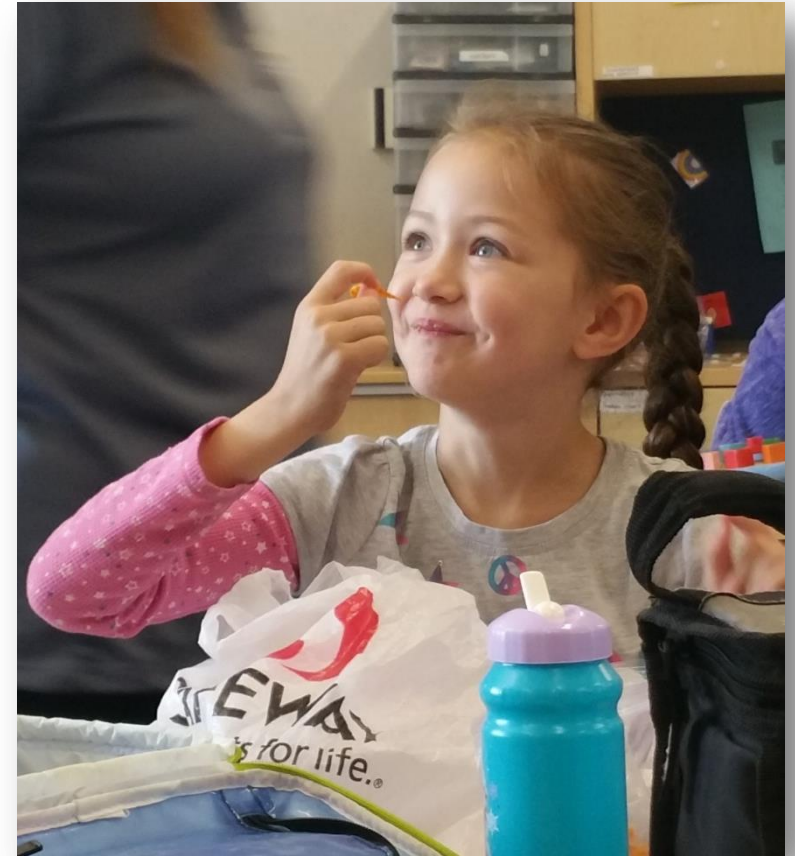

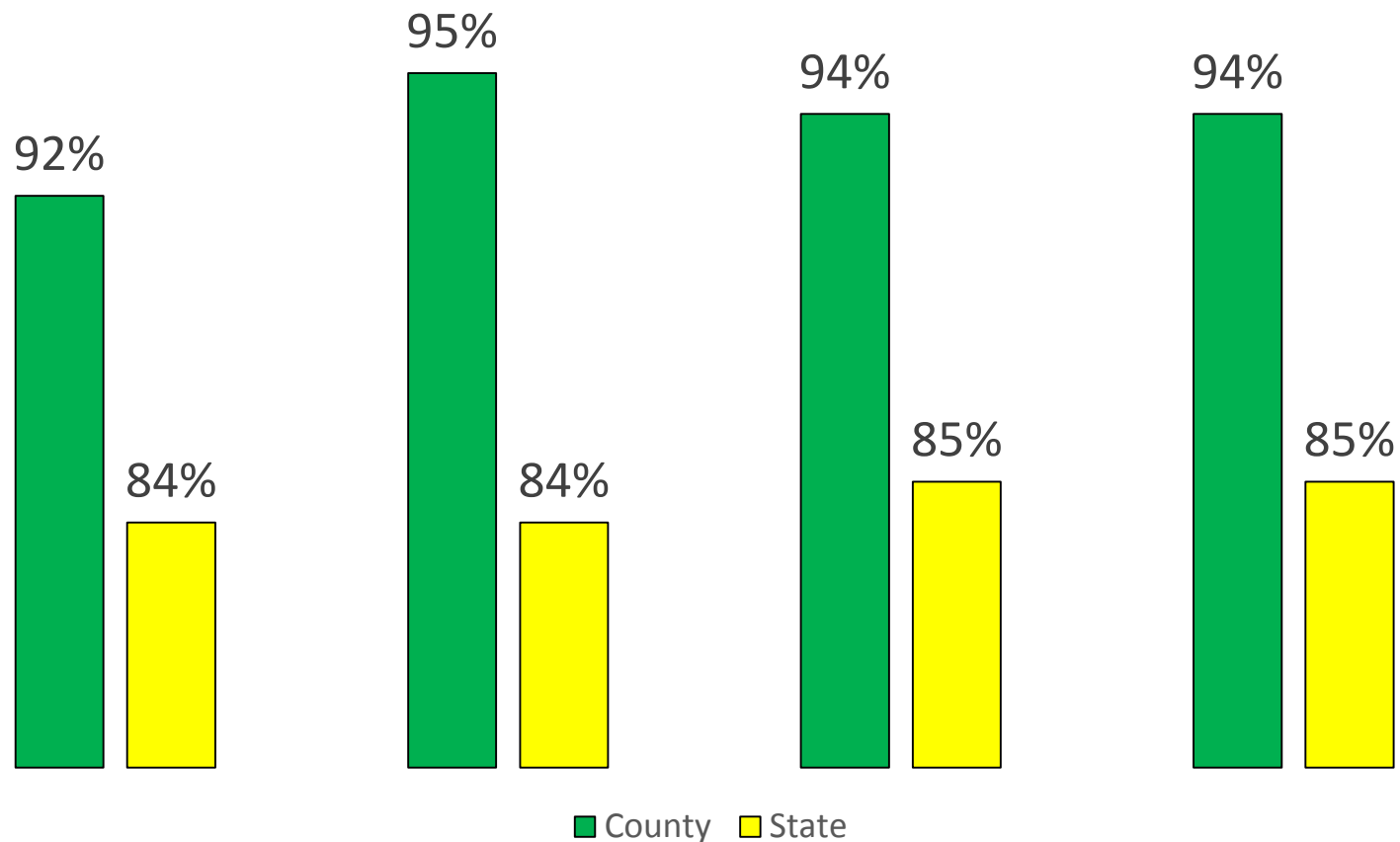

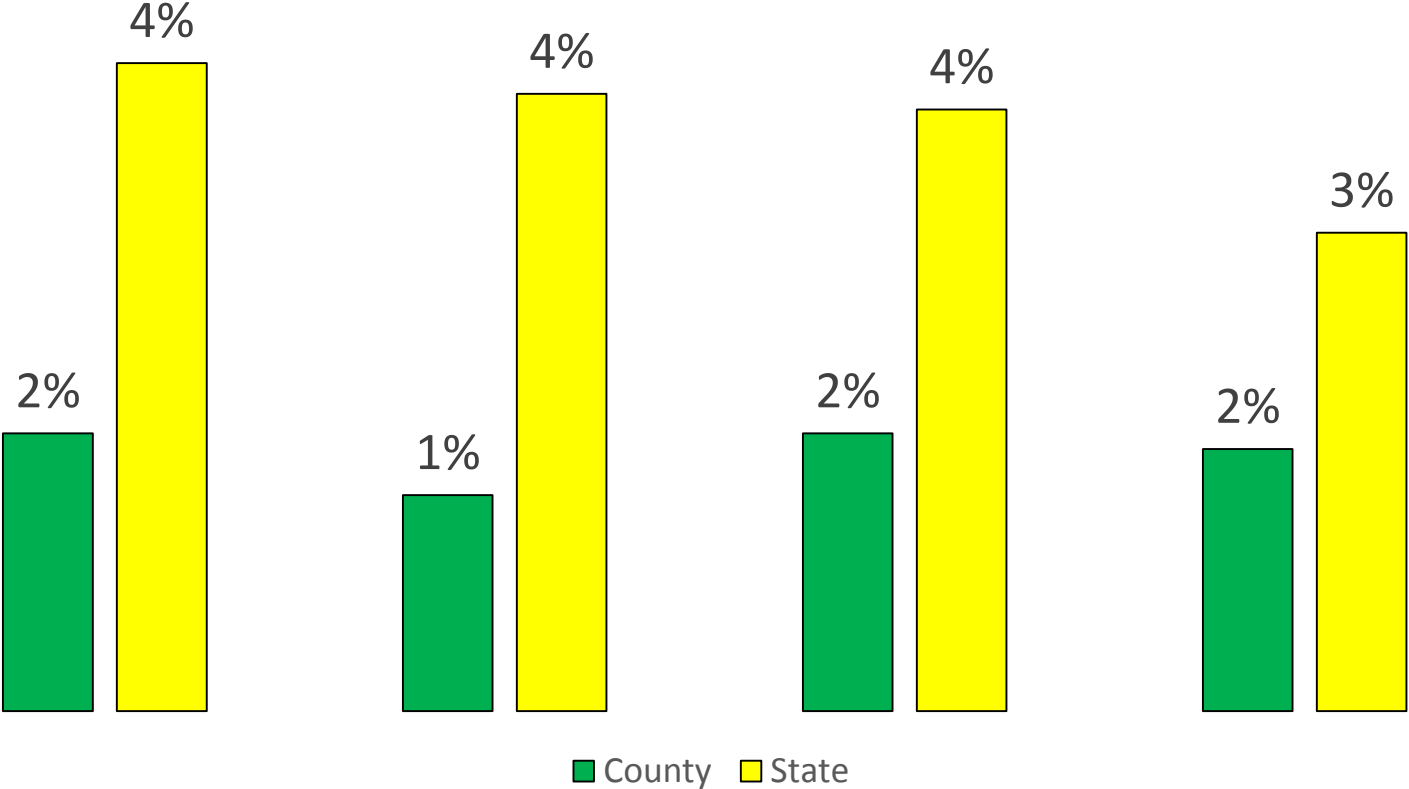

## Graduation Rates



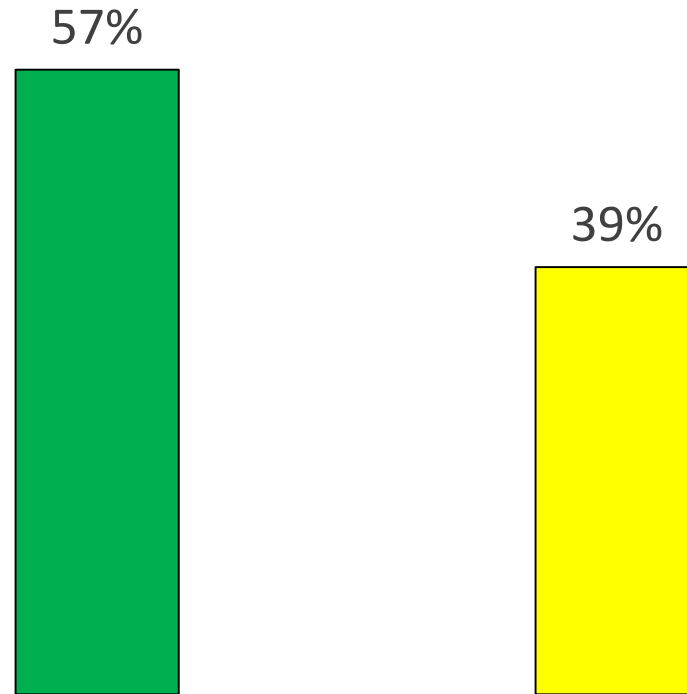

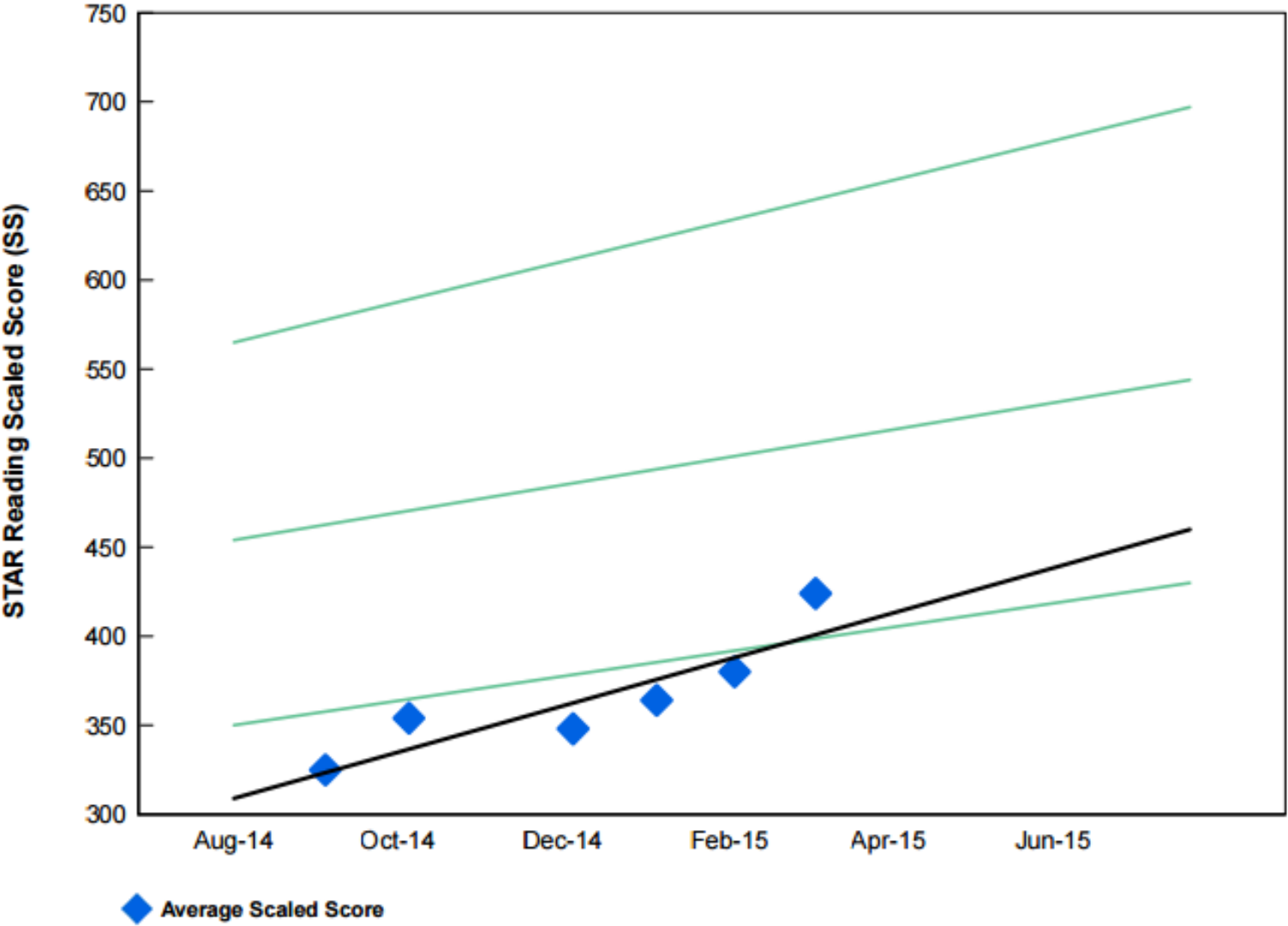

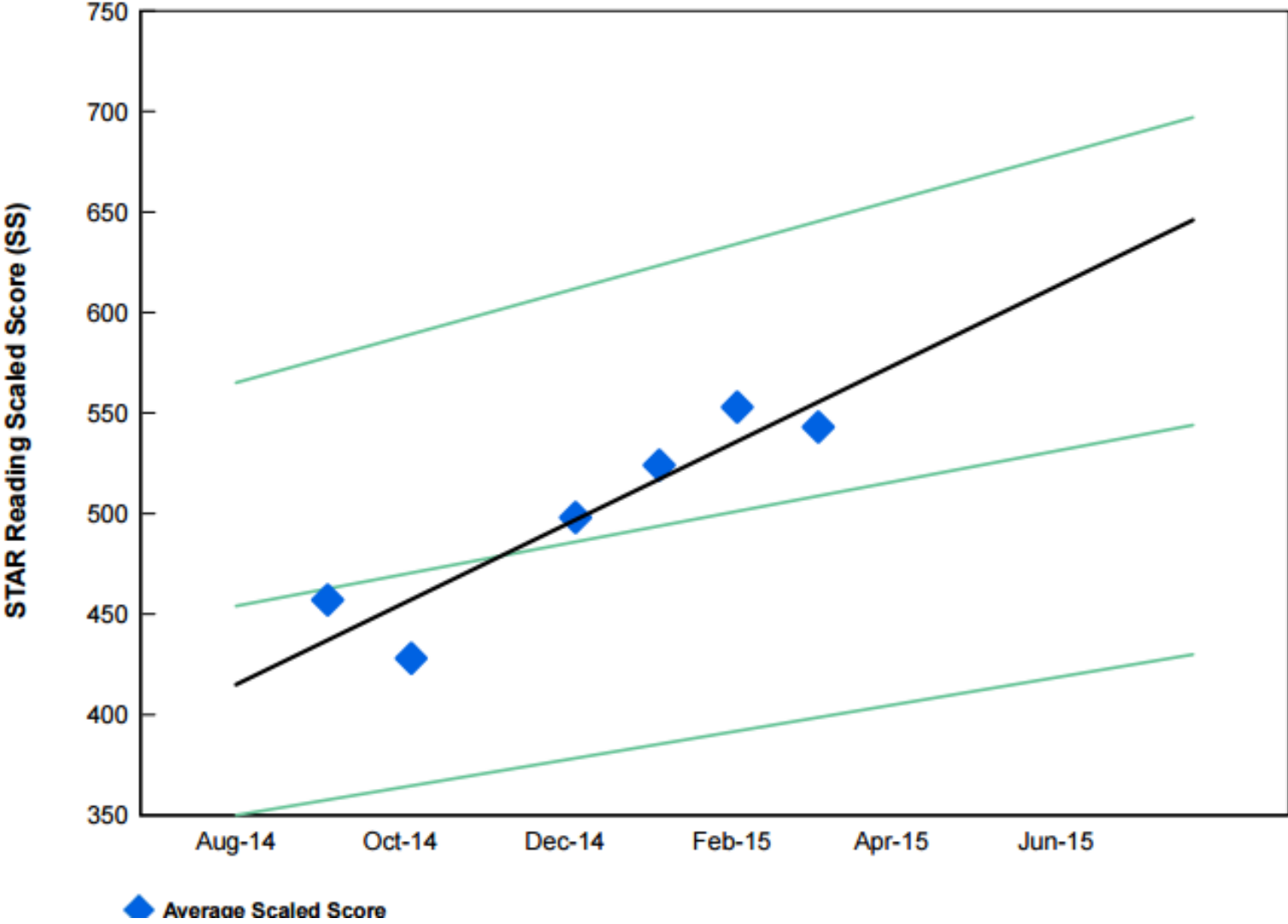
