RE: SUPPORT - CLEVELAND-ICE HOUSE FOREST HEALTH PROJECT

Dear Chief Thane,

On behalf of El Dorado County, the Board of Supervisors would like to express our support for the Cleveland-Ice House Forest Health Project, which would conduct a combination of thinning, chipping, masticating brush and smaller trees, and hand treatments including brush cutting, hand thinning, and pruning, prescribed understory burning, and road maintenance activities within the Cleveland-Ice House Plantations on the Pacific District of the El Dorado National Forest.

The Board is pleased to support the project due to its focus on improving forest health, fire resiliency, and wildlife habitat in the South Fork American River Cohesive Strategy Area ("South Fork Cohesive Area"). The South Fork Cohesive Area has large swaths of U.S. Forest Service-designated wildland-urban interface along a heavily traveled and visible state highway corridor with multiple small permanent and seasonal residences and it receives heavy recreational use.

This project is urgent for the South Fork Cohesive Area due to the insect and disease threats that face the area. In fact, the 2014 Farm Bill designated areas within the South Fork Cohesive Area to address insect and disease threats that impact forest health and increase the risk of wildland fire. According to National Insect and Disease risk models, the proposed treatment areas are categorized as high risk for pests that could destroy over 25 percent of basal area due to current forest conditions. In April of 2014, California Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. specifically identified a corridor along the South Fork American River for treatment designation due to pest risks, later supported by Secretary of Agriculture Tom Vilsack in May of 2014.

For these reasons, El Dorado County is supporting the Cleveland-Ice House Forest Health Project.
