Cameron Park Community Services District	<p>Every resident and business received waste guides and service guides at least once annually, contamination results and additional education consisting of sorting guide flyers.</p> <p>Electronically, EDD educated all customers via call blasts that regarded contamination or a public service announcement on batteries as hazardous waste. Direct education covers 1:1 phone call, mailings, emails, site checks, bin stickers, and cart tags for both commercials and residential. The other category covers 9 community events EDD participated in to directly educate the public, mailed vouchers for residential and multi-families, and direct education via our residential battery and oil pick up program. In addition to SLCP education, we provided MORe education to 229 commercials via a recycling postcard, and MCR education to 226 commercials via an enclosure cleanliness postcard.</p>
