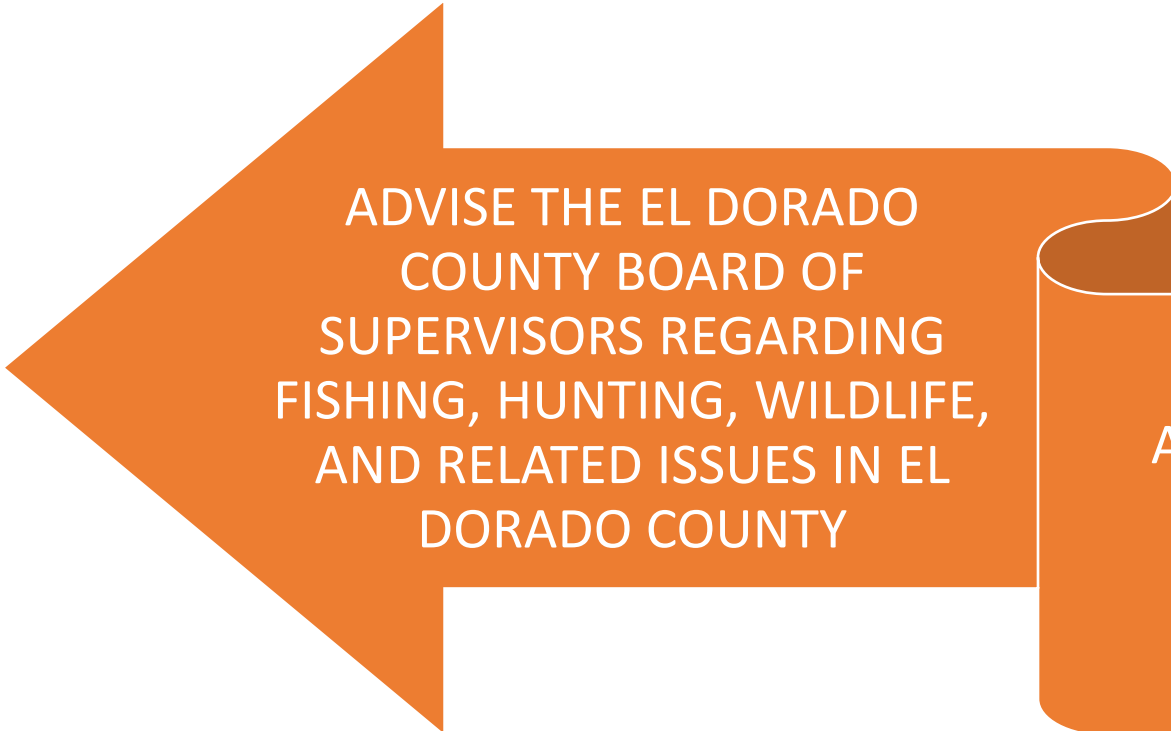

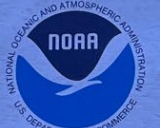
- **Our commission cooperates with Game Wardens and the District Attorneys Office to ensure successful prosecutions of Fish and Game code violations and collection of resultant fines.**
- **Revenues accrued to the county from Fines, Forfeitures, and Penalties.**
- **The Department of Fish and Wildlife has some large cases going to court and may bring in additional funds for FY 24/25.**

COMMISSION ROLES - CONTINUED

- **Based on 2023/2024 actuals the Commission is requesting an additional \$15,000 to support funding for the 2024/2025 Youth Fishing Derbies to continue based on a \$20,000 annual budget. (Note this amount is in the approved Budget for FY24/25)**
- **Commission members provided 160 refurbished fishing poles at no cost to children who do not have equipment. This project is continuing with the assistance of commission members.**
- **Following the Brown Act, gathering information for advising county government, following Rosenbergs Rules of Order, promptly responding to Board of Supervisors and Public.**
