PART IV PROGRAM NARRATIVE

1. **OBJECTIVES**

An Application for Federal Aviation Administration Airport Infrastructure Grant (AIG) Program funds has been prepared for the preparation of a Timber Harvest Plan for Tree Removal, proposed to be included in the 2024 AIG at the Georgetown Airport. The project description is as follows:

The County of El Dorado desires to perform an On-Airport Obstruction Removal – TSS & ROFA for the Georgetown Airport. Trees exist in the TSS & ROFA at the Georgetown Airport that were identified as obstructions to these surfaces in the AGIS and ALP in May 2018. These obstructions will need to be removed.

The Federal Aviation Administration has indicated that this project will require NEPA documentation. In order to prepare a thorough document to address obstruction and tree removal, it is necessary that a State of California Timber Harvesting Plan (THP) be prepared in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Title 14, § 1032.7 et al. The THP would be prepared to plan obstruction removal in accordance with guidance provided by CalFire. The THP would identify environmental conditions, plan ingress, egress and timber landing locations, identify potential impacts, recommend mitigation measures and ultimately allow a Registered Professional Forester to mark trees to be removed. The THP is an equivalent CEQA document, and the FAA SFO/ADO has made a decision that the THP must proceed and be approved by CalFire.

Phase 1 of the THP includes preparation of a cultural resources report and biological inventory of the areas which would be affected by obstruction (trees) removal. These reports will support Phase 2 – preparation of a Timber Harvest Plan, review of the THP, and the preparation of the Timberland Conversion Permit.

2. **RESULTS OR BENEFITS EXPECTED**

For the safety of aircraft operations, It is important to remove the obstructions to the TSS, ROFA, and Part 77 surfaces as soon as possible. The purpose of this study is to prepare a Timber Harvest Plan for the proposed removal of these obstructions. This plan is required in order to proceed with the NEPA document for the removal of these obstructions.

3. **APPROACH**

<u>Plan of Action – Timber Harvest Plan Phase 1</u> – The following tasks are included in Phase 1 of the THP:

Part IV - Program Narrative

Page 2

Task 1 - Cultural Resources Survey

In October 2022, a *Cultural and Paleontological Resources Inventory* was prepared for portions of the Georgetown Airport. The report will be updated and revised to reflect the surveys of the project location; the report will be revised accordingly. The final report will meet the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act and will be used to support the Timber Harvest Plan and future NEPA document and FAA consultation process.

Task 2 - Biological Inventory

A Biological Resources Inventory will be conducted within the project area. The resulting report will include analysis of:

- State and Federal Listed Threatened and Endangered Plants;
- State and Federal Listed Threatened and Endangered Animals;
- Sensitive Habitats, including Designated Critical Habitat, and
- Identification of wetlands and other waters of the U.S.

The final report will be used to support the Timber Harvest Plan and future NEPA document.

An experienced Project Manager will coordinate resource investigations so that data collection and analysis can be used in the Timber Harvest Plan and future (FAA) NEPA documents.

<u>Plan of Action – Timber Harvest Plan Phase 2</u> – The following tasks are included in Phase 2 of the THP:

- Task 1 Assess Tree Obstruction and Determine Appropriate Silvicultural Designation. This task will evaluate standing timber to identify tree species; estimate total board feet to be removed.
- Task 2 Flag Riparian Buffers on Watercourses per California Forest Practice Rule Standards. Protecting riparian habitat is key to the THP. Although it is unlikely that the Georgetown obstruction would affect a riparian habitat, a survey and mapping exercise will confirm the presence or absence of riparian habitat.
- Task 3 Create THP Map per Forest Practice Rule Requirements. CAL FIRE requires a map to identify the extent of the timber harvest. This map identifies the limits of the THP and any significant waterways or riparian habitat.
- **Task 4 Write THP and Submit to CAL FIRE.** CAL FIRE requires an extensive THP and review. This task is dedicated to preparing the THP and making a formal submission to CAL FIRE.

Task 5 – Environmental Project Management. Wallace Environmental Consulting will coordinate THP preparation with Mason, Bruce & Girard – Natural Resource Consultants, El Dorado County, the FAA, and Brandley Engineering.

Task 6 – THP Review. Including review and revisions with various agencies.

Task 7 – Timberland Conversion Permit Preparation. Preparation of the Timberland Conversion Permit

Task 8 – Engineering Support - Brandley Engineering support will consist of further evaluation defining the tree obstruction boundaries and producing sketchmaps documenting the scope of tree removal being proposed.

4. **GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION**

The project included in this Application will be at the Georgetown Airport located in Georgetown, El Dorado County, California. The areas to be served will be the Georgetown Airport and areas of El Dorado County that will be served by the airport improvements.

STANDARD DOT TITLE VI ASSURANCES

During the performance of this contract, the contractor, for itself, its assignees and successors in interest (hereinafter referred to as the "contractor") agrees as follows:

- 4. <u>Information and Reports.</u> The contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the Sponsor or the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations, orders, and instructions. Where any information required of a contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the contractor shall so certify to the sponsor or the FAA, as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.

 - a. Withholding of payments to the contractor under the contract until the contractor complies, and/or
 - b. Cancellation, termination, or suspension of the contract, in whole or in part.
- 6. <u>Incorporation of Provisions</u>. The contractor shall include the provisions of paragraphs 1 through 5 in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto. The contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as the sponsor or the FAA may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance. Provided, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the contractor may request the Sponsor to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the sponsor and, in addition, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.


