re: Notice and Request to be Heard (Petition for Redress of Grievances)

Dear Supervisors, Registrar, and Sheriff:

The purpose of this notice is to ask for an opportunity to address the entire Board and or to present a claim contesting the certification of *any* election results at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors. I am also requesting the Board direct the Registrar of Voters to respond to the request for information below.

I invite your attention to California Election Code section 16100(d), which states in part. .

Any elector of a county, city, or of any political subdivision of either
may contest any election held therein, for any of the following causes:
. . . (d) That illegal votes were cast.

The factual basis of my request is that it is common knowledge that there has been a flood of illegal aliens into the State of California, its counties, cities and school districts. Those non-citizens have apparently been allowed to register with the Department of Motor Vehicles. With that registration, these non-citizens have been provided with voter registration and election ballots. It is also common knowledge that investigative reporters have discovered that some illegal alien non-citizens have, in fact, voted.

Providing these non-citizens voter registration and election ballots gives you, the members of the Board of Supervisors, and you, the Registrar of Voters the legal basis to set aside the election and deny its certification due to the number of Illegal voters as set forth in California Elections Code §16100, specifically subsection (d).

These incontrovertible facts give you, Sheriff, not only the right, but the obligation to investigate voter fraud. If the Board and Registrar certify the election, they will be committing a felony.

To the Board and the Registrar: Would you please provide me and the person who served this letter on you the process, and identify all officers, employees, and volunteers engaged in the collection and counting of ballots, including the disqualification of ballots and voter verification?

As a voter in this State, as is the server of this letter named below, we object to our votes being diluted by the votes of those not legally eligible to vote. We also object to any compounding of a felony by certifying the election results.

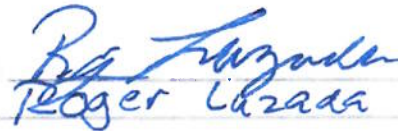
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Thank you for promptly responding to this letter and giving me an audience with you to Constitutionally redress this grievance pursuant the *Bill of Rights*, Article 1.

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC RECORDS ACT REQUEST

To: El Dorado County

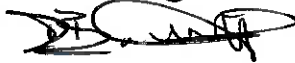
Pursuant to the **California Public Records Act (Gov. Code §7920 et seq.)**, I request copies of the following records relating to the adoption, enforcement, justification, and administration of the short-term rental ordinance and any 500-foot buffer requirements applicable within El Dorado County:

- All studies, reports, memoranda, analyses, surveys, consultant reports, staff reports, and research relied upon in selecting a 500-foot buffer distance.
- All communications between County staff, County Counsel, Supervisors, consultants, and outside parties discussing the establishment of the 500-foot buffer.
- All records identifying alternative buffer distances considered, including but not limited to 50-foot, 100-foot, 250-foot, or no-buffer alternatives.
- All documents discussing the anticipated impacts of the buffer on property owners, housing availability, property values, tax revenue, tourism revenue, or local businesses.
- All complaints, incident reports, enforcement actions, citations, noise complaints, parking complaints, criminal reports, or nuisance reports relied upon to justify the buffer requirement.
- All maps, GIS analyses, demographic studies, or neighborhood analyses used in evaluating the ordinance.
- Any legal opinions, County Counsel memoranda, constitutional analyses, Fair Housing Act analyses, Equal Protection analyses, or risk assessments concerning the ordinance.

- Any documents comparing short-term rental regulations in the Tahoe Basin, West Slope, or other areas of El Dorado County.
- Records showing the number of permits denied, revoked, suspended, or rendered ineligible because of the 500-foot buffer requirement.
- Any records discussing whether the ordinance disproportionately impacts rural property owners.
