



RESOLUTION OF THE EL DORADO COUNTY GRAND JURY  
ADOPTING A CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

WHEREAS, a section of the Political Reform Act, Government Code §87300, requires that each local agency must adopt a conflict of interest code covering the local agency's officers, employees, commissioners, etc., which shall have the force and effect of law, and

WHEREAS, the Fair Political Practices Commission has determined that a civil grand jury is a local agency which must adopt its own conflict of interest code and submit it to the county in which the grand jury is convened as the code reviewing body, and

WHEREAS, a regulation adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, Title 2, California Code of Regulations, §18730, provides that the incorporation by reference of the terms of that regulation, along with an agency-specific designation of employees and formulation of disclosure categories in an appendix, shall constitute the adoption of a local conflict of interest code as required by Government Code §87300, and

WHEREAS, the El Dorado County Grand Jury has reviewed the duties of its members and its officers as set forth in the Penal Code when performing its civil investigatory and reporting function, and has considered those duties in light of the requirements of a conflict of interest code as set forth in the Political Reform Act and in Commission regulations.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the El Dorado County Grand Jury hereby adopts the following Conflict of Interest Code.


EL DORADO COUNTY GRAND JURY CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The provisions of Title 2, California Code of Regulations, section 18730, incorporated herein by this reference, are hereby adopted as the conflict of interest code of the El Dorado County Grand Jury in compliance with Government Code §87300 et seq. This code shall apply to the civil investigative and reporting function of the El Dorado County Grand Jury as established by the relevant sections of the Penal Code.

The Grand Jury has carefully considered the civil investigatory and reporting functions of a grand jury as set forth in the Penal Code, and the actual functions of its members and officers. The Grand Jury has determined that each member participates in the making of a governmental decision by voting on the final grand jury report issued pursuant to the Penal Code. However, the Grand Jury has also determined that the final report does not have a reasonably foreseeable material effect on any of its members' financial interests. Accordingly, there are no persons associated with the grand jury to be designated in this code as required to file a statement of economic interest.

This conflict of interest code is intended to take effect on the date noted below, and to remain in effect until amended by a future El Dorado County Grand Jury.
