



RESOLUTION NO. 167-2014

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO

**WHEREAS**, by Resolution 152-2014, on September 15, 2014, the Board of Supervisors of the County of El Dorado declared a local state of emergency arising from the extreme peril to the safety of persons and property that has arisen within the County as a result of an extreme wildland fire known as the King Fire that started on September 13, 2014 in and around the community of Pollock Pines; and

**WHEREAS**, the King Fire continued to spread at a rapid rate and continued to threaten residential and commercial properties and continued to pose an imminent threat of peril to the safety of persons and property within the County and these conditions were beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the County of El Dorado; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors requested and received a Gubernatorial Declaration of a State of Emergency and further requested additional declaration and assistance from the federal government; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors did find at its regularly scheduled meetings on September 23, and September 30, 2014 that the aforesaid conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the County necessitated the continuance of the declaration of emergency;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that said local emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the Board of Supervisors of the County of El Dorado, State of California.
