career working on the Southern Pacific and Union Pacific Railroads; and,

WHEREAS, after 50 years of dedicated service, Davey Wiser celebrated his retirement on July 14, 2010; and,

WHEREAS, retired now only from the railroad, the residents of El Dorado County look forward to his continued dedication to preserving our county's history and his continued involvement with numerous community organizations, including the Kiwanis Club of Placerville.
