Incident Support Airport Agreement

DESCRIPTION/ SPECIFICATIONS/ STATEMENT OF WORK

The owner of the property described herein, or the duly appointed representative of the owner, agrees to furnish the land/facilities for use of landing and refueling area for aircraft. This Agreement is for use of Placerville Airport-KPVF-El Dorado County to include, as needed: taxiways, FBO facility, aircraft tie-down areas, runways, and any other areas within the property boundaries which do not disturb any privately leased facilities. Type of equipment that shall be located on the airport include Aircraft, Support Vehicles, Modular Facilities, Support Equipment, Supplies, and Associated Personnel in support of emergency wildland fire suppression efforts for the US Forest Service only.

Aircraft vendor fueling performed at Placerville Airport will be conducted in full compliance with DOT/EPA standards related to fuel spill mitigation as required in USFS aircraft contracts. Fuel spill incidents will be immediately reported to the Airport Operations Supervisor. Contractor bulk fuel transfers (Bulk tender into service vehicles) may be coordinated "off-site" away from the airport property at the discretion of the Airport Operations Supervisor. Any fees related to fuel flowage shall follow the current airport fee schedule applicable to General Aviation use.

Short term "transient use" of Placerville Airport by USFS aircraft does not fall under the terms of this Land Use Agreement. Transient use fees shall follow the current airport fee schedule applicable to General Aviation use. The USFS agrees to notify Airport management anytime transient use is planned. Transient use is typically overnight staging or re-fueling of a single aircraft supporting initial attack fire operations.

CONDITION REPORTS: For each time the Land/Facilities are used a joint pre-use and post-use physical inspection report of the land/facilities shall be made, to the maximum extent possible, and signed by the USFS and the county's Airport Operations Supervisor; the purpose of the inspections shall be to reflect the existing site condition upon activation and deactivation and identify any damages related to use while operating under this agreement.

Access and use of the FBO and airport amenities (full or limited) by incident personnel shall be at the discretion of the Airport Operations Supervisor. If access is granted (full or limited) these areas shall become part of the pre and post use physical inspection.
