If no, please describe how funding in this category will help your agency fill programmatic gaps. What are your current processes? *

The El Dorado County Probation Department (EDCPD) is not resourced to administer the Medi-Cal billing for the Juvenile Justice Center in South Lake Tahoe without significant personnel resource additions and training. The programmatic gaps in Medi-Cal billing are centered around the lack of experience with Medi-Cal billing and the pending guidance from the DHCS on Medi-Cal billing standards. The Probation Department's Fiscal Team oversee the department's operating budget which is a combination of county-based general funds and braided grant funds; pay-for-performance reimbursement methodologies, such as the Medi-Cal fee-for-service and capitated service bundles, are not currently implemented in the fiscal operations. DHCS has communicated the pending delivery of a Medi-Cal billing toolkit to identify the billable codes, modifiers, provider types, and authorization protocols. This information will be used to educate the fiscal administrators and to develop EDCPD's standard operating procedures. Round 4 funds are proposed to retain a consultant to support the fiscal management and oversight of the Medi-Cal billing and to develop industry-standard revenue cycle management practices through mid-year 2029.

If yes, why do you need more in Round 4? What type of programmatic gaps did your agency identify that more funding will fill? *

After discussion with HHSA, our County is contracting with Manifest MedEx as the Health Information Exchange for Data Sharing. Our Department is contracting with CorrecTek as our Electronic Health Record. To efficiently exchange information between HHSA and the Sheriff's Office for Adults, it was determined that there is a significant need for the adult module from CorrecTek.

If no, please describe how funding in this category will help your agency fill programmatic gaps. What are your current processes? *

Our County is looking to charge back for services already being completed by the In-House Treatment Services Team detailed in our Round 3 Implementation Plan, and is hopeful for the authorization to do so through DHCS. The budget presents the ability to charge back 20% of the time our Mental Health Program Coordinator, Mental Health Clinician, and Health Educator spend on claimable activities in their current capacity.

With our planned implementation date of 07/01/2026, and efforts so far, we've identified the gaps described in the Department's Implementation Plan with consideration of the requirements for Adults coming out of the jail, and our ability to sustain the programs through Medi-Cal Billing, which Probation has not completed prior to the CalAIM PATH JI being introduced. Current budget requests for Round 4 would aid in the coordination and collaboration with our fellow County Departments, and allow for more efficient implementation Department wide.

11. Sustainability

Please provide a narrative of how your agency plans to sustain these programmatic changes beyond the approved grant expenditure timeframe. *

As detailed in the narrative and depicted in our budget, contracting out for Medi-Cal Billing Services through an existing and proven vendor allows our department to focus on providing services to youth. Utilizing the same vendor as our other county partners for the Health Information Exchange Data Sharing Agreement ensures efficient communication and continuity of service. Adding the Adult Module to the CorrecTek Electronic Health Record will also support collaboration and ensure a warm handoff between the Jail and Probation. If we are permitted to chargeback for existing services already completed ahead of implementation by our In-House Treatment Services, this would offset current General Fund Expenditures, and further aid sustainability as the County and State of California are experiencing budget shortfalls. Sustainability in calendar year 2030 and beyond is attained through better efficiencies in the Probation Department's ability to document service encounters, generate claims in a timely manner, and minimize the volume of denied payments. The timeframe of 36-42 months to attain revenue cycle best practices is based on empirical results with organizations billing Medi-Cal for reimbursements. Cost and quality controls will be developed by EDCPD during the first three(3) years to sustain the reentry services.
