I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure flexibility and efficiency in the grant application process while maintaining the Board of Supervisors discretion over the acceptance of grant funding and any related obligations.

II. POLICY

The County receives financial assistance in the form of grants. For the purposes of this policy, grants shall be defined as cash or in-kind assistance awarded by a government or other organization (called the grantor), excluding unsolicited donations, for specified purposes to an eligible recipient (called the grantee). Grants are usually conditional upon certain qualifications as to the use, maintenance of specified standards, and/or a proportional contribution by the grantee or other grantor(s). The grant process may consist of several steps including a notice of intent to apply, application, acceptance of award, and execution of grant agreement and related documents.

- A. The Board of Supervisors is the sole authority for:
 - 1. Accepting grant awards and approving grant agreements in the amount of more than \$10,000 or in-kind awards valued at more than \$10,000;
 - 2. Accepting grants for which any requirements for funds, matching or otherwise, or other resources are required for funding disbursement; and
 - 3. Delegating authority to execute the grant agreement and other grant related documents after acceptance of a grant award and approval of the grant agreement.
- B. County department heads are authorized to:
 - 1. Execute all documents required to apply for grants.
 - i. Department heads are expected to exercise good judgment when determining to spend staff time applying for a grant.
 - ii. The grant should be directly related to the mission and vision of the department.
 - iii. Any county match requirements must be feasible and reasonable.
 - 2. Accept grant awards that meet all of the following criteria:

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- i. Are in a cash amount not to exceed \$10,000 or in-kind awards valued at not more than \$10,000; and
- ii. Do not include any requirement for County funds; and
- iii. Relate directly to the mission of the department and directives of the Board.
- iv. No less than three business days prior to accepting the grant, the department head will provide the Board and the Chief Administrative Office (CAO) a written report demonstrating that the grant meets criteria 2.i through 2.iii and notifying the Board of the intent to accept the grant. If no member of the Board or the CAO express concerns during this three-day period, the department head may accept the grant. If any member of the Board or the CAO objects, the department head shall bring the decision to accept the grant before a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board.
- 3. Department heads are required to communicate, document, and coordinate with any other county departments that may be involved with or affected by the grant program or project.
- 4. Department heads are responsible for determining whether they are authorized to exercise the authority provided herein under the grantor's guidelines for each grant. If all criteria are met, the Department Head has the delegated authority to accept the grant and sign the grant agreement.
- 5. Department heads are encouraged to seek assistance and guidance from the Chief Administrative Office in fulfilling the responsibilities listed above.

The El Dorado County District Attorney's Office (EDCDAO) 2023 Pandemic Unemployment Assistance and Unemployment Insurance Anti-Fraud Grant (PG) Program budget details the Agency's plans to support the objectives and activities of the project through the investigation and prosecution of Unemployment Insurance Fraud violations, which spiked during the COIVD-19 pandemic emergencies.

The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) has allocated \$247,677 in 2022 PAND funds.

Personal Services – Employee Salaries/Benefits:

Employee salary and benefits represent 65% of the 2023 PG Program budget. The program will fund one District Attorney Investigator (Extra-Help) and 20% of a Deputy District Attorney. The Extra-Help Investigator will be 100% assigned to the program, with a maximum of 960 hours of annual services.

The project-funded duties provided by the investigator will include reviewing all referrals from EDD, assessing initial case information, briefing the assigned attorney, and investigating by monitoring jail calls and mail correspondence. The investigator will also attend Fraud-related training opportunities and provide in-house training to other investigators regarding the elements of EDD fraud and to recognize EDD fraud violations.

The project-funded duties of the assigned attorney will include conducting legal research, providing case advice, reviewing search warrants, preparing for trial, and prosecuting violations of California Unemployment Insurance Penal Code §§ 2101 and 2114; Cal. Penal Code §§ 487, 496, and 530.5; and any fraud offenses relating to COVID-19 pandemic-related insurance programs: administered by EDD, or the U.S. Department of Labor. See Cal. Penal Code § 186.2(a) (34) (B).

Both the investigator and attorney will be housed at the EDCDAO Placerville location and maintain active communication regarding program objectives. All positions maintain functional, detailed time sheets that are submitted on a bi-weekly basis. There are no mid-year salary range adjustments required and no shared costs. Salaries have been calculated over a twelvementh period.

Operating Expenses:

The budgeted operating expenses include training/travel related costs, miscellaneous office supplies and law enforcement equipment expenses, the purchase of one computer workstation setup, a contracted agreement with a Financial Forensic Specialist, transcription services, and the annual maintenance fee for Leo Technologies software.

Due to the financial component of the pandemic-related insurance program, expert services will be needed via a Financial Forensic Specialist. It is anticipated the specialist will trace EDD funds, identify suspects, and provide reports that will aid in prosecution. Additionally, specialized software know as Leo Technologies will allow the District Attorney's Office to utilize artificial intelligence when listening to significant hours of jail calls, searching for key words related to EDD fraud.

In the efforts of minimizing costs towards the program, administrative and overhead expenses are not being billed. These costs include indirect costs such as postage, data processing, utilities, program management support, and administrative support from the Central Fiscal Division, which includes grant financial and administrative management.

The are no subcontracts or unusual expenses at this time.

There are not funds budgeted for equipment at this time.

A. Problem Statement – not required.

B. Plan

The El Dorado County District Attorney's Office (EDCDAO) is dedicated to aggressively investigating and prosecuting unemployment assistance and unemployment insurance fraud. Under the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance and Unemployment Insurance Anti-Fraud Grant (PG) Program, EDCDAO plans to hire one District Attorney Investigator (Extra-Help) with specialized fraud training and investigative experience. This Investigator will field all referrals from Employment Development Department (EDD) and generate their own cases based upon EDD data and trend analysis. This Investigator will assess the initial case information, brief the assigned attorney, and investigate by monitoring jail calls and mail correspondence, following leads, coordinating and liaising with EDD, gather evidence of fraud, interviewing suspects and witnesses, write reports, make arrests, and assist with prosecution of violations of California Unemployment Insurance Code §§ 2101 and 2114; California Penal Code §§ 487, 496, 530.5, and any fraud offenses relating to COVID-19 pandemic-related insurance programs administered by EDD or the U.S. Department of Labor (see Cal. Penal Code § 186.2(a)(34)(B)). The investigator will be assigned fulltime (up to 960 hours per

fiscal year) toward the program and will be supplemented with other Investigators on an as needed basis based upon workload and case complexity.

We have found people who commit EDD fraud are also likely to be involved in other criminal activity. Therefore, our EDD Investigator will provide inhouse training on the elements of EDD fraud and how to recognize EDD fraud. Our dedicated EDD investigator will also work with our Special Prosecutions Unit fraud prosecutors and investigators to assist in fully investigating and prosecuting all fraud revealed by our EDD fraud investigations. Within this collaboration, we will be able to have our investigators and prosecutors on the lookout for suspected fraud of any kind, and be able to fully hold defendants accountable for all the crimes they may commit.

The EDD Fraud Investigator will be supervised by a Supervising Investigator, who will review case recommendations, monitor progress, and ensure the program is successful.

The El Dorado County District Attorney Office anticipates billing for 20% of one Deputy District Attorney who will provide legal research, case advice, search warrant review, trial prep, and prosecution of violations of Cal. Unempl. Ins. Code §§ 2101 and 2114; Cal. Penal Code §§ 487, 496, 530.5, and any fraud offenses

relating to COVID-19 pandemic-related insurance programs: administered by EDD, or the U.S. Department of Labor. See Cal. Penal Code § 186.2(a)(34)(B).

The El Dorado County District Attorney Office understands that violations of Cal. Unempl. Ins. Code §§ 2101 and 2114; Cal. Penal Code §§ 487, 496, 530.5, and/or any fraud offenses relating to COVID-19 pandemic-related insurance programs, administered by EDD can have a significant and complex financial component where the use of a forensic auditor may be required. This forensic auditor will assist both in the investigation and potential prosecution of EDD Fraud by tracing money, identifying suspects, and providing reports that will aid in more effective investigations and prosecutions.

One trend the County has observed in previous years is a significant number of offenders being incarcerated at the time they applied for and received EDD benefits. This results in spending significant time listening to jail calls. Using Leo Technologies (a process/product that allows more efficient and effective way to monitor correctional facility communications) staff are able to utilize Artificial Intelligence which significantly reduced the man hours manually listening to jail calls, allowing for voice identification, Artificial Intelligence search for trending and relevant keywords and phrases related to EDD fraud. We are budgeting for the monthly cost for LEO Technologies to be used as an aid to

investigate violations of Cal. Unempl. Ins. Code §§ 2101 and 2114; Cal. Penal Code §§ 487, 496, 530.5, and any fraud offenses relating to COVID-19 pandemic-related insurance programs administered by EDD.

Additionally, our EDD investigator, along with members of the Special Prosecutions Unit, will continue to identify and attend any fraud-related trainings provided by CDAIA (California District Attorney Investigators' Association), CDAA (California District Attorneys Association), Department of Insurance (DOI), the insurance industry, and the Anti-Fraud Alliance in order to facilitate more effective investigations and prosecutions of our fraud cases.
