My intention is for these observations to be seen as constructive rather than derogatory, emphasizing the importance of adhering to established processes.

In light of these considerations, the Alliance formally requests Supervisor Parlin's recusal from the ad-hoc committee. A careful review of her statements during the last board meeting, coupled with her historical behavior, reveals a clear disdain for committees and commissions within the county decision-making process and a pronounced bias against cannabis. This sentiment has been evident in various public forums and extends beyond the cannabis realm, encompassing her persistent efforts to advocate for the elimination of CEDAC.

Moreover, we firmly believe that the presence of such biases within ad-hoc committees squanders valuable government resources. The inefficiency resulting from filibustering undermines the purpose of establishing such committees and hampers the effective allocation of time and resources.

In the interest of fostering a fair and unbiased decision-making process while optimizing the use of government resources, we strongly urge Supervisor Parlin's recusal. We remain optimistic that this request will be received in the spirit of constructive engagement and a commitment to upholding the integrity of the county's governance and policy-making procedures.
