**RESOLUTION OF THE SUPERIOR COURT OF CALIFORNIA
FOR THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO**

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Superior Court of California for the County of El Dorado (the Court) has the authority to implement Government Code section 20636(c)(4), pursuant to Government Code section 20691, whereby the Court may pay all or part of an employee's member contribution to CalPERS and has up to January 11, 2013, paid 7 percent of the unrepresented/confidential employee member's 7 percent contribution;


WHEREAS, the Court's governing body has determined that due to unprecedented statewide budget reductions to the judicial branch resulting in substantially reduced available funds available for Court employee benefits, the Court must for the foreseeable future discontinue paying half of the employee member's contribution to CalPERS and notified the effected employees' of this change on January 7, 2013 of this 3.5% benefit reduction effective on January 12, 2013;

WHEREAS, the following is thus a statement of the Court's proposed reporting of the EPMC:

- This benefit shall apply to all current and future hires classified as Executive, Management, Supervisory, and Confidential.
- This benefit shall consist of paying 3.5 percent of the normal member contributions as EPMC, a reduction from the 7 percent that has been paid in the past.
- The Court was only recently made aware of the requirement to have a resolution passed by the County Board of Supervisors and is presenting this resolution in good faith to appropriately memorialize the change in EPMC to the Executive, Management, Supervisory and Confidential classifications.
- The effective date of this Resolution shall be May 21, 2013.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the governing body of the Superior Court of California for the County of El Dorado elects to pay and report EPMC, as set forth above.
