Retirees have come to El Dorado County in growing numbers, leading to a greater 105 South Lake Tahoe, CA 9615 increase in the older population than the general population. The U.S. Census Bureau reported a 60 percent growth in the 60+ populations in the county between 1980 and 1990.

During the ten years between 1990 and 2000, the county experienced over a 25 percent growth in the 60+ population. There is a tremendous decrease in the percentage rate but only a small decrease in the actual numbers because of the increased base.

These retirees often possess a lifetime of accumulated wealth on which they intend to retire. Unfortunately, retirees are very often the target of scam artists and predatory business practices. Between July, 2006 and December, 2006, 100 cases involving elders were referred to the District Attorney for investigation. We anticipate an increase in prosecutions and prevention of crimes against elders.

The El Dorado County Board of Supervisors has recognized the growing retiree population in this county and acted aggressively to protect its seniors.

In 2001 and 2002, this Board reorganized elder and dependent adult service providers to streamline and coordinate all services. As a result, in September of 2002, APS and IHSS were moved under the direction of Community Services Department to co-locate with MSSP/Linkages, Information and Assistance, and Public Guardian. This continuum of services was known as Home of the Elder and Adult Resources Team (HEART). The move was very successful. The ability to intervene quickly was utilized to the benefit of many clients. Prior to this we had a strong MDT which was only enhanced by the change.

With improved response time and improved intervention and protection it became apparent that we didn't have the mechanism in place for active prosecution of these "paper crimes". Then last year the BOS filled that need by the action that was taken that we now call EPU (Elder Protection Unit). This pioneering unit brings together the respective members of law enforcement, Health and Human Services (APS, Public Guardian and Conservator, Elder Legal Services), and County Counsel.

The proposed expansion of this unit will complete this effort by enhancing staffing to include supplemental investigative resources and a forensic auditor. Elders are often the target of financial scam which involve numerous documents and bank records. A forensic auditor would be a necessary resource in the prosecution of financial crimes. The expanded resources will largely target fraud-related activities to include consumer and environmental protection, real estate fraud, and workers' compensation fraud. This proposed expansion will be completed and sustained by the use of existing grants and trust fund revenue.

These positions will complete the organization of the new Elder and Consumer Protection Unit as indicated on the attached organization chart. The new organization incorporates the existing District Attorney component of the Elder Protection Unit, Workers' Compensation Insurance Fraud program, and Real Estate Fraud program.

#### **Fiscal Impact:**

The Elder Protection component will continue to be funded by the general fund and the Elder Vertical Prosecution grant. Real Estate Fraud component will be funded from the fees collected on new real estate recordings and deposited in the Real Estate Prosecution Trust. New funding will come from the Workers' Compensation Insurance Fraud grant (\$175,000) and several trust accounts containing funds received in prior civil settlements.

All funding sources are shown on the attached spreadsheet.


Note that the existing trust funds can support the program for several years without receiving any new incoming settlement funds (except for the Real Estate Fraud Prosecution Trust that is currently generating about \$110,000 per year).

There is no impact on Net County Cost; Net County Cost is \$0.
