
Storm Water Management Plan El Dorado County Tahoe Basin



National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Permit Lake Tahoe

- Adopted by Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Board (LRWQCB) in October 2005
- "...Permittees are responsible for all storm water/urban the legal jurisdictional boundaries.. runoff discharges in the Lake Tahoe watershed...within
- NPDES permit Water Management Plan (SWMP) consistent with 2005 Mandates CA jurisdictions (Placer County, City of South Lake Tahoe, and El Dorado County) to develop a Storm
- Requires submittal of SWMP by May 1, 2007

Storm Water Management Plan

- Five Year Strategy for reducing and managing discharges from Municipal System and Activities
- Comprehensive Approach which builds on and integrates Existing County Programs and Activities
- Plan consist of 10 Sections and associated "Control Measures" which ensure compliance with NPDES
- "Continued", "Enhanced", or "New" "Control Measures" are identified as being
