Supervisor Sweeney is asking the BOS to vote for Resolution #10-0682 which is a radical change in the length of track for the Demonstration Train. This new resolution is an attempt to extend the distance another 3 miles and this new proposed length has not be reviewed by all stakeholders. The additional miles has more challenging terrain adjacent to the rails which would raise the cost of laying the Class I trail. An estimate of the increased cost is needed before this additional length can be added to the Train Park. Before we give away any section of track, all stakeholders need a Voice !

An excursion train is a novelty that is done once, a mixed use trail is something that one uses regularly. How many times have any of you been on the wine train? There is a proposed Historical Train Park and a Demonstration Train in the town of El Dorado. This project has been planed and reviewed by all stakeholders and is the perfect spot to preserve history. Trail Advocates and the Friends of the El Dorado

Trail are 100% behind this agreement, because the rail right-of-way is wide and flat in the area and the Class I multi-use trail could be laid adjacent to the track at a reasonable cost. This is one of the very few sections on the right-of-way where this is possible. The Demonstration Train would run from El Dorado to Blanchard Road, about .75 mile distance.
