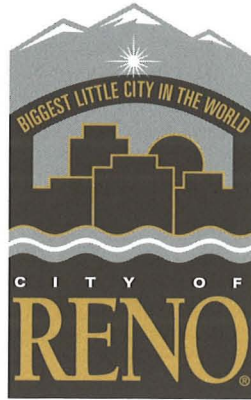

To Whom It May Concern:

As a Project Coordinator for the City of Reno I had the pleasure of working with Intermountain Slurry as they applied micro-surfacing for the City of Reno projects since 2007 through 2012. Typically additional pavement area is added at the end of slurry and micro-surface projects and Intermountain was able to provide the resources required to successfully meet project deadlines. The projects overall were completed on time and within budget.

City of Reno projects consisted of furnishing and applying Type II and III aggregates for use with both RTE and LMCQS emulsions. Aggregates and emulsions used on the projects were monitored closely and met specifications as required by the City of Reno contracts. All material was ordered and delivered on time in order to meet the weekly work schedules. Stockpile areas were kept neat and free of debris and BMPs were used appropriately.

The weekly work schedules were generally appropriate in size to enable completion, minimizing the need for rescheduling, and thus minimizing the inconvenience to residents and businesses. Additionally, I received comments from residents about the courtesy of Intermountain Slurry Seal crews. Whether responding to questions about the type of work they were performing or meeting the demands of those with special needs, Intermountain Slurry Seal crews were responsive and courteous to residents and drivers.

The placement of the micro-surface material was within the specified application rates and appeared smooth and nearly blemish free.

Overall Intermountain Slurry Seal performed very well and I would have no reservations with them as the contractor on future projects for the City of Reno.
