Vegetation Management Ordinance, 5101

- Program housed under EMS/EP&R
- Administrative analyst starts September 30
- Inspection proposal request
- Developing and implementing program

Defensible Space

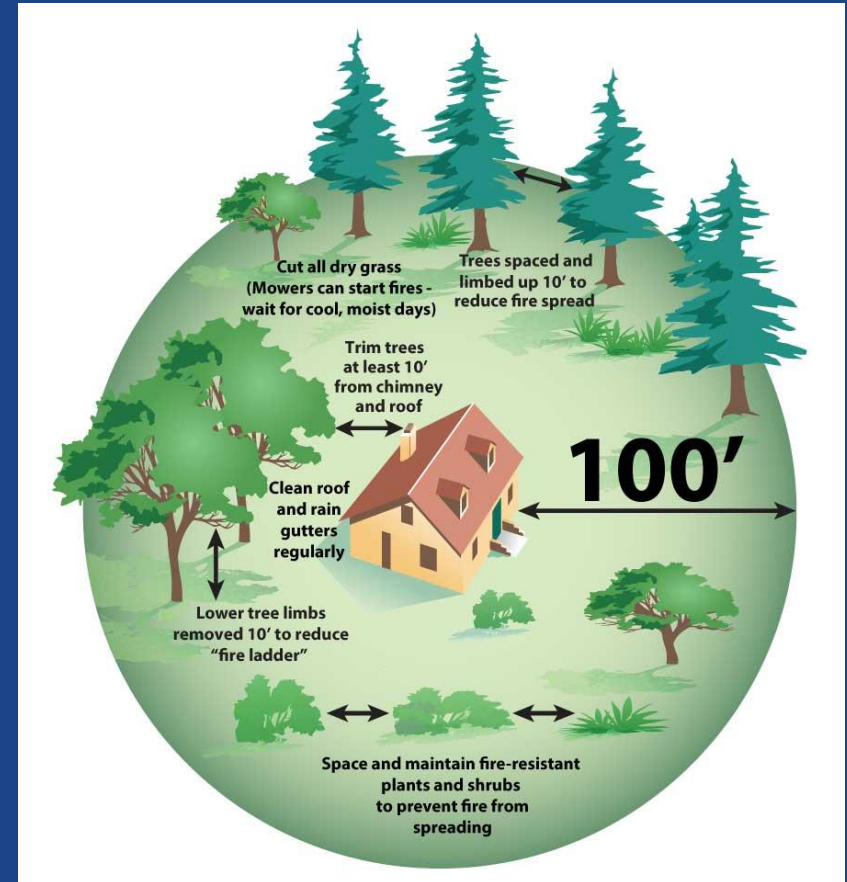


What is it?

- Area around a structure where combustible vegetation has been cleared, reduced or replaced.
- Space that acts as a barrier between a structure and an advancing fire.

Lean, Clean & Green

- Ordinance 5101, Chapter 8
- **100 feet of clearance**
- **Lean**
 - Small amounts of flammable vegetation
- **Clean**
 - No accumulation of dead vegetation or other flammable debris
- **Green**
 - Plants that remain healthy and green during fire season



100 Feet of Clearance

Work with Your Neighbors

These zones make up the 100' of Defensible Space required by law



Many homes do not have 100' of space between structures and parcel lines.

Property owners are required to maintain defensible space to their property line.

Work with neighbors to help provide defensible space for their homes, and ask neighbors for help if their property threatens yours.

In most cases, the most effective solution is a cooperative approach between neighbors.

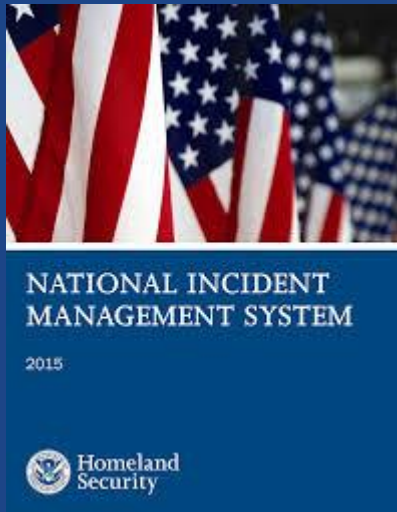
Role of OES in Emergency Management

- Emergency Operations Center (EOC) management , staffing and coordination
- County Plans (LHMP, EOP, etc.)
- Coordinate Mutual Aid and Resource Requests
- Alert and Warnings
- Situational Awareness/Analysis and Information Sharing
- Public Information
- Training and Exercises
- Disaster Declarations
- Finance and Recovery Operations

- Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS)
- National Incident Management System (NIMS)
- All Hazards Response
- Emergency Operations Center
- Domestic/International Terrorism
- Active Violence Training

National Incident Management System (NIMS)



NIMS

- ICS 100 / 200/ 700 Training (First Responders)
- ICS 300 / 400 (Supervisory)
- Partner agencies surveyed for compliance and offered training.
- Disaster Council

Emergency Operations Center (EOC)

- 24/7 On-Call Coverage for Events or Disasters
- Code Red Emergency Notifications
- Annual/Regular Activation Drills and Events
 - Winter Storms
 - Wildland Fires
 - Level 3 Activation (Monitoring Emergencies)
