SR. PARKS TRAIL MAINTENANCE WORKER

DEFINITION

Under general supervision, performs a range of highly challenging and intricate skilled heavy, physical work focused on repairing and maintaining the Rubicon Trail and other trails within El Dorado County; may act as a lead worker for trail staff; duties include the installation of Best Management Practices as designed, coordination of specific program activities, and service of portable restroom facilities; accountable for the day-to-day operations of an assigned work unit, engaging with volunteers and parks staff to fulfill the objectives of the Parks Division within the department; may be assigned other trail-related duties as needed.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED

Receives direction from assigned supervisory or management personnel. May provide functional and technical leadership over subordinate trail staff. May coordinate a program, function, or work unit.

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS

This is the lead working class and deep subject matter expert performing trail maintenance work. Positions in this class perform duties and responsibilities in an advanced journey-level capacity to assist in the repair and maintenance of the Rubicon Trail and other trails within El Dorado County. Incumbents are expected to perform a wide range of general trail maintenance.

Incumbents in this class report to assigned supervisory or management personnel. To complete projects/assignments, incumbents must be able to plan, schedule, and lead the daily work of a specified employee or group of employees.

EXAMPLES OF TYPICAL JOB FUNCTIONS (Illustrative Only)

- ➤ Plans, prioritizes, assigns, reviews, and may lead the daily work of Trail staff responsible for maintaining the County's trails.
- ➤ Perform and provide skilled maintenance, construction, and repair work for the County's trails including the routine and annual maintenance and care for trails, bike trails, and the repair of a variety of public rights of ways; adhere to safety and occupational hazard regulations and provide professional maintenance work; lead crews and provide oversight.
- > Services portable restroom units and removes waste from holding tanks at various work sites; restocks paper products; cleans interior and exterior of units; adds chemical odor control substance and disinfectant to holding tank.
- Assist external agencies, members of the public, and volunteers with various trail-related activities.
- Transports waste by sanitation truck to septic vault on Rubicon Trail terrain.
- ➤ Installs Best Management Practices.
- Performs rock clearance, brush clearance, tree removal, and weed control work.
- > Performs snow removal and ice control on trails.
- Performs seasonal inspections of trails including water depth measurement and temperature monitoring as required by easement agreements.
- > Inspects vehicles and equipment, and performs minor maintenance; reports the need for major repairs

and service; fuels and lubricates vehicles and related equipment; washes and cleans assigned vehicles.

> Performs related duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of:

- Advanced knowledge of techniques and tools used in the maintenance and construction of off-highway vehicle trails.
- Basic techniques, materials, tools, and equipment used in the maintenance and repair and of roads.
- > Basic shop arithmetic.
- > Safe work practices and safety regulations on the operations and transportation of equipment and vehicles
- > Preventive maintenance and minor repair methods related to the equipment.
- > Guidelines for pumping portable restrooms.
- ➤ Best Management Practices according to the Saturated Soils Water Quality Protection Plan.
- Applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulatory codes, ordinances, and procedures relevant to the assigned area of responsibility.
- > Principles and techniques for working with groups and fostering effective team interaction to ensure teamwork is conducted smoothly.
- > Techniques for providing a high level of customer service by effectively dealing with the public, vendors, contractors, and County staff.
- The structure and content of the English language, including the meaning and spelling of words, rules of composition, and grammar.

Ability to:

- Performing highly skilled trail maintenance, construction, and repair work.
- > Operate and maintain a variety of hand and power tools and equipment used in the work.
- > Operate a 4-wheel drive vehicle on Rubicon Trail terrain.
- > Install trail delineators as directed.
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of the work. Recognize potentially hazardous conditions on the job site or with the equipment.
- > Understand and follow oral and written instructions.
- ➤ Keep accurate records and prepare simple to complex reports.
- > Deal tactfully and effectively with persons contacted in the course of work, including those of diverse socioeconomic and cultural backgrounds.
- ➤ Use tact, initiative, prudence, and independent judgment within general policy, procedural, and legal guidelines.
- Establish, maintain, and foster positive and effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.
- ➤ Understand, interpret, and apply all pertinent laws, codes, regulations, policies and procedures, and standards relevant to work performed.
- Independently organize work, set priorities, meet critical deadlines, and follow-up on assignments.
- > Communicate clearly and concisely, using appropriate English grammar and syntax.
- > Use tact, initiative, prudence, and independent judgment within general policy, procedural, and legal guidelines.
- Establish, maintain, and foster positive and effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.

Education and Experience:

Two (2) years of experience performing off-highway vehicle trail maintenance and repair.

Knowledge of the Rubicon Trail and 4-wheel drive experience is desired.

Licenses and Certifications:

➤ Possession of, or ability to obtain and maintain, a valid California or Nevada Driver's License and a satisfactory driving record.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Must possess mobility to work in the field; strength, stamina, and mobility to walk trails over rough, uneven, rocky, and steep terrain, to operate varied hand and power tools and construction equipment, and to operate a motor vehicle while traveling on the Rubicon Trail; vision to read printed material and a computer screen; and hearing and speech to communicate in person and over the telephone or radio. Finger dexterity is needed to access, enter, and retrieve data using a computer keyboard or calculator and to operate the abovementioned tools and equipment. Positions in this classification bend, stoop, kneel, reach, and climb to perform work and inspect work sites. Employees must possess the ability to lift, carry, push, and pull materials and objects weighing up to 50 pounds, or heavier weights with the use of proper equipment and assistance from other staff. Reasonable accommodations will be made for individuals on a case-by-case basis.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS

Employees work in the field and are exposed to loud noise levels, cold and hot temperatures, inclement weather conditions, road hazards, chemicals, hazardous physical substances and fumes, and hazardous machinery and power tools.
