



PROCLAMATION

of the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors

In Recognition of September 11th

Honoring the heroes of that fateful day in 2001

The morning of September 11, 2001 dawned as an ordinary day. As the hours unfolded, our Country was viciously attacked by terrorists who carried out a sadistic plan to murder thousands of innocent people on American soil.

WHEREAS, their intent was to topple and destroy our beloved Country, the true spirit of the American people was awakened and emboldened by a shared grief and fierce resolve to put sacrifice over self and to rise up against evil in defense of freedom; and

WHEREAS, when we remember and reflect on that day, it is our fellow man that is seared into our hearts and memories. May we continue to bear witness to their sacrifice to our children and grandchildren, making sure that their stalwart bravery is known and remembered as a sacred sacrifice, recognizing that freedom is won at an unspeakable cost; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER PROCLAIMED, to recognize the valiant service and sacrifice given each day by members of our armed forces, diplomatic services, intelligent agencies, homeland security and El Dorado County public safety personnel and first responders who are all on the front lines, defending the security of our nation, our county, and our daily lives.
