Subject: 2020 Annual Update to the Traffic Impact Mitigation (TIM) Fee Program Updated

**Cost Estimates** 

The 2016 Major Update to the CIP and TIM Fee Program was adopted by Resolution 191-2016. The Resolution states, in part, "said fees shall be adjusted annually by an increase or decrease in the project costs by updating improvement cost estimates using actual construction costs of ongoing and completed projects, the most current cost estimates for those projects that are far enough along in the project development cycle to have project cost estimates, and for all other projects, the Engineering News-Record Building Cost Index." TIM Fees shall be set and updated by a resolution as adopted by the Board, and administered via a TIM Fee Administration Manual."

Department of Transportation staff has provided updated cost estimates for six individual projects. Table 1 displays the revised project cost estimates.
